# Jesus Thirsts for Your Love!

Will you quench His thirst?
--- Fr. Nate's Update

Dear Reader, fellow Saint-in-the-Making, Merry CHRISTMAS and Happy FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

**First, some holy humor:** A woman went into a post office to buy some stamps for her Christmas cards. What denomination do you want? asked the lady at the counter. "Goodness!" she replied, "Has it come to this? I suppose you'd better give me twenty Catholic and twenty Presbyterian."

Praise Report: How God Is Working To Save His People: Christian, Godel, the Team Leader of our Thumb St. Paul Street Evangelization Team, gave this testimony from his experience evangelizing at the the Christmas in Cass City 2021 event: "Just as we were about to pack up, a woman walked by who we asked if she'd like a Rosary or Miraculous Medal... She told us of her sorrows, her brother's recent passing after a long illness, and his struggles with a lifetime of various addictions. We were able to console her by sharing how Christ had reached into our lives and changed us so drastically, and likewise, how she believed He changed her brother too, especially near the end of his life. **I Am Proud of You**: As your spiritual father, I'm proud of you! I'm proud of you for your generosity to our Christ's Mission Appeal so far, we are about half way to our target! I'm proud of you for welcoming our parish mission preacher Richard Lane! I'm proud of our Knights of Columbus for setting up and hosting the Man of the Shroud Exhibit. And I'm proud of some of you for inviting others to the Shroud Exhibit, or to the Parish Mission! I'm proud of you for all the ways you try to serve and love and forgive everyone in your life, and to pray for your enemies. I'm grateful to the Holy Spirit for leading you.

**What is the Mass?** From a letter by Servant of God Catherine Dougherty to members of the Madonna House community she founded in Combermere, Ontario, which I have visited. Underlining is mine:

"...And the Mass—The catechism tells us that it is 'the Sacrifice of Calvary, bloodlessly renewed on all the altars of the Church all day long.' Words we learned by rote when we were children that have ceased to have any meaning for us, evidently!

"But what is the Mass? It is Christ putting before us His supreme act of love for us. Like the tremendous Lover that He is, He wants us all to go to Calvary and remember that He died there for love of us. He doesn't want to allow us to forget how much He loves us. Mass is the <u>most personal intimate declaration of love that God makes to the soul of each Christian</u>- man, woman and child.

Every day, if only they went to it! Every Sunday, at least. Isn't it sad that there are so few there on weekdays? And how is it possible that you who belong to Him, who are His very own, cannot appreciate this love story of God, this lovemaking of God, this personalized approach of God to your soul? Dearly beloved, how is it possible? If it is the case with you, and you and you who listen to this letter, then it behooves you to do but one thing—prostrate yourself before God and implore Him to perform upon you—upon your soul—the miracle that He performed on the deaf and blind man, so that your soul might hear His lovemaking, so that your soul might see His beauty and lovableness, and so love Him back.

Further in the letter she wrote, "...you have to steep yourself in the Mass. Learn about it. Pray about it. For unless you do, your life in Madonna House will have no deep roots. And it might be one reason why your surrender, your total surrender, is being delayed so long. Be watchful, for someday it may be too late." [I hope these words encourage you to learn about the Mass and love it even more!]

**Ask Padre: Can lay people bless their own children or grandchildren?** Selections of an article from: CARMELITE MONASTERY Philadelphia, Pa., CATHOLICS United for the Faith St. Pius X Chapter P. O. Box 3905 Trenton, N. J. 08629. This is a great way to celebrate the **Feast of the Holy Family!** 

"The early Christians blessed their children with the Sign of the Cross... It was a practice loved by the mothers of saints... Ambrose says: "Whosoever is blessed by his parents is blessed by God."

"...HOW TO GIVE THE PARENTAL BLESSING: Have your children kneel before you [just a suggestion]. Place your right hand, or both hands on the head of each as you repeat: "God bless you, my child." Then you may take holy water, and with the thumb of the right hand, make the Sign of the Cross upon the forehead, lips and breast, saying: "In the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." The child may answer. "Thank you." [Or pray a spontaneous blessing, affirming their worth and dignity as a beloved son of daughter of God, encouraging them, etc.]


"Or one may make the Sign of the Cross in silence upon the forehead or over all the children. Another way is to say, while making the Sign of the Cross on the forehead: "Bless you, my child, in the Name of the Father and of the Holy Spirit." You may send your blessing to those away from home, or even in purgatory. Send your blessing to your absent children, and at the end of every letter you write them, add: "Your father and mother love you and bless you."

"WHEN TO GIVE THE BLESSING: The parental blessing should be given in the evening after night prayers. It may be given also, when little ones go to school; before they go to confession or receive Holy Communion; when going on a journey, or setting out on a dangerous occupation. Finally, bless your children when lying upon your deathbed... St. Louis, King of France, realized this and at the end of his life, wrote to his son: "I give you every blessing that a loving father can give a son. May the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity and all the saints protect you from every evil." So bless your children daily, especially in these times when the dangers surrounding youth threaten their innocence, their futures, their very lives and eternal salvation."

**Let Us Pray:** (<u>Pope's DECEMBER Intention</u>): "...for the catechists, summoned to announce the Word of God: may they be its witnesses, with courage and creativity and in the power of the Holy Spirit."

(<u>Sheen's Spiritual Adoption Prayer</u>): "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of [baby's name], the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion."

# Feast of the Holy Family

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14 | Col 3:12-21 or 3:12-17 | Lk 2:41-52



Some of my fondest childhood memories are of my dad leading my three sisters and me in song as we made the hour-long drive to visit my grand-parents every other weekend. Granted, our silly car songs don't qualify as "singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs," as Paul advised the Colossians, but I do think they reveal that my dad took to heart Paul's advice about family and faith. Paul writes that in putting on holiness, kindness, gentleness, and forgiving one another, we "put on love, that is, the bond of perfection." Whatever we do, in word or deed, we ought to do in the name of the Lord Jesus. Fathers, mothers, and children are to love one another, seeking and choosing the good for one another, and helping each other along life's journey – on long car trips as well as in a lifetime of situations. On this feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we honor their perfect holiness and love, and pray that God may continue to perfect us in holiness and love within our own families, that we may bear good fruit for the Kingdom.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Three Days? Mary and Joseph couldn't find Jesus for three days! Any parent who has had a child missing for a few seconds understands the anxiety Mary and Joseph experienced in three long days of searching for Jesus. In the end, though, all is well – they find him, and the peace of Christ casts out their fears. It is a remarkable scene: Jesus' parents are astonished to see him teaching in the temple, and Jesus is curious as to why they were looking for him – did they not know where he would be? This event marks a sort of milestone in their lives together, as Jesus has hinted at his future public ministry, and his parents have experienced that first bit of soul-piercing that Mary will later fully undergo. For each of them, love is what directed their actions. Joseph and Mary put aside everything to search for their son; Jesus put aside everything to serve his Father; and they joined together in humble obedience to God's will for them. The Holy Family models a way of living for us to imitate, and to witness to others in that imitation.

**SERVE/STUDY** Perhaps you have some down time in this coming week between Christmas and New Year's. As a family, choose an activity that allows you to think outside yourselves and serve others. Or make a plan to read the Scripture for each day of the upcoming week; everyone can choose a favorite verse to memorize each day. You may be surprised how often these verses enter your mind throughout the week.
