

## <u>Dear Saint-in-the-Making,</u> <u>MERRY CHRISTMAS!</u>

I pray you enjoyed time with your loved ones this Christmas. I pray you grow closer to them in 2024. Lord Jesus, bless our entire parish, especially those who are carrying

heavy crosses. How can you help someone carry their cross this Christmas Season? How can you be the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus in our community? How can you use your gifts to enrich our parish family? Pray about it.

I love to help you discover the treasures of the Catholic Church. The "Angelus" is one. The name comes from the Latin word for "Angel", the first word of the prayer: "The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary." The angelus has the key verses from the Gospel of the Annunciation. Millions of Catholics pray it daily, and have done for centuries. The Pope prays is Sundays with the public. Traditionally, it's prayed at 6am, 12 noon, and 6pm. All Catholics are encouraged to pray it at least once a day. We pray it after our Wednesday morning Mass, and our office ministry team often prays it before lunch.

Why pray the Angelus daily? Every time we pray it, we repeat the prayers of Mary, we pray with Mary, "Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to thy word." In other words, "Lord, I am your servant, thy will be done in my life!" The Angelus is a powerful way to pray for the millions who pray the Angelus every day, and to be prayed for by them!

Then we pray, 'And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us". This reminds us of Christmas and that Jesus dwells among us in the tabernacle of our hearts, and the Eucharistic tabernacles of our churches.

The Angelus is a <u>way to evangelize</u>, by inviting others to join us.

Mary is the way to Christ, Jesus IS the way to heaven. Mary leads us to the bridge to heaven, Jesus IS the bridge to heaven. In 2024, pray the Angelus every day, and you will be praying with Mary, who will draw you closer to Her Son, Jesus Christ. Pray it before Mass- the contemporary version is on pg. 336 of the hymnal. Or on the next page, find the traditional version:

## **The Angelus (Traditional Version)**

(Leader) L/ The Angel of the Lord declared to Mary:

(Response) R/ And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Hail Mary...

L/ Behold the handmaid of the Lord: R/ Be it done unto me according to thy word. Hail Mary...

L/ And the Word was made Flesh:
R/ And dwelt among us. Hail Mary...
L/ Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God,
R/ that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

L/ Let us pray: (All pray) Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts; that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection, through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Christmas Letter from Fr. Wachsmann
Father Wachsmann († 1944) was a German
Catholic priest who took a stand against
the Nazi regime early on. He was arrested
by the Gestapo in 1943 and sentenced to
death. This is a letter to his sister Maria.

As gifts I bear to the manger hunger and cold, loneliness and forlornness. Shining chains are my only ornament. I want to give my life, previously placed in the service of the King of Christmas, to him who saved me with his precious blood. With copious tears of penitence I want to wash away everything that has turned to guilt and remorse in me. It is in this spirit that I am going to make my pilgrimage to the manger. I hope through grace to celebrate Christmas deep within my heart and mind as never before in my life. No

gift, no festive meal will distract me, no candle will gleam, no fir tree will emit its fragrance....

But the Infant Jesus in the Eucharist will, as a glorious reality of Christmas, irradiate me with eternal light and fill me with the warmth of compassionate love. I shall recite the breviary so slowly, so inwardly, that I shall taste the sweetness of every word. I shall say many prayers of the rosary and read the Holy Scriptures. In this way, I hope, the peace of Christ will be my portion and his grace will be my glory. I am without any bitterness; I bear everything with the patience that only Christ gives.

I hope that my prayer and the prayers of so many others will be heard; I hope that I may at some time intone the Gloria at the altar once more. I wish you the grace of Christ so that you may with strength and love drink with me the myrrh that God's love offers us this year.

ASK PADRE (question from parishioner)
When you finish purifying the vessels after
Communion, when Jesus' Body has been placed
back (reposed) in the tabernacle, just before you
sit down, you stop and bow to the altar. The
emphasis has been to the tabernacle as it holds
Jesus. Why the bow now towards the altar?

According to the liturgical rubrics (instructions), during Mass, the ministers (priest, servers, etc.) are to bow to the altar. During Mass, the focus is on the altar as the place of Christ's sacrifice where it is represented- made present to us in the here and now- in an "unbloody manner". But before and after Mass, and right after Jesus' Body is reposed in the tabernacle, the priest genuflects to the tabernacle.


