SAINTS-IN-THE-MAKING:

Dear Saint-in-the-Making,

PRAISE REPORT: I was at a coffee shop this past Monday, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. I noticed a song playing and it sounded like they were singing about "Jesus", so I listened carefully. The lyrics totally fit the Baptism of the Lord! When Jesus was baptized, he baptized the water, and gave the water power to "wash" our sins away.

It was the song "Oh Happy Day", a 1967 gospel music arrangement by the Edwin Hawkins Singers of the 1755 hymn written by Philip Doddridge. It became an international hit in 1969, reaching No. 4 on the US Singles Chart, No. 1 in France, Germany, and the Netherlands.

The Lyrics:

O happy day that fixed my choice - On Thee, my Savior and my God! - Well may this glowing heart rejoice - And tell its raptures all abroad Happy day, happy day - When <u>Jesus washed my</u> sins away! - He taught me how to watch and pray - And live rejoicing every day..."

Thank you Jesus for your baptism, which enabled me to be baptized!

God's Priority List

What's God's priority list for us, worship first, or service first? First, God wants our hearts in worship; next, He wants our hands in service. First, "the wise men prostrated themselves and did him homage. Next, they opened their treasures and offered him gifts..."

The Gospel tells us the wise men followed the star to the house of Joseph and Mary. What a beautiful star our decorators put up! They went in, "saw the child with Mary, his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts..."

First, they worshiped. The most common word translated as worship in the New Testament is "proskuneo" which literally means "to kiss toward" in loving homage and adoration.

In the ancient East, people who were equal rank normally greeted each other with a kiss. But when a person of low rank greeted a superior, he'd fall prostrate flat on the ground or on his knees, and as he was bowing down, he would throw kisses toward his superior. So the wise men likely did this toward Christ! Isn't that beautiful? Next time you genuflect toward Jesus, or pass a Catholic Church while driving, feel free to throw Jesus a kiss. After giving him their hearts in worship, next, they gave him their hands in service, represented by their gifts.

First Gods wants our hearts in worship; next, He wants our hands in service. This is God's priority list.

We see God's priority list in the letter to the Hebrews (13:15–16) which says, "Through Christ... let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." So he's saying first offer the sacrifice of praise with lips, like at Mass and in our daily prayer

times; <u>next</u>, the sacrifice of doing good, stewardship of time, talent, treasure, etc.

Every meal, first, we give God our hearts in worship, and then our hands in service by eating and loving everyone at the table.

Every day, first, we give God our hearts in worship in our morning prayer time, and then our hands in service at home, work, or school.

Every week, first, we give God our hearts in worship at Mass, and then our hands in service the rest of the week. Mass is the top priority of our week. Scripture teaches Sunday is the start of the week. Remember the 3rd commandment? "keep holy the Lord's Day." From the beginning, Christians have always kept holy the Lord's day by Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation.

The catechism says, (2181) "The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants [weather]) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave [mortal] sin."

If you've ever deliberately missed Mass without a valid reason, the Lord is calling you to confess that to Jesus in the sacrament of reconciliation/confession as soon as you can.

When you make Mass your TOP priority, people notice. If anyone asks why you do, you could tell them: Jesus <u>died</u> to give us the Mass. I owe Him my praise and thanks since he died for me. At the Last Supper He said, "Do this in memory of me." Also, Mass is how we fulfill the 3rd commandment. My soul needs Mass even more than my body needs air and food.

Many Christians and martyrs throughout the centuries have <u>died</u> in order to go to Mass, or to bring Mass to others, when it was a crime punishable by death. Today, it still is in some countries. Christians are still risking and losing their lives to attend Mass.

Jesus guided the Church to make Sunday Mass an obligation, because He knew we <u>need</u> obligations to teach us God's priorities.

(Catechism, 2185) "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy (such as care of relatives), and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body... [including time for prayer and reflection]"

Did you know Sunday is a "protest movement"? (2172) "If God "rested and was refreshed" on the seventh day, man too ought to "rest"... (Ex 31:17; cf. 23:12) The sabbath brings everyday work to a halt and provides a respite. It is a day of protest against the servitude of work and the worship of money. (Cf. Neh 13:15-22; 2 Chr 36:21)"

Here's an easy way to remember God's priority list for us: Every time we make the sign of the cross, we remind ourselves that: First, God wants our minds and hearts [touch head and heart] in worship; next, He wants our hands [touch shoulders] in service.

Fight for your prayer time!

Lately Jesus has been reminding me of God's priorities, especially when I'm tempted to not pray first thing in the morning, when I'm tempted to jump right into work before my morning prayers. He whispers to me, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness, [his commandments, his WILL,] and all these things [food, clothing, the bare necessities of life] will be given to you."

Then I sometimes have to fight to say yes and to deny myself; to give Jesus my heart first in worship, before my hands in service. It's spiritual warfare! Some days, it's easy to be faithful to prayer times; other days, we have to fight hard.
