

Rather, WHOSE does! Declare, "I am [His]; He is mine" (Song of Songs 2:16)


...Better yet, hear Him say in your heart, "You are mine"(2) (Isaiah 43:1)

Changing the World

10 Practical Tips for Spiritual Warfare

For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood; but against principalities and power, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. - Ephesians 6:12

Many films have been released on the topic of demonic possession, including "The Rite" and "The Last Exorcism" and of course, "The Exorcist". Many articles have been written about exorcism, but they usually spend a great deal of time explaining how rare 'demonic possession' is — and instructing people to not be overly concerned about. Modern secular society is fascinated by the topic, but at the same time, there are many who think things like demons, fallen angels, and Hell to be archaic notions for the unenlightened or feeble-minded.

Let's be blunt. There is a concerted effort — in fact, a conspiracy — of evil entities focused on dragging souls to Hell. They can be called demons or fallen angels, and are led by a specific angel named Satan or Lucifer. If you don't believe that the 'father of all lies' exists...you should.

They chiefly concern themselves with attacking God's children who strive to be Holy. They are not too concerned with anyone else, since they already 'belong' to the evil one – perhaps not in the sense of possession – but anyone who is not in a state of sanctifying grace is in danger of eternal damnation. Don't be deceived by talk about fairy tales, Hell is real and it lasts forever.

What many of the recent articles on the subject of demonic forces fail to explain is, how do you practically 'fight the good fight' and stay in a state of sanctifying grace? Often, you'll hear... "stay close to the Sacraments of the Church". While that's absolutely true — frequent Confession and reception of the Eucharist are the most powerful weapons we posses — what about on a day-to-day basis when you're not near a Church? Are there more spiritual weapons at our disposal? Absolutely!

Here are some that have been used and promoted by the Catholic Church and the Saints. NOTE: None of them offer any protection without a resolute belief and faith in the Son of God, Jesus Christ. He, and He alone is the source of all of their power. These are gifts from Heaven which must be cherished and used with reverence.

The Rosary

 This devotional practice is the spiritual equivalent of an atomic bomb in our war with the enemy. Many Graces are attached to its recitation, and Hell trembles at the name of Mary, the Mother of God.

Holy Water

• This is a 'Sacramental' of the Church and is highly efficacious in dispelling evil spirits. Keeping it in the home and sprinkling it about is a good thing. Saint Teresa of Avila was known to splash Holy Water at demons that would materialize and disturb her during her prayers.

Blessed Salt

 Sprinkling this about your home, or other areas where evil may be present, is extremely useful.

Medal of Saint Benedict

o Get one and have it blessed. Wear it about your neck or keep it on your person. The medal actually has a portion of the Roman Ritual of Exorcism inscribed on it in Latin.

Crucifix

 All Catholics should have at least one Crucifix hung prominently in their home. It should be blessed and ideally, it should be one that contains a Medal of St. Benedict.

Home Blessing

• This is a custom that every Catholic family should be practicing. It has fallen into disuse – so bring it back! Call up your Priest and ask for a Home Blessing. Offer him dinner as well.

Brown Scapular

 This is a powerful sacramental. Get enrolled [in the scapular], preferably by a Carmelite, and begin wearing it – now. Faithful observance of the conditions of enrollment comes with a promise by Our Lady of being delivered from purgatory, the Friday following death.

Prayer of Saint Michael

o If you believe yourself to be under attack from the enemy, call upon the defender of God's people, Saint Michael the Archangel. [St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.]

• The Holy Name of Jesus

o In cases of extreme duress, repeat the Holy Name of 'Jesus' – reverently – over and over until whatever persecution you are experiencing passes.

Mental Images of the Passion

While the fallen angels have no control over your Free Will, they do have some preternatural abilities to influence your thoughts. They will silently tempt you, often to impure thoughts, or into dissuading you from some good effort. Construct a mental picture of Our Lord Jesus Christ during His Passion. Focus on His pierced hands or feet, or maybe His carrying of the Cross. Concentrate on His crowning with thorns or scourging at the pillar. You will be amazed at how fast the evil thoughts will flee.

Please keep in mind these last few things...

The spiritual life is difficult. If it were easy, many more would choose it. Take comfort in knowing that Our Loving Father has given us many ways to persevere in Grace. We just need to remember to call upon Him! God permits the devil a certain amount power to disrupt our lives, but only so that we grow in Holiness as we overcome our trials.

These spiritual practices are meant to lead our minds, thoughts, and ultimately our hearts, to loving union with the Almighty Father. And that is what is causing these demons so much distress — we are actively choosing to be with God. We are rejecting their temptations, whatever they may be. With His Sacrifice at Calvary, Jesus has already defeated death and Satan. It is our duty and privilege to call upon Our Lord Jesus when in distress.

Stay close to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary.


