

Guests from the Holy Land: Our Good Shepherd Christian Mothers invited Fr. Craig Carolan and myself to their gathering which included other local members of the National Council of Catholic Women. The event began with Rosary and Holy Mass at St. John. Next at our parish center we enjoyed a delicious lunch prepared by our Christian Mothers, and a presentation by guests Isa and his wife. They were raised in Bethlehem but now live in Michigan. They run the Land of Peace, a non-profit organization that sells olive wood carvings to raise money for the Christians in the Holy Land and to raise awareness of their situation. They shared how the Christians who live there have a hard life since they are persecuted by the muslims. Also, the Israeli government makes life difficult for them since they live in Palestine. Covid has made things even harder. Isa and his wife are grateful for the freedom they have experienced in the United States, and



remarked that they are respectfully treated as human beings here. I placed this icon of Christ the Good Shepherd from them in my rectory chapel, reminding me to ask Him to make me a good shepherd.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


I'm an expressive one when it comes to sharing my opinions: I absolutely LOVE these new shoes! I LOVE, LOVE, LOVE this lemon meringue pie! All good. My friends and family are mildly pleased that I am content with my wardrobe and my diet. But in today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the great commandment, combining the two commandments – to love God and to love neighbor – into one: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." But what does it really mean to *love*? Saint Paul says it is to be patient, kind, and to rejoice with the truth; it is not being jealous, pompous, rude, or quick-tempered. (1 Cor 13: 4-6) Saint Thomas Aquinas says that "to love is to will the good of another." The love we show is the very essence of what it means to be Christian. "This (italics added) is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's reading from Acts, Paul, and Barnabas return from their travels to various Christian communities. They have shared the Good News, making disciples in each place and building up the Church. Yet when they return, they do not gloat or boast of their accomplishments. Rather, they "reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles." Sometimes in our strivings – to be better friends or parents, better Christians, better at sharing our faith – we can become discouraged when we fall short. Paul, arguably the best evangelist ever, reminds us that God works through us, not the other way around. We are to persevere, placing our trust in God. Through him we are able to love as he does, and help others come to know that same love.

ACTIONS Spring is upon us! Plant something and watch it grow. Just as the sun and water nurture a garden, God nurtures and helps us grow through the Holy Spirit and the people around us. How can we in turn share that love with others?
