Mark your calendars – We will be cutting plastic bags, to be made into mats for the homeless on Tuesday, September 20^{th} . More details to follow.


Huron County Right to Life




I think I lose more things than the average person. Car keys. That magic security card that gets me into my office. My son's birth certificate (the night before the driver's test). Rather than wallow in our failures or close ourselves off to God, we are challenged to follow Paul's example and turn to God for our strength – we can turn to him knowing we are loved, valued, and cherished.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I confess I sometimes feel unworthy to become very active in my parish. I've made more mistakes than I can count; so, no, I'll pass on volunteering to be a lector or a catechist. That's a job for the "good Catholics." As we see time and again in Scripture, ours is a Church of sinners. As was the case with Paul, "once a blasphemer and a persecutor and arrogant," the Lord has mercy upon us, and his grace is abundant. Discipleship Testimony: How Christ Called John Harburg to Become His Disciple:

Hello, My name is John Harburg and it is a privilege to share my conversion story with all of you. For a little background, both of my parents were college educated. Both of them were good, honest and hard working people. However, neither of them had a faith in God and raised me to reject any belief in God.

When I was going to the University of Michigan, my search for God was sparked by a preacher on Campus. He challenged me with the question, "where are you going to spend eternity?" This took me by surprise as I had never considered the possibility of an afterlife.

I began to search for a higher power, fascinated with the possibility that there might be a God. I explored Zen Buddhism and explored other Eastern philosophies.

During a summer class I sat down next to a person who was a devout Christian. He and I became friends and he led me into a knowledge of the Christian life. He answered a lot of my questions. I was not ready to accept Christianity as the truth as yet.

I had barely escaped being drafted for the Vietnam war and was despairing about the whole human race. History was full of wars and man's inhumanity to man which looked to me to be insurmountable. I also had no hope of any meaning in life. I believed that after 70 or 80 years I would die and my existence would have been pointless.

I began experimenting with drugs and one evening I returned to my little studio apartment being high on acid. I had an electric clock and began watching the second hand. As it neared the top of the dial I saw it slow down and then stop. Then I experienced a very loving presence and the words came into my mind saying "John, I love you. Come and follow Me." I knew instantly that this was Jesus Christ. It is difficult to describe the immensity of His presence. One thing which is still with me to this day is that Jesus knew every molecule of my body, every thought I had and every feeling I felt. When He said "I love you", I experienced the reality that, despite knowing me inside out, He really did love all of me, the good and bad.

What was my response? "No, Lord, no one would believe me, I'm high on acid!" I spent the next 3 hours crying as my soul had rejected the Love for which it was created. He kept pursuing me and finally one day as I was reading the gospels, I was confronted with the question and choice of whether Jesus's life and miracles were really true. If it wasn't true, Jesus was the biggest lunatic liar. However, if it was true, I was reading about the Savior of the world. By the free gift of grace I chose to believe that He was the Savior of the world.

It took a little while for me to really give my life into His hands but when I did, I entered the Catholic church a year later. My despair was overcome. I was part of the Kingdom of God which was full of life, joy, peace, love and was eternal. My life gained meaning as I knew now that I was created to know, love and serve God. That was 43 years ago. I am more blown away by the reality that the Father, Jesus and the Holy Spirit actually want me to join in their Communion of Love forever in Heaven. Thank you.
