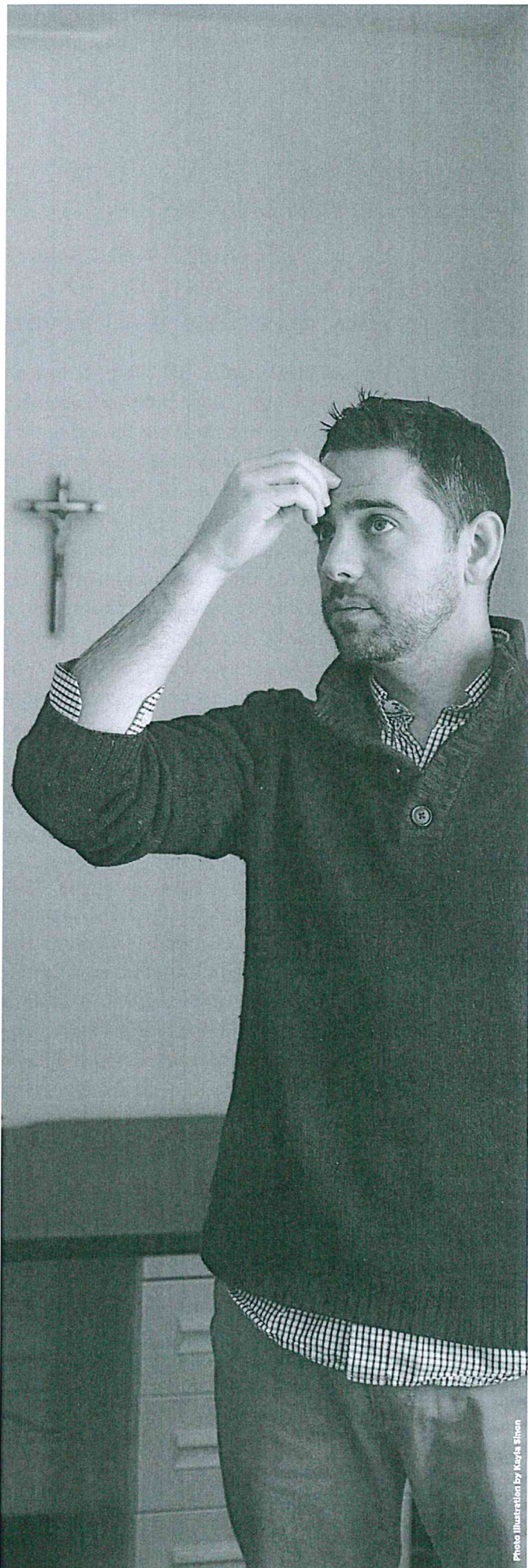
St. Paul gives us four words to live by: “Hope does not disappoint.” Today, as we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded of the source of our hope: God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, described by Pope Francis as “a communion of love.” As St. Paul writes, “the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.” This doesn’t mean our lives won’t be without difficulties, but St. Paul is assuring us that we do not face them alone. As Jesus tells the disciples in today’s Gospel, “when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth.” As we move into our week and whatever the near future holds, we can rest assured the Holy Spirit will guide us and strengthen us.

It’s graduation season! When my oldest son received his college diploma last weekend, I felt overwhelmed with gratitude and excitement for what lies ahead for him. 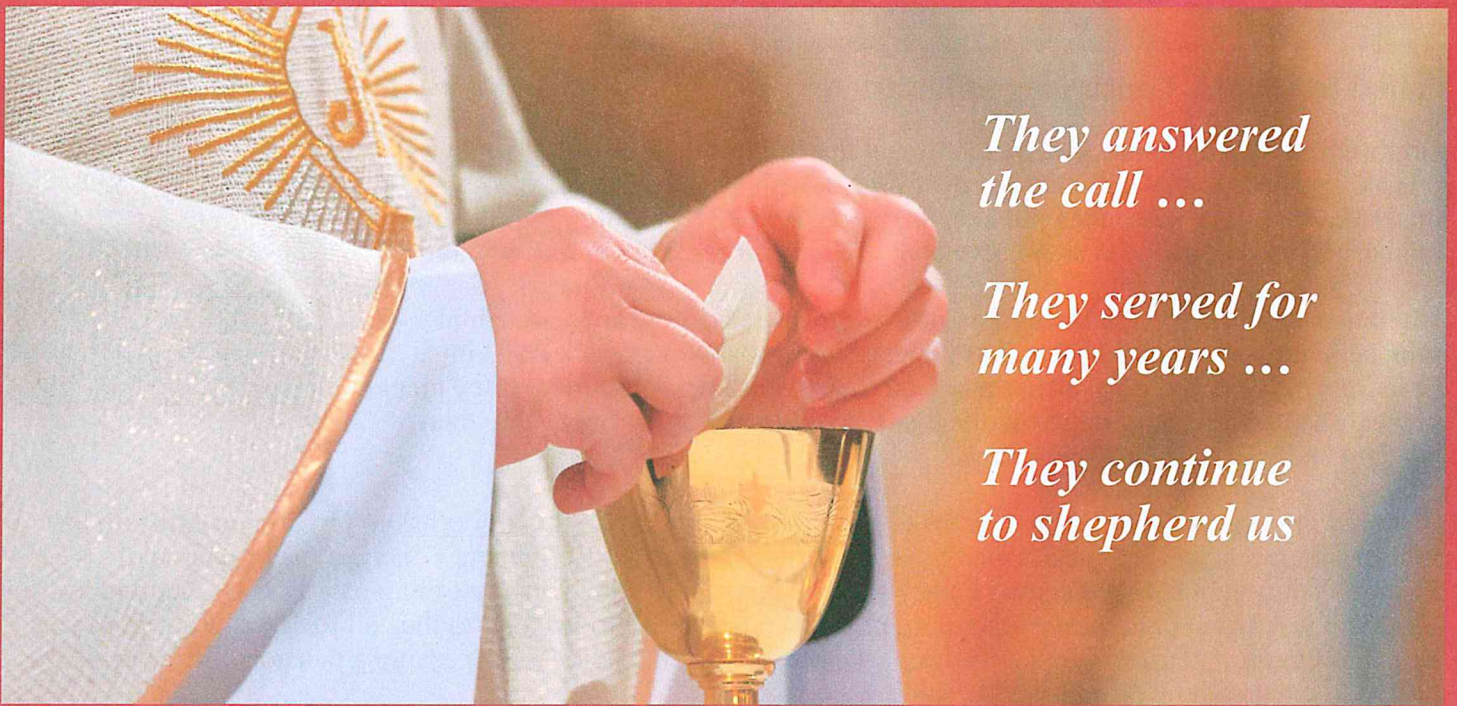

Therefore, please come ... and renew your encounter with the Risen Lord!

If you have been away from Mass for a while, welcome back – the Lord Jesus has been waiting patiently for you and his Church is more complete when you are gathered at your parish as the living Body of Christ. If you have been worshipping with us since our parishes have re-opened, we have been blessed by your presence. Whether you have been receiving Christ sacramentally in the Eucharist or offering a Spiritual Communion from home, the Lord Jesus has been with you and the witness to this encounter that is expressed by your lives has made a difference in this world.

Over the course of the next couple of years, we encourage you to encounter the Risen Christ in all the ways he is present to us in the Eucharistic Liturgy ("Mass"): the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, the assembly of God's holy people; the sacred Word of God proclaimed; and the bishop or priest-celebrant. When most people retire, they no longer go into an office, or a factory or a job site.

Retirement for diocesan priests is much different. They continue to serve - in a variety of ways.

Some serve as sacramental ministers for parishes that do not have full-time priests. Others step in when an "active priest" is ill or away. They often continue presiding at Masses, celebrating sacraments, teaching, offering counsel and faithfully supporting parishioners well into their retirement years.

But, despite their continuing service, unlike most retired people, retired priests no longer receive a portion of their previous salary or benefits. When they answered the call from Christ to become a priest, they also placed their faith in God that He would provide for them in their later years.

The Catholic Diocese of Saginaw Priests' Retirement Fund provides a pension to our priests after they retire from full-time ministry. This special collection builds funds for *priests who are currently retired and for those who will retire in the future.*

Your gift to the Priests' Retirement Fund is your way to support those who have served, and continue to serve, you and your parish family.

Your gift goes directly to the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw's priests' pension plan, where it is invested and held in a trust account, which is administered by the Michigan Catholic Conference.

The pension plan provides for the monthly pension and medical benefits of our currently retired priests and helps fund the future retirement of our active priests.

For many years, usually more than 40, a priest responds to that call through full-time ministry in a parish, as well as involvement in diocesan committees and programs.

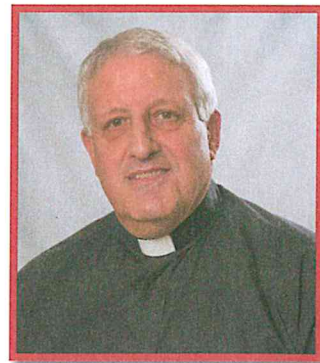
No longer in full-time parish ministry, retired priests may serve as sacramental ministers in parishes, or they cover as needed for priests who are sick or taking a little time off. Retired priests continue to serve on diocesan committees, they mentor newly ordained priests, and are involved in teaching ministries. They share their wisdom and experience in many ways.

A retired priest is no longer paid a salary or provided housing by a parish. He has to provide for himself, and the pension provided by the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw Priests' Retirement Fund is a major source of income. Your support of the annual Father's Day Collection for the Diocese of Saginaw Priests' Retirement Fund is a way of saying thank you to these priests who continue to respond to the call to serve. Your donation helps to provide a pension for those priests who are now retired, and it helps ensure a pension will be available for those priests who will retire in the future.

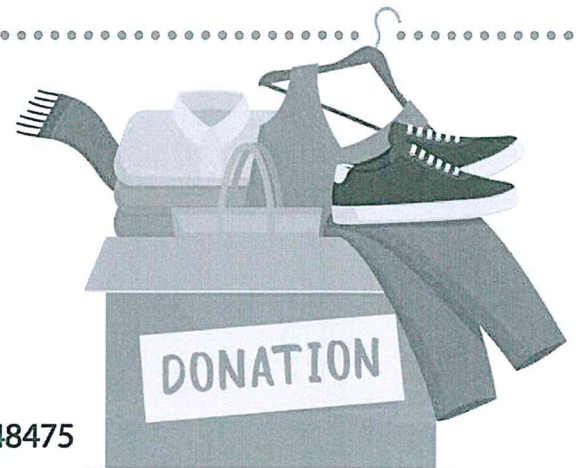
- **Clothing & Shoes**
