Soles4Souls



Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 | Rev 21:10-14, 22-23 | Jn 14:23-29

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In the reading from John's Gospel today, Jesus eases into the message he has for his disciples - a message he knows they don't want to hear: He has to leave them. But Jesus tells his disciples that if they love him and keep his commandments, he and the Father will "make their dwelling" within them. He then assures them they will not be alone: The Advocate will come to not only remind them of all he taught them, but also teach them everything they need to know in the future. Finally, he offers them peace, the peace that comes only through the Spirit and draws them closer to God. Though Jesus knows they are broken-hearted that he is leaving, he tells them to rejoice if they love him, for he is returning to his Father. Jesus' words to the first disciples ring true for every disciple throughout the ages. He does not leave anyone who loves him alone. He sends his Spirit to dwell in us, to teach and remind us of his love and how to love one another. The Spirit guides us, encourages us, and sustains us - always. We are never alone.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The first Christians, guided by the Holy Spirit, shared this message with the Gentile communities to whom they were ministering: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities." This is a profound moment in the Church as it shows first, the power of the Holy Spirit working in and with the Apostles; and second, the importance of faith (not ritual circumcision, or other human laws) for salvation. The Gospel is intended for all, without exception, and the Holy Spirit is our help and our Advocate in our own lives of faith, and in our sharing of that faith with others. Let us seek the counsel of the Holy Spirit in all we do, that we might be a blessing, not a burden, for everyone seeking the glory of God's light.

STUDY The Acts of the Apostles is an amazing account of how Jesus' followers grew from a small group of frightened people into the courageous and zealous missionaries who founded his Church. Read the *catechism* from 687-747 to learn more about the Holy Spirit and pray for the grace to let him work in and through you for the salvation of all who seek him.

- Fr. Nate's Update -

Friend, and fellow Saint-in-the-Making, Happy EASTER!

Some Holy Humor: After a very long and boring sermon the parishioners filed out of the church saying nothing to the preacher. Towards the end of the line was a thoughtful person who always commented on the sermons. "Pastor, today your sermon reminded me of the peace and love of God!" "Wow!" cried the pastor. "Tell me why." "Well – it reminded me of the Peace of God because it passed all understanding and the Love of God because it endured forever!"

Perimeter Prayer: Here's part of at prayer I pray almost daily: Lord Jesus Christ, in thy love and mercy establish a perimeter of protection around [Good Shepherd parishioners]. May the Holy Angels guard us and all our possessions, establishing a perimeter of protection around us, rendering us immune from any kind of demonic influence... [etc.] I ask that any demons within this vicinity or any that should try to enter here be rendered deaf, dumb, and blind; that Thou would strip them of all weapons, armor, power, illusions, and authority; that Thou would bind, rebuke and disable them from communicating or interacting with each other in any way. Remove them, sending them directly to the foot of Thy Cross. Jesus, Son of the Most High, I ask this in Thy Glorious and Most Holy Name. Amen.

Praise Report: A parishioner asked me to join her in praying thanksgiving prayers for God's gift to her. She encouraged me to pray four times, "I Love you Lord Jesus, I trust you Lord Jesus, I thank you Lord Jesus." So I did! How often to do you and I thank Him for the graces He pours out on us every single day? (Including the grace of the challenges and sufferings He allows?)

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: Visit Jesus!

In our parish DMI Survey, there was a question about participation in Eucharistic Adoration. 27% of parish family members responded once or twice a year; 35% responded never. I invite ALL to visit Eucharistic Adoration for a few minutes at our parish or another parish (Harbor Beach has all day Adoration on Thursdays) and to experience true peace as Jesus gazes upon you with unconditional love from the Eucharist. We have 9am Mass most Fridays [see bulletin] at our Ubly Church, followed by Adoration until 10:30 [see bulletin for monthly All Day Adoration].



Pray for Conversion: As I wrote last time, the Christian Mothers invited me to their gathering with the Eastern Council of Catholic Women. Their guest speakers, a married couple from Bethlehem, explained that Christians are surrounded by Muslims who practice Islam, and they told us a little about Islam. He called it the cancer of the world. They were careful to explain that not all Muslims are violent people, but that the Koran does encourage violence. The Koran does not say that "God is love" as the bible does. Jesus shows us what DIVINE LOVE looks like, and tells us to love others as He loves us. Can you guess how many times the word LOVE is found in the bible? In the ESV version, 689 times! Many Muslims are secretly converting to Jesus, but must leave their countries to openly follow Jesus or else risk being killed. As Christians, Jesus calls us to pray for the conversion of all, including Muslims. Lord Jesus, please give all the opportunity to hear the saving truth about who You are, and to follow you!

Visitors to Sick & Homebound: "I was sick and you visited me" -Jesus, Matthew 25

Are you currently an EMHC (Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion) at Mass? We invite you to pray about bringing Holy Communion to the homebound and those in nursing homes. Contact Fr. Nate.

Ask Padre: Why doesn't the priest come down and shake hands with the congregation to connect with them? Why not have an extended "boisterous" sign of peace? (based on comments made by participants in our parish Synod Listening Sessions)

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) has rubrics (rules) for Mass that ensure the Mass is offered reverently and uniformly throughout the world. It states in No. 82: "As for the sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by Conferences of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. It is, however, appropriate that each person offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest and in a <u>sober manner</u>."

In No. 154: "The priest may give the sign of peace to the ministers but always <u>remains within the sanctuary</u>, so as not to disturb the celebration. In the dioceses of the United States of America, for a good reason, on special occasions (for example, in the case of a funeral, a wedding, or when civic leaders are present) the priest may offer the sign of peace to a few of the faithful near the sanctuary."

"Baptism (Renewal) in the Spirit": Common effects of "baptism (renewal) in the Holy Spirit" include more love, joy, and peace; more hunger for prayer, for the sacraments, for reading the Bible, for serving others, etc.! Prepare for your own renewal in the Holy Spirit at Pentecost June 4/5, 2022 by praying daily until Pentecost, "Come Holy Spirit and fill me with DIVINE LOVE!"

Let Us Pray:




