Evolution of Faith

For those of you that don't know me my name is Marcia Glaza.

I am 1 of 12 children and I grew up in a strong faith filled family.

My family and my husband's family's faith were tested on July 25, 1974.

I was in a horrific car accident involving 2 teenagers and my best friend. The 2 teenagers succumbed to their injuries and passed away days later. I was listed in critical condition, given my last rights with the diagnosis I would not make it through the night. After my last rights were given, I experienced being in a tunnel. The tunnel was dark with a shred of light at its end. When I reached the end of the tunnel all I saw was beautiful green fields covered in wild flowers; a calmness came over me. My feelings at that moment were I was home and at peace and wanted to stay there. I spoke with God, and he had other plans for me. He spoke with me and told me I needed to go back that my work on earth was not finished. I made it through the night and was transferred from Bad-Axe hospital to Saginaw St. Mary's the following morning. I was in the intensive care unit for 6 weeks hooked to a brain wave machine. The neurosurgeon told my family that if I did regain consciousness that I would be a vegetable and would not walk or talk again. With the faith of my family and believing in our Lord and Savior I regained consciousness and spent another 6 weeks in Saginaw St Mary's and then was transferred closer to home for another 6 weeks for physical therapy.

I beat the odds of never being able to walk or talk again and function like a real human being my head injuries were very server with no short-term memory intact but I, built a successful Upholstery business. So, it goes to show you having faith, believing in God, asking for help and having hope your life can change and your work on earth isn't finished until God brings you home.
