





Bring Your Children to Church!

From a priest's Facebook post: "Encourage young mothers. Bring [your children] to church. Saturate their lives with the word of God. Even if they lay on the floor (there was a picture of a child doing just that). Even if they need 437 goldfish (to eat) and a sucker to keep quiet. Even if you stand in the back swaying back and forth holding them. Even when it's hard. Even when your row looks like a small hurricane just went through. Bring them to church. Let them see you worship. Let them see you pray. Let them see you running towards the Savior. . . because if they don't see and learn these things from you, who are they going to learn them from? The world will teach them it's not a priority. The world will teach them it's okay to lay down, not to pick up the Bible. The world will direct them so far off course, confuse them, and misform them that just being "good" is enough. The world won't teach them about Jesus... That's OUR job. Bring them to church."

Did you know? "Vocabulary" Terms related to Mass and Sacred Liturgy:

- Paten: flat metal plate for hosts (used in some parishes)
- Ciborium: bowl for hosts
- Purificator: cloth for wiping auxiliary chalice a.k.a. common cup
- Corporal: square altar cloth upon which the Eucharist is consecrated, from Latin "corpus" meaning "body"
- Sacrarium: sacred sink in sacristy
- Credence table: table for sacred vessels
- Before the consecration it's called "the bread", afterward, it has become "The Body of Christ" (not a symbol)
- Before the consecration it's called "the wine", afterward, it has become "The Blood of Christ" (not a symbol)
- Those distributing are now called "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion" instead of "Eucharistic Ministers"
