Synod on "Synodality" ("Journeying Together")

What is a Synod?

The Synod is an assembly of bishops from around the world who assist the Holy Father by providing counsel on important questions facing the Church in a manner that preserves the Church's teaching and strengthens her internal discipline (see Vatican website and Code of Canon Law, canon 342) However, in recent years, the Synod has transformed into a global dialogue on particular issues of pastoral concern such as evangelization, Scripture, family life, young people, and synodality itself.

The purpose of the Synod is not to produce documents, but "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands." (Preparatory Document, paragraph 32)

What is Synodality?

Synodality means "journeying together." Pope Francis invites you and all the faithful to "journey together" by participating in listening sessions as part of the preparation for the 2023 Synod of Bishops: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission."

Listening Sessions will allow us not only to *talk about* "journeying together", but to actually *experience it*. Sessions will be held at <u>Good Shepherd Parish Center</u> on:

- Monday March 14 at 6:30pm
- Sunday March 20 at 12:15pm- brunch served (RSVP to office for meal count)
- Sunday March 20 for MS/HS Youth during their regular Youth Group at 5pm
- Saturday April 9 at 3:00pm

Who could you invite? Fellow parishioners, "occasional mass attendees, non-practicing Catholics", non-Catholics, people who feel they don't have a voice in the community, etc. At these sessions, ALL will have a chance to be listened to without interruption, without judgment, without agendas. Questions will be asked to help us share our experiences of how the Church has journeyed with us, such as, "What experiences bring you joy and help you grow in your relationship with Jesus?" and other questions. A spiritual process

Through prayer and from our conversations with one another, Pope Francis hopes that we will discern how the Holy Spirit wants the Church to grow in "deeper communion, fuller participation, and greater openness to fulfilling our mission in the world" (Vademecum, 1.2).

Communion, participation, mission

The three dimensions of the theme for the synod are communion, participation, and mission. There is a dynamic relationship between the three, with each dimension enriching and orienting the other two.

Communion: By his gracious will, God gathers us together as diverse peoples of one faith, through the covenant that he offers to his people.

Participation: A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God-clergy and lay people, including consecrated women and men -- to prayerfully engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another.

Mission: The Church exists to evangelize. As Christians, we should never be solely centered on ourselves. Our mission is to witness to the saving love of Jesus Christ in the midst of the whole human family.

All are called to participate

"All the baptized are called to take part in the Church's life and mission," Pope Francis reminds us. The Holy Father acknowledges "the frustration and impatience felt by many pastoral workers, members of diocesan and parish consultative bodies and women, who frequently remain on the fringes. Enabling everyone to participate is an essential ecclesial duty! All the baptized, for baptism is our identity card."

Discernment

Pope Francis is asking us to discern the will of the Holy Spirit for the Church. But what is discernment? For Christians, it means to prayerfully open our minds and hearts to allow God to illuminate us about the best path forward. This goes for individuals and for the Church as a whole. However, discernment is not just about getting answers. Discernment is about getting to know God in a deeper way and fostering that relationship.


Preparation: The most important way to participate in the Synod is to pray these intercessions regularly:

For the <u>whole Church</u>, that each member no matter how young or old, involved or disconnected, marginalized or integrated, faithful or doubting, answers the call of the Holy Spirit to share their stories and participate in the synod, **Lord, hear our prayer!**

For <u>Pope Francis</u>, <u>Bishop Gruss and all of our diocesan</u>, <u>parish and school leaders</u>, <u>Lord</u>, <u>hear our prayer!</u>

For <u>all those who work and volunteer</u> at the various levels of the Church -- that we may listen to the stories of the faithful with open hearts and minds and to discern how God wants to lead the Church in these times, **Lord**, hear our prayer!

For <u>myself and fellow parishioners</u> as we embark on this synodal journey to be open to the Holy Spirit and recognize that our own story and experiences are of great value for others to hear, **Lord, hear our prayer!**

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Have you heard about the *Civilize It!* initiative? The U.S. bishops launched a campaign to encourage civil dialogue during the contentious 2020 election. Unfortunately, the divisiveness in our nation, and even within the Church, has shown no signs of subsiding, leading the bishops to reboot the campaign last fall. The bishops encourage every Catholic to pledge to be a force for charity, clarity, and creativity in our divided world. Today's Gospel shows us how to do that, starting with the Golden Rule. What strikes me – and challenges me – are the specific examples that remain relevant 2,000 years later: *Love your enemies and do good for them; stop judging; stop condemning; give.* Building on last Sunday's account of the beatitudes, Luke provides us a prescription for how to live a moral and happy life, one that reflects those who "bear the image of the heavenly one."

GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I am thankful to have people in my life who bring out the best in others, and certainly bring out the best in me. I would guess we can each point to others who have guided and encouraged us: A teacher, a dear friend, a favorite aunt, a neighbor or coach. Today's readings encourage us to be that person for others, even when it's hard. Nobody said being a witness to Christ would be a cake walk! Fortunately, we can turn to prayer and the Scriptures for encouragement. For me, it may begin with small steps, such as listening to those with whom I disagree, not getting drawn into social media debates, and being more generous with my time. As we reflect on today's readings, perhaps we can each choose one change we would like to make or challenge we want to accept as we move into the week and ask God to help us put it into practice.

ACT Praise God each day this coming week. And then challenge yourself to offer a compliment to one person every day as well. Praising God and others puts us in right relationship with God and with our brothers and sisters.
