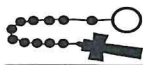

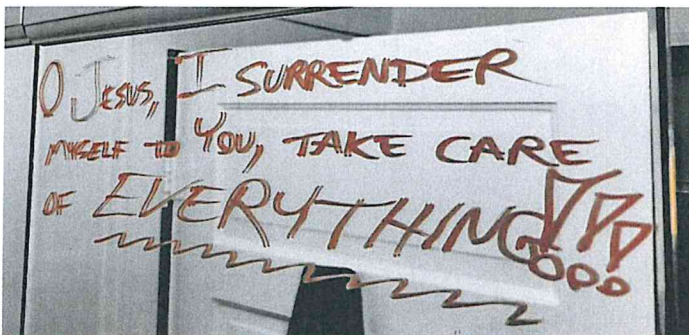

In this Easter Season, I encourage you to pray every day, **“O Jesus, I surrender myself to you; take care of EVERYTHING!”** And when bad, or painful, or frustrating things happen, I encourage you to “capitalize” on these opportunities by **offering** them to God for the salvation of souls. By doing this, we are a “hidden apostle” participating with Jesus in His ongoing work of saving souls from hell, the hell

of being separated from God in this life and in the next.

A book I can’t recommend enough is, *“I Believe in Love: A Personal Retreat Based on the Teaching of St. Therese of Lisieux By: Charles Arminjon, M. Teichert, and M. Stebbins.* The authors suggest that one way we can offer our sufferings is by saying to God,

“I am suffering and I am happy to suffer because it is a gift of Your love; but in exchange, give me souls. I am sure that You give me the souls of those I love who do not love You” (p. 203).

Then they offer this amazing reflection, which I hope motivates us:

“Think of all those for whom you purchase eternal bliss by a suffering which is, after all, transitory [temporary]. Suffering is a goldmine to exploit for saving souls, for helping missionaries, for being a hidden apostle” (P. 204).

Another way to spiritually “capitalize” or “profit” from suffering, whether caused by our own sins or the sins of others, is to pray, **“Jesus, bring a greater good out of that!”**

What did our Heavenly Father do with the greatest evil every committed, the murder of His Beloved Son Jesus? He brought a **greater good**, the greatest good in the universe, out of it. “God works all things to the good for those who love Him” (Romans 8:28) including our faults, weaknesses, sins, mistakes, sufferings caused by ourselves or others, frustrations, irritations, annoyances, disappointments, suffering from the cold of winter, suffering from the misunderstandings and selfishness and unfaithfulness of others, etc. you name it!

Right now, think of one of these sufferings. Next, pray, **“Jesus, bring a greater good out of that!”** Repeat it slowly, over and over again. Every time the pain comes to mind, repeat this prayer, and Jesus will pour healing balm over your inner wounds, as He does for me whenever I pray this way!

How can we be a “hidden apostle” when we suffer physically? Here’s a quote that I would like us to remember every time we get sick, have surgery, chronic pain, etc.:

“Jesus looks at you with more love than the others, because you suffer. Offer your sickness to save souls. He will listen to you because you are nailed to your bed, a little as He was on His Cross. He will listen to you, because He is moved with compassion for you.” I often tell this to the sick people whom I go to visit: “I come to collect from you because you are rich in the supernatural order. You amass by your accepted trial a great capital of graces, first of all for yourself, but also for others. I come to see my capitalist.” That makes them smile and gives them much courage. They are touched to see that someone considers them rich, for the idea never crossed their minds” (p. 183).

A deep suffering many of parish family members have shared with me is seeing your children and grandchildren reject the Catholic Faith you love and tried to instill in them. First, let me tell you, no matter what kind of parent you were, that **“It’s not your fault!”** “It’s not your fault!” Let these words **“resurrect”** your hope for them:

“Father, what anguish! What grief! All my efforts to lead them back to God are

in vain. What shall I do!” First of all, pay the ransom by your Masses and your Communions, adding to the Blood of Jesus in the chalice the blood of your souls, which is your tears. Then keep your confidence in the infinite mercy of the Savior. Say, like one mother I know who was distressed by the conduct of her children, “Jesus, You love them too much not to save them.” Thank Him in advance for the Heaven which He is preparing for them because of your prayer, but—and this is very, very important—while you are suffering, wait in peace for the time of Jesus, the time chosen by Him to grant your request. He will perhaps make you wait a long time, precisely as a proof of your confidence. Do not disappoint Him; tell Him, whatever your trial, that with His grace nothing will make you lose your profound peace, because you are sure of Him. Add your sufferings to the apostolate of your prayers united to the prayer of Jesus, which is the Mass. He willed to save the world by suffering. In order to redeem souls with the Savior, you must suffer with Him and like Him. Your Mass, which is a memorial of Calvary, will be of much more value if you are there at the foot of the Cross, or better still, on the Cross.”

This Easter Season, allow Jesus to **“resurrect”** your Faith, Hope, and Love, by surrendering yourself to Him daily, offering Him your sufferings for souls, and asking Him, whenever we are oppressed by past mistakes and sins, **“Jesus, bring a greater good out of that!”**

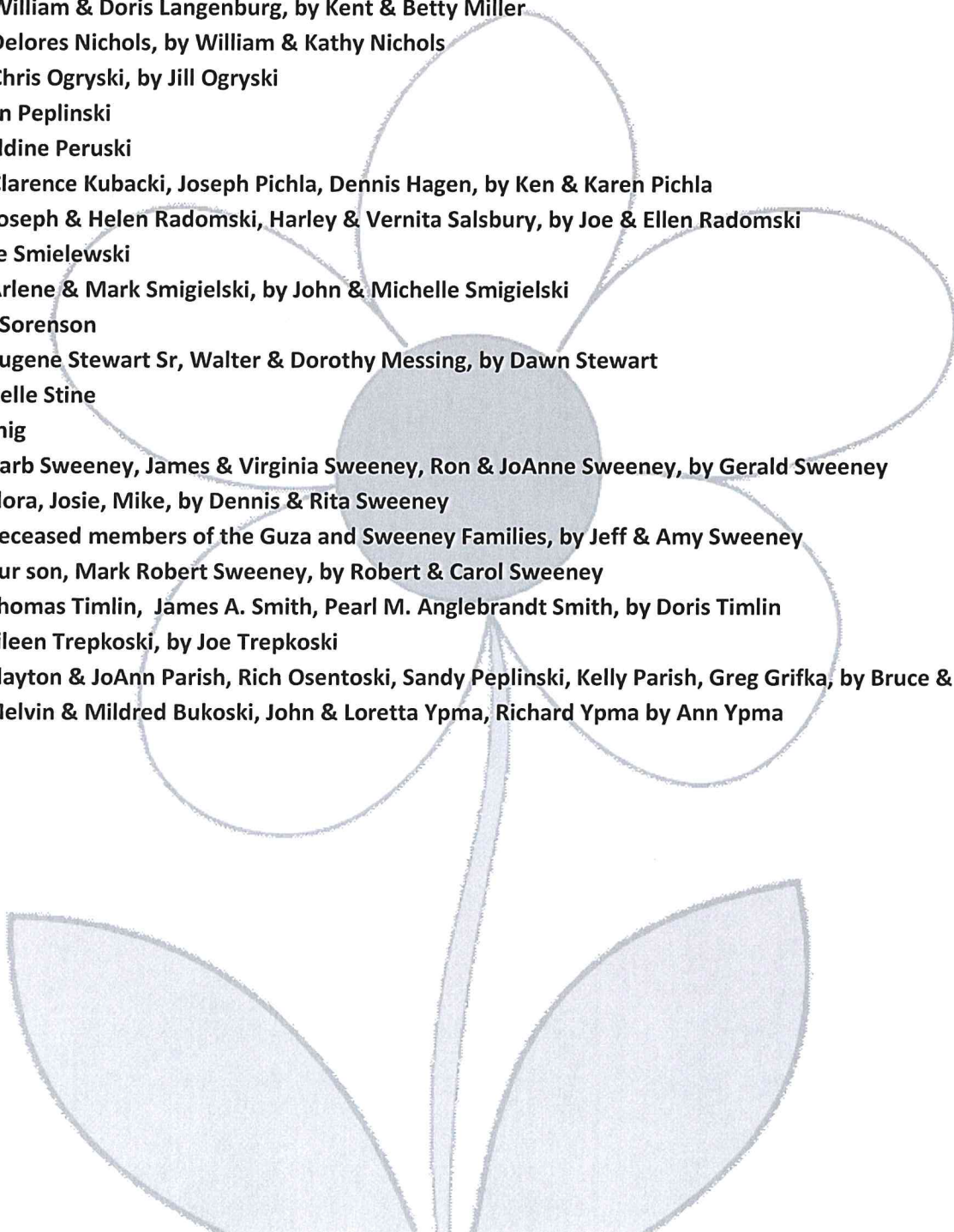

The Surrender Novena

GIVEN BY JESUS TO FR. DOLINDO RUOTOLO

DAY 1

Why do you confuse yourselves by worrying? Leave the care of your affairs to me and everything will be peaceful. I say to you in truth that every act of true, blind, complete surrender to me produces the effect that you desire and resolves all difficult situations.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)

DAY 2

Surrender to me does not mean to fret, to be upset, or to lose hope, nor does it mean offering to me a worried prayer asking me to follow you and change your worry into prayer. It is against this surrender, deeply against it, to worry, to be nervous and to desire to think about the consequences of anything. It is like the confusion that children feel when they ask their mother to see to their needs, and then try to take care of those needs for themselves so that their childlike efforts get in their mother's way. Surrender means to placidly close the eyes of the soul, to turn away from thoughts of tribulation and to put yourself in my care, so that only I act. Saying You take care of it.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)

DAY 3

How many things I do when the soul, in so much spiritual and material need turns to me, looks at me and says to me; You take care of it, then close its eyes and rests. In pain you pray for me to act, but that I act in the way you want. You do not turn to me, instead, you want me to adapt to your ideas. You are not sick people who ask the doctor to cure you, but rather sick people who tell the doctor how to. So do

not act this way, but pray as I taught you in the Our Father: Hallowed be thy Name, that is, be glorified in my need. Thy kingdom come", that is, let all that is in us and in the world be in accord with your kingdom. Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven, that is, in our need, decide as you see fit for our temporal and eternal life. If you say to me truly: Thy will be done. Which is the same as saying: You take care of it. I will intervene with all my omnipotence, and I will resolve the most difficult situations.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)

DAY 4

You see evil growing instead of weakening? Do not worry, Close your eyes and say to me with faith: Thy will be done, You take care of it. I say to you that I will take care of it, and that I will intervene as does a doctor and I will accomplish miracles when they are needed. Do you see that the sick person is getting worse? Do not be upset, but close your eyes and say You take care of it. I say to you that I will take care of it, and that there is no medicine more powerful than my loving intervention. By my love, I promise this to you.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)

DAY 5

And when I must lead you on a path different from the one you see, I will prepare you; I will carry you in my arms; I will let you find yourself, like children who have fallen asleep in their mother's arms, on the other bank of the river. What troubles you and hurts you immensely are your reason, your thoughts and worry, and your desire at all costs to deal with what afflicts you.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)

DAY 6

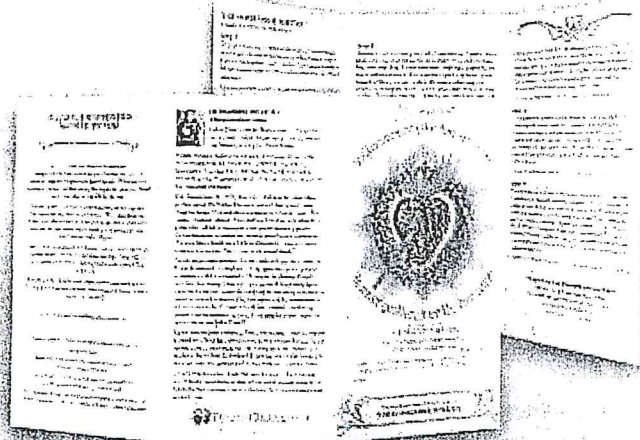
You are sleepless; you want to judge everything, direct everything and see to everything and you surrender to human strength, or worse- to men themselves, trusting in their intervention,- this is what hinders my words and my views. Oh how much I wish from you this surrender, to help you and how I suffer when I see you so agitated! Satan tries to do exactly this: to agitate you and to remove you from my protection and to throw you into the jaws of human initiative. So, trust only in me, rest in me, surrender to me in everything.

*O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)*

DAY 7

I perform miracles in proportion to your full surrender to me and to your not thinking of yourselves. I sow treasure troves of graces when you are in the deepest poverty. No person of reason, no thinker, has ever performed miracles, not even among the saints. He does divine works whosoever surrenders to God. So don't think about it any more, because your mind is acute and for you it is very hard to see evil and to trust in me and to not think of yourself. Do this for all your needs, do this all of you and you will see great continual silent miracles. I will take care of things, I promise this to you.

*O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)*



DAY 8

Close your eyes and let yourself be carried away on the flowing current of my grace; close your eyes and do not think of the present, turning your thoughts away from the future just as you would from temptation. Repose in me, believing in my goodness, and I promise you by my love that if you say You take care of it. I will take care of it all; I will console you, liberate you and guide you.

*O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)*

DAY 9

Pray always in readiness to surrender, and you will receive from it great peace and great rewards, even when I confer on you the grace of immolation, of repentance and of love. Then what does suffering matter? It seems impossible to you? Close your eyes and say with all your soul, Jesus, you take care of it. Do not be afraid, I will take care of things and you will bless my name by humbling yourself. A thousand prayers cannot equal one single act of surrender, remember this well. There is no novena more effective than this:

*O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!
(10 times)*
