



The Sacrament of Anointing will be available at all three weekend Masses. Please sit on the inside and outside edges of the pews if you would like to be anointed. Who are candidates for Anointing? "Only those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age are proper subjects for the sacrament." [Pastoral Care of the Sick] "...old people may be anointed if they are in weak condition even though no dangerous illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be comforted by this sacrament" (Rite of Anointing, nos. 11, 12, 13). "It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation [whenever a serious illness or condition is the reason for the operation, so anointing before a knee surgery, for example, would not be appropriate]. Serious chronic pain is a valid reason for Anointing.

The Secret of Loving

We will be judged on how we lived the Greatest Commandment is to God with all our heart, and our neighbor as ourself. What does the word "love" mean? A feeling? Warm fuzzies? The word translated "love" in the bible from Latin means both CHOOSING someone, and DELIGHTING in them. Mother Agnes Mary Donovan, S.V from the Sisters of Life in NYC brings out both of

these definitions in her talk she gave to the *States Knights of Columbus Dinner, Aug. 1, 2023.*

She said, the "secret of loving" has three necessary steps:

Step 1: CHOOSING to give the person UNDIVIDED ATTENTION; showing the person, by the way we listen and look at them, "I CHOOSE to give you my undivided attention. I have nothing more important to do than to be with you, right here, right now."

Pope St. John Paul II was known for this. Many people, after talking with him, said they felt like He was listening to them as if they were the only person in the room.

Step 2: DISCOVERING THE GOLD in the person; allowing myself to be moved by the other person, by their goodness and beauty, placed in them by our Creator. To DISCOVER the gold in them, I must allow myself to be moved by them in some way. St. Therese did her best to discover the gold in an old cranky sister that she took care of. Remind yourself, "Father, this is Your son, or this is your daughter, made in Your image!"

Step 3: DELIGHTING IN THE PERSON. When we make the effort to first CHOOSE to give our undivided attention to someone, to DISCOVER THE GOLD in them, only then can we DELIGHT in them, or better, share in

God's own delight in them. When we delight in them, we "mirror the gold" in them: their own gold, their own goodness and beauty, reflects back to them, in our eyes and on our faces! Then they are changed, and so are we!

If we love people like this...
*They'll FEEL... we're not just loving them because we have to, because they're our family member, etc...
*They'll FEEL... we're not just loving them because of WHAT they've done, but for WHO they are.

*They'll FEEL... the love of <u>Christ</u> for them, through us.

But we can't give what we don't have. We can't give what we don't have. We have to first experience God loving us, through loved ones, and in prayer! Have you experienced God giving you His undivided attention, and delighting in you, during your prayer time? I encourage you to begin your prayer times with, [Father, or Jesus], help me to experience your undivided attention, and your delight in me.

PRAYER as Words, Sighs & Tears
by St Augustine (from letter to Proba)
"Let us always desire the happy life
from the Lord God and always pray
for it. But for this very reason we
turn our mind to the task of prayer at
appointed hours, since that desire

grows lukewarm, so to speak, from our involvement in other concerns and occupations. We remind ourselves through the words of prayer to focus our attention on the object of our desire; otherwise, the desire that began to grow lukewarm may grow chill altogether and may be totally extinguished unless it is repeatedly stirred into flame...

Excessive talking should be kept out of prayer but that does not mean that one should not spend much time in prayer so long as fervent attitude continues to accompany his prayer... To spend much time in prayer is to knock with a persistent and holy fervor at the door of the one whom we beseech. This task is generally accomplished more through sighs than words, more through weeping than speech. He places our tears in his sight, and our sighs are not hidden from him, for he has established all things through his Word and does not seek human words."


