

Ask Padre: When do we bow our heads at Mass?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), No. 275 offers a summary: "A bow signifies reverence and honor shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bow: a bow of the head and a bow of the body.

"a) A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated. [Also, a head bow is the norm in the U.S. for receiving Jesus in Holy Communion; however, you may kneel if desired] "b) A bow of the body, that is to say, a profound bow, is made to the altar [when passing it, and]... in the Creed ["For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *profound bow* and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.' *end of bow*]
