



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As the days grow shorter and darker, I am especially ready for Advent wreaths and nativity sets; sparkling lights and singing angels. More than ever, I eagerly anticipate the joyful celebration of Christ's birth. But today's readings for the first Sunday of Advent point us to the end of time, when Jesus returns in glory. Wait a minute, what? I don't want to think about the dismay and fright that Jesus foretells in the Gospel, I want to think about shepherds and holy nights. We really can't do one without the other, however, and the underlying message of the readings is one of hope and reassurance: Our God keeps his promises. He is faithful to the covenants he makes. He loves us so much; he offers us new beginnings. Our God became one of us, died to save us, and will give us the strength to be ready to greet him when he comes again. "Stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand," Jesus says. Pray that our preparation for Christ's birth will make us all the more ready for his return.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We are a society and culture that focuses a lot on the outward signs of preparation, and there is a lot of pressure to make it all perfect. Pinterest boards, social media groups, magazine photos, clothing catalogs: all show perfectly dressed people with perfectly adorable dogs standing in front of exquisitely perfect Christmas trees, on perfectly unblemished snow. But perfection on the exterior is not the Christian goal. Our interior preparation – how we make ourselves ready for Christ now, and at the end of time – is the focus of Advent. It is an opportunity for repentance, and a joyful new beginning in our relationship with God. It is a time to recommit ourselves to the covenant he made with us, and the psalm and the second reading offer assistance in doing so. Make time each day to dive in and explore what Scripture reveals about "conducting yourselves to please God."

PRAY Pray the psalm from the first Sunday of Advent each morning. Ask God to open your heart to ways you can be more just. He will teach you, guide you, and strengthen your heart so that you can stand upright to face whatever challenges come your way.

Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths, Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior, and for you I wait all the day.

dresses for poor girls in Haiti. We thank God for a woman who recently donated lots of material. One day, Jesus will say to them, "I was naked and you clothed me..." (Mt 25)

First, some holy humor: The pastor recalls, "After a recent worship service the mother of a fidgety seven-year-old boy told me how she finally got her son to sit still and be quiet. About halfway through the sermon, she leaned over and whispered, 'If you don't be quiet, the preacher is going to lose his place and will have to start his sermon all over again!' It worked!"

Happy Belated Thanksgiving! I thank God for you and for every parish family member. May our Lord help you to continue to grow in self-giving love for each of your family members and friends.

Christmas Anticipation Prayer: On November 30, the following prayer is traditionally recited multiple times a day until Christmas... perhaps, pray it once a day?

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment, In which the Son of God was born, Of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, [here mention your request] through the merits of Our Saviour Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen.

Advent Media Detox: Consider a "media detox" this Advent as a way to prepare for Christ coming into your heart in a new way this Christmas, and in your daily life. It's an appropriate time to turn off (or reduce) the media/news/facebook and spend more heart to heart time with God in prayer and Scripture meditation. One of the "love languages" is "quality time" spent with someone. Extra "quality time" spent with Jesus brings true peace. Try this: For a few minutes each day, close your eyes and imagine yourself laying your head on His Beating Sacred Heart, like St. John did at the Last Supper.

Prepare for Mass with the Hymnal: The new hymnals have the <u>Sunday Mass readings</u> in them. If you get to Mass early, meditate on the readings by reading through them slowly. If a word or a phrase jumps out at you, stop and slowly re-read it. Close your eyes and ask, "[Father, or Jesus, or Holy Spirit] what are you saying to me?" This is how God wants to speak to each of us. Scriptures are our heavenly Father's love letters to His children. It is best if you meditate on the upcoming readings throughout the week in a quiet place. If you do this, the readings will transform your life when you hear them at Mass.

Praise Report: Recently I went with two parish family members to the Holly Berry Fair in Caseville to set up our St. Paul Evangelization table. We handed out medals, brochures, spoke with and prayed with people. From parish family Christian Godel: "I had two beautiful experiences praying with people who were enduring a great deal of suffering: one whose grandson was severely sick in hospital with Covid and with another whose nephew was dying of cancer. Both were in tears while and after we prayed. Looking back it seems surreal, especially knowing it all took place so serenely amidst all the chaos that was going on in the background. We prayed for comfort, peace, healing, and that if it be God's will... that either should pass, the families be granted consolation by Jesus and Our Lady. Each person said that it was "meant to be" that we were there at the fair that day and I truly believe it was. If our prayers helped even one person, it was worth it and far more."

Topic for Next FOOD + FAITH + SONG Event: Our parish "Envisioning Team" is seeking to find God's Vision for our parish by looking at the parish DMI Survey results. One Priority we decided on was building community. Our Pastoral Council also supports this Priority. To build community, we may host more FOOD + FAITH + SONG events, perhaps Lenten Soup Suppers. Regarding the "FAITH" part of the event, our Envisioning Team invites parish family members to submit ideas for a topic on our Catholic faith. Once a topic is selected, we will find a Catholic speaker to speak. What topics on our Catholic faith would you like to learn about? Let me know.

Thank You for Your GENEROUS Financial Stewardship! Our World Mission Sunday collection was \$2,244! Also, we are making progress on our <u>Christ's Mission Appeal</u> (Formerly called CSA). Our target this year is thousands of dollars lower than last year. Thank you for your donation/pledge.
