Rachel's Vineyard Retreat



Some Holy Humor: To rile up his Christian

friends, the atheist in the high school class was always looking for scientific speculation that would throw doubt on God or the Bible. Scouring the Internet he discovered research from a student at an obscure university who hypothesized that due to weather and wind patterns, the Red Sea was less than a foot deep when Moses led the Hebrews across it. "It wasn't even up to their knees," the atheist sneered. One of the Christian friends exclaimed, "It's a miracle!" "What miracle?" the atheist asked. "Anybody could have waded across it!" The Christian grinned. "Pharaoh's entire army was drowned in less than a foot of water!"

Proise Report: After I preached on Eucharistic Miracles two weeks ago, another parish family member approached me and shared a personal Eucharistic Miracle. She had been experiencing significant pain in her jaw and tooth. She was in such pain she wasn't able to come to Mass, so her husband brought Jesus in Holy Communion home to her. After she received, she had the idea of gently positioning the Consecrated Host in her mouth on the painful area. She hesitated, thinking that maybe it was a silly idea. But then she thought, if I believe this is really Jesus, it's not silly, so she did it. Instantly the pain in her tooth and jaw disappeared, and never returned. This was a special gift from Jesus, confirming her faith in His Real Presence. Stories like this boost our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and they remind us of the promised future healing of our bodies, for those who die in friendship with God, in the Resurrection when Jesus returns. While God does not always grant instant physical healing when we ask, He ALWAYS grants a greater healing whenever we ask for it: the forgiveness of our sins, especially in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Ask for healing-physical, emotional, psychological- each time you receive Holy Communion. Please share with me stories!

Hoppy Independence Doy! May our Lord help you to be a gift to your loved ones as you gather this 4th of July. May it be a prayerful day of gratitude for freedom. From the Declaration: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

Pray with me: "Lord, we pray for the conversion of all who do not believe that preborn human beings have the right to "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." We pray especially for our president, who is causing great scandal by his words and actions in promoting abortion. We pray for all mothers under pressure from others to have an abortion, and for the conversion of those who are pressuring them. We pray for Christians, that they might offer even more prayers, sacrifices, and support for mothers, before and after they give birth. We pray for the healing of all who suffer the wound of

abortion. We pray that many loving Christian families would prayerfully discern the possibility of adoption and foster care. In Jesus' Name, Amen."

Myths about Roe: I encourage you to read an article called "How to Debunk 7 Common Myths About Overturning Roe v. Here are two of the myths: Myth: Women will be harmed by this decision. Myth: Women could now be jailed after having miscarriages. Etc. It's important we fact-check anything we hear on the news or from word of mouth. Jesus calls the devil "the father of lies", and he's constantly spreading lies.

Who Will You Pray AND Sacrifice For? In his statement on the overturn of Roe v. Wade, our Bishop Gruss said, "Please continue to pray for hearts to be softened as we commit and recommit ourselves to doing all we can to support and accompany women in unplanned pregnancies as well as their unborn and infant children. We all must ask ourselves what more we can do to walk with moms in need, so that no woman finds herself alone or believes abortion is her best option..." [saginaw.org]

Choose one person you see on TV, such as a protestor or a pro-abortion politician or pastor, or one person in your circle who believes abortion should be legal. They are not the enemy; they are deceived by the enemy of our souls.

Pray for them each day this week, that their hearts would be softened. Don't only pray; remember that prayer is much more powerful if joined to sacrifice. Jesus teaches this principle when says, "This kind [of evil spirit] can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting" (Mark 9:29). How? Offer up sacrifices for that person, such as fasting from a meal or from a desert: "I sacrifice this meal/desert for the conversion of [Name]"; offer up a physical pains, such as, "Lord I offer You this headache for [Name]"; offer up discomforts, such as, "I offer up this heat for [Name]", etc. In heaven we'll be amazed by the fruits.

So what comes to mind when you imagine your dream road trip? A well-planned route with scenic stops, nice hotels, good restaurants and quirky sights along the way? Jesus may be my copilot, but given his words in today's Gospel I'm not sure I'd want him to be my travel agent! As he sends the 72 ahead of him, he gives them no illusions about the mission that lies ahead: "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." Settle for the first house that welcomes you, regardless of the amenities. Eat and drink whatever they offer. Give those you encounter a greeting of peace and remind them the kingdom of God is at hand. As always, Jesus gives these travelers all they will need to share the Good News with others. They return rejoicing! The early disciples refute my "travel agent" doubts, as they show us by example to place our trust in God and take nothing for the journey except our faith and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, we can rest assured that our "names are written in heaven."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I'm a planner. When we went to Disney World, my sons split off from me after I unveiled an app that would show us exactly which ride or attraction to hit based on crowd numbers, time of day and other variables. I loved that app! So had I been one of the 72 we read about today appointed by Jesus to spread the Gospel in pairs, hopefully my companion would not have abandoned me because of my insistence on planning. Ultimately, our journey of faith – as we share it with others and walk toward the kingdom ourselves – is not something we can choreograph. The more we plan and the more baggage we carry, the less likely we are to hear God's voice cutting through the noise. By stripping away the nonessentials, we can place our trust in the Lord, who will show us the right path. When we place our lives in the service of the Lord, the harvest will be abundant.
