<u>June 18 - 23 - Y.E.S. 2023</u> - This week-long service camp and immersion experience gives high school students an opportunity to learn about and fight poverty, while reaching out to the poor. Each June, youth spend five days of their summer vacation sprucing up yards and making minor repairs to several homes selected in the city of Saginaw. In addition to mowing lawns, trimming bushes and painting, Youth Encounter Service participants learn more about Catholic Social Teaching. They also spend part of the week volunteering at various outreach organizations in the community. Evening activities include guest speakers, prayer, and reflection on the experiences of the day. The fee for the week is \$150, which includes overnight accommodations, all meals, transportation all week long, evening programs, work materials, and socials. WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE "SEVEN GIFTS", THE "FRUITS", AND THE "CHARISMS"? "There are gifts of the Holy Spirit that we are given to keep and gifts we are given to give away. The traditional "seven gifts of the Holy Spirit" and the "fruits" of the Spirit are gifts given to us to keep. They are part of our inner transformation as Christians and provide the inner "Christlikeness" necessary for the effective use of our charisms (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1830–1832). Charisms, on the other hand, are given to us to give away, and are one of the ways God continues to enter the world through our assent and cooperation. They always benefit other people." (siena.org)


