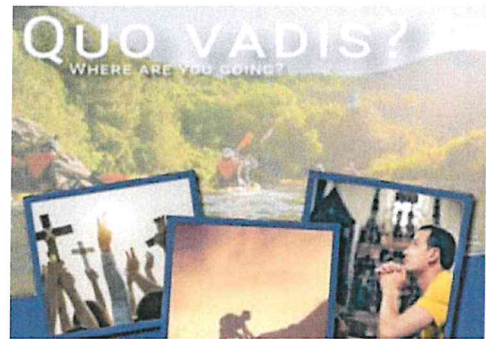
Time: 5:00pm (Starting June 4)

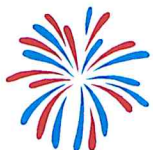
