Some Holy Humor: Our church was saddened to learn this week of the death of one of our most valued members, Someone Else. Someone's passing creates a vacancy

that will be difficult to fill. Else has been with us for many years and for every one of those years, Someone did far more than a normal person's share of work. Whenever there was a job to do, a class to teach, or meeting to attend, one name was on everyone's list, "Let Someone Else do it." Whenever leadership was mentioned, this wonderful person was looked to for inspiration as well as results, "Someone Else can work with that group." It was common knowledge that Someone Else was among the most generous financial stewards in the church. Whenever there was a financial need, everyone just assumed Someone Else would make up the difference. Someone Else was a wonderful person, sometimes appearing superhuman. Were the truth be known, everybody expected too much of Someone Else. Now Someone Else is gone! Someone Else left a wonderful example to follow, but who is going to follow it? Who is going to the things Someone Else did?


Praise Report: We can learn the meaning of names in order to evangelize. I recently was at a restaurant and asked the server, Veronica, if she knew what her name meant. She said no. I said something like, "Would you like to know? It means true icon. In Latin, vere means true, icon means picture. The tradition is that St. Veronica wiped the face of Jesus with a cloth, and His Blood left a true picture of His face on the cloth." She said, "That's interesting, I never heard that!" May the Lord Jesus inspire her to grow closer to Himself every time she hears her Name.

"I Thirst for You": St. Teresa of Kolkata wrote a letter to her "spiritual family" dated March 25, 1993. Here is part: "Why does Jesus say 'I Thirst'? What does it mean? Something so hard to explain in words. He thirsts for you. He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy. When not accepted by others, even by yourself sometimes—He is the one who always accepts you. The devil may try to use the hurts of life, and sometimes our own mistakes—to make you feel it is impossible that Jesus

really loves you, is really cleaving to you. This is a danger for all of us. And so sad, because it is completely opposite of what Jesus is really wanting, waiting to tell you. Not only that He loves you, but even more—He longs for you. He misses you when you don't come close."

ASK PADRE: Why don't Catholics offer the "communion wine" in disposable cups, like Protestants do?

Protestant ecclesial communions sometimes dispense grape juice in plastic cups. In their view, communion wine is a symbol only, not the actual Precious Blood of Christ. Catholics and Orthodox Christians have always taught



that after the consecration, the wine is no longer wine; it is the Precious Blood of Christ under the appearance or form of wine. Jesus changes the wine into His Blood through His priest, who acts "in the Person of Christ" when he says, "This is the chalice of my Blood..." The priest carefully purifies the sacred vessels with water after Holy Communion, consuming each drop of the Precious Blood and each particle of the Consecrated Host.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) has the rubrics (rules) for Mass that guide us in how to love God and neighbor at Mass. These rules ensure the Mass is offered validly, reverently, and orderly throughout the world. God is a God of order. St. Paul teaches, "For God is not a God of disorder but of peace, as in all the meetings of God's holy people." (1 Cor. 14:33).

The GIRM states, "Through the fraction and through Communion, the faithful, though they are many, receive from the one bread the Lord's Body and from the one chalice the Lord's Blood in the same way the Apostles received them from Christ's own hands." The tradition of common cups containing the Precious Blood, vessels shared in common, highlights our common sharing in the eucharistic sacrifice. Jesus "took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is the blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins.'" (Matthew 26:27) At the first Mass/Eucharist, Jesus could have chosen to consecrate the wine that was already poured in each individual's cup, but instead He consecrated the one cup/chalice to be shared in common.

"Let Us Pray"



The Ascension of the Lord PISCIPLE

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


"Praise Jesus." Those two words pack a powerful punch. We often say them with relief on hearing news of a better-than-expected prognosis, celebrating a milestone, seeing a beautiful sunset, or other moments when we feel God's presence. Jesus' ascension to the Father was clearly one of those moments. After Jesus was taken up into heaven, the Apostles "returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God." We might wonder how they could do that, after watching Jesus depart. I think the answer is found in Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. The Apostles had what Paul desired for the people of Ephesus, and for all people: "a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of [Christ]"; enlightened hearts that know "the hope that belongs to his call" for all who believe. The Lord has brought us salvation: "Sing praise to God, sing praise; sing praise to our king, sing praise."


GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Jesus said, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The Apostles took Jesus' words to heart, and we must too. In a homily in 2013, Pope Francis said: "The Ascension does not point to Jesus' absence, but tells us that he is alive in our midst in a new way. He is no longer in a specific place in the world as he was before the Ascension. He is now in the lordship of God, present in every space and time, close to each one of us." As the two men clothed in white reminded the Apostles, Jesus will return. And we know that he is not distant, but that he is fully present to us in a new way. His presence is felt through the workings of the Holy Spirit in our lives and in the sacraments.
