Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week July 23 - 29, 2023

Natural Family Planning: Supporting God's gifts of love and life in marriage

Info about Natural Family Planning, also known as "fertility awareness", can be found at www.foryourmarriage.org and at ccnfp.org. From USCCB.org:

"The Church teaches that the sacrament of marriage symbolizes Christ's relationship with His Church. What is this relationship but one of total, faithful, permanent, and fruitful love!... When couples live their vocation according to Church teachings, especially with regard to the transmission of life, many benefits can be reaped. Indeed, married couples who use Natural Family Planning (NFP) report that among these benefits is their mutual growth in holiness and consequent deepening of their respect and awe of God's gifts of human sexuality, marriage and family..."

From ccnfp.org: "Catholic Women & Couples NFP [CWCNFP] is a lay-Catholic organization which teaches, without charge, Fertility Awareness and Natural Family Planning [NFP] to Adult Catholic Women and Catholic Couples". "Learn the Catholic and natural way to postpone [or achieve] a pregnancy..."

NFP Testimony from Fr. Nate: Years ago, I counseled a married woman about NFP and encouraged her to attend an NFP class. She attended and knowing that God was calling her to stop using a harmful and abortifacient form of birth control,

she became open to another child should God desire it. Later, she and her husband welcomed another beautiful girl into their family, and their family is very grateful to God. I'm grateful for the privilege of baptizing her!
