Prayer Ministry Weekends

On the 3rd Weekend of the month beginning April 15 & 16, we will have Prayer Teams available after Masses. You may ask the Prayer Team for anything, such as spiritual, physical, or emotional healing, or to receive prayer for someone else's healing (stand as proxy); you may ask for an experience of God's personal love, an outpouring of the Holy Spirit in your life, etc. After asking what you'd like prayer for, the team will briefly pray over/with you.



Outreach/Evangelization Action Step:


