

Praise Report: A new St. Paul Street Evangelization Team was started by myself and local Catholics. At the Fall Family Days at the Octagon Barn we handed out rosaries, saint medals, pamphlets, and prayed over some people for healing. Christian Godel is part of the team, and here is his testimony, "I was able by happenstance, to meet the sister of [someone I know]. I didn't find this out until the very end of a very long and beautiful conversation. She and her husband stopped by our booth with some initial trepidation. They both casually looked over the materials and I then began to inquire whether or not they were Catholic. Eventually, it led to a long conversation about the struggles many of us face within our families:

wayward children, brothers, sisters, parents, etc. She and her husband were also each other's second spouse, both having remarried after equally traumatic and devastating marriages which were rife with tragedy and pain. The couple shared their stories with me and likewise I with them. Eventually, I was able to give them many medals, not only several Miraculous Medals but many of other incredible saints like St. Francis, St. Thérèse, and even The Holy Family. But the one medal that was of particular significance to this one woman was of St. Dymphna: patroness of mental health and anxiety. I hadn't even realized we had one but lo' and behold, there she was - the only one. Even though they weren't

themselves 'wayward' Catholics, The Holy Spirit still brought us together to share, minister to one another, and come together, if only for a few moments. I'm also positive she will mention this to her brother..., in addition to handing out the many medals I gave her. I think The Lord sends us other sowers to help plant seeds when we ourselves may not be able to do so."

Ask Padre: Should we bow when the processional cross carried by the server is not a crucifix, but the Risen Christ, when it passes by me before/after Mass? You may if you wish. You may bow whether the processional cross is a crucifix or the Risen Christ. It is traditional to cross yourself and bow the head when the priest and the Crucifer (carrying the cross) walk down the aisle before and after Mass. After Mass, as the priest leaves the Altar, it is also customary to pray for him. I beg you to pray for me.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Today's graphic Gospel passage always sounds a bit jarring: "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off." Upon first reading that passage, our response might be, "What?" But upon further reflection, it strikes me that Jesus is challenging us to attend to what causes us to sin: the vices we have acquired, the temptations we do not ignore, the sinful thoughts and behaviors we entertain or in which we engage. It is also important to identify where we might be culpable in leading others astray. In all of this, Jesus is asking us to be honest with ourselves and to take the necessary steps to "cut" out of our lives the things that lead us away from the Lord, allowing us to move toward him. Lest we get discouraged, we need only remember that we are not alone: We belong to Christ whose word is truth, whose precepts "give joy to the heart," and who tells us "whoever is not against us is for us." Like Moses in the first reading, we can ask that the Spirit descend upon us and give us strength.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Amazing feats we see on TV or read in the news can't help but capture our imagination. Our rich Catholic faith can be a little like that: just take a look at the lives of the saints. That's why I find the other passage in today's Gospel so encouraging. Jesus reminds us that even the smallest things we do matter — actions to help others grow in their faith: "Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward." As the Lord's spirit moves us to be a prophet to others - that is, to perform deeds in his name (mighty or not-so-mighty) - we have the ability to witness the Gospel of Jesus Christ in very real and concrete ways. As St. Teresa of Avila said: "Accustom yourself continually to make many acts of love, for they enkindle and melt the soul."

ACTIONS Prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation by asking Jesus to help you identify what causes you to sin or drives a wedge between you and others or between you and God. Then participate in this beautiful sacrament and pray for the grace to make changes.
