#### Some Holy Humor

A drunk stumbles along a baptismal service on Sunday afternoon down by the river. He proceeds to walk down into the water and stand next to the Preacher. In order to help you understand "The Story", God's Story, and how your story fits into it, and how to help Jesus rescue people in danger, here is the final homily of the series:

# Advent Homily Series: What is the Good News? Created, Captured, Rescued, Response

## Homily #4, Part 2 (Last week was Part 1): WHAT IS MY RESPONSE?

I realize it's often a sacrifice to come to Mass; it's difficult to understand the Scriptures, how they apply to our life, how they fit into our story, how we can help Jesus rescue others. That's why I'm giving this four part homily series called, What is the Good News? Created, Captured, Rescued, Response. These four words summarize "The Story" and help us understand our personal story.

1. The first part of The Story is summed up in the word CREATED. Why is there something rather than nothing? Because we are created; CREATED by God out of love, to RECEIVE love, and to GIVE love.

\*Grace to pray for: Good Father, give us the specific grace of <u>wonder</u>, wonder at Your creation, especially the highpoint of your creation, the human person.

Recently we experienced the wonder and beauty of CREATION at Christmas, when we gathered with family and friends to enjoy God's creation. This past week, a member of the parish group that gathers to make mats for the homeless out of plastic bags shared delicious leftover Christmas cookies and candies.

Family, Friends, cookies, sunsets, all created things are signs of God's goodness, signs that God CREATED us out of love, to RECEIVE love, and to GIVE love.

2.The second part of The Story is the word CAPTURED. **Why are things so messed up?** Because we are CAPTURED by enemies: sin, death, and the devil. This is the bad news, the

horrific news. In order to understand how good the good news is, we have to understand how bad the bad news is.

\*Grace to pray for: Good Father, give us the grace of good despair, despair of ever saving ourselves from our enemies, from sin, death, and the devil.

God's creation got all messed up because of the envy of the devil. He was envious of us and of Christ. So he CAPTURED our first parents by tricking them into sin, into disobeying God. We inherit that original sin, that stain; we are born into CAPTIVITY.

God's angels defeated the devil and his fallen angels and forced them out of heaven; God allowed the devil to become the temporary "Prince of this world" as Jesus calls him. These enemies now "roam about the world, seeking the ruin of souls", as we pray in the St. Michael prayer.

If you were on a football team, getting ready for a game against a team, and you never played them before, wouldn't you want to know their strategies, their plays, that they are planning? Wouldn't you want to see the PLAYBOOK? Scripture shows us the devil's PLAYBOOK.

His main strategy is to sell us the <u>lie that</u> God is NOT our Good Father, that God can't be trusted. That's the lie he sold to Adam and Eve and tries to sell us in our daily lives. When we believe it, we give in to temptation, sin, and then we experience the harmful consequences. The most serious potential consequence is eternal separation from God, hell.

Scripture calls the devil by two names which teach us his PLAYBOOK. First, he's called the devil. This means <u>divider</u>. Whenever you or I are tempted to participate in harmful division, harmful fighting, the divider is there. Whenever you see war, like the war in Ukraine, the <u>divider</u> is there.

Scripture also calls him Satan. That means <u>accuser</u>. Whenever you or I are tempted to accuse or condemn others in a harmful way, the accuser is there. When we're tempted to accuse ourselves, i.e. telling ourselves, "you're such a failure", the accuser is there.

Please, I beg you: remember this saying: **THE ENEMY...is the ENEMY.** Not the person I'm mad at. Not the person who hurt me. Not myself.

They're not my enemy. THE ENEMY...is the ENEMY. The devil. The person may be the victim of the true enemy, so I pray and fast for them, as Jesus calls me to.

3.The third part of The Story is the word RESCUED. What has God done about it? About us being CAPTURED? He's RESCUED us through His Son, Jesus Christ. This is not just good news, but extraordinary, life-changing, hopegiving news.

\*Grace to pray for: Good Father, give us the specific grace of <u>unshakable confidence</u> in Jesus as Lord of Heaven and Earth.

For centuries, God promised to send a RESCUER. Through the prophets, God said I see your misery, I see you are CAPTURED by sin, death, and the devil. I will rescue you.

In the last homily I used the example of Jesus defeating our enemies by becoming an "ambush predator", like a trapdoor spider. Fr. John says, quote, "Jesus on the cross is an <u>ambush predator</u> in the way He seems invisible, even helpless, while in reality being in charge of the situation until it's time to free sinners from Satan's power... He's showing God's love and going to war for us... When it looks like He's lost, He's actually won."



#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Since the Fall, the world has been riddled with strife and divisiveness. From the disobedience in the Garden, to Cain and Abel, to conflicts and wars throughout the centuries, it's clear that we humans are prone to picking sides and fighting over them. We hear about this even within the early Church from St. Paul in today's second reading. There were rivalries, and Christians were saying things such as, "I belong to Paul" or "I belong to Cephas." But Paul wisely asks: "Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" Clearly not, There is only one source of Truth - Jesus Christ - and Paul never hesitated to refuse credit for himself, and to instead glorify the Lord in his word and deed. This is the model set for us - to refuse to set ourselves or God-made-in-our-ownimage over and against the Triune God who created us. Christ came to unite us with himself and to one another, in reconciliation with the Father. His words are now our words: Repent and believe in the Gospel. Pray for the grace to come together as the body of Christ so that we can be his hands and feet in the world and carry out the work he began.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In Jesus Christ the kingdom of God enters into human history, fulfilling God's promise of salvation for his people. Christ inaugurated the kingdom on earth, and as members of his Church we are responsible for continuing to build it – here and now. As Christ called his first disciples and made them "fishers of men," so he calls us, that we might go forth "proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people."
