#### <u>Dear Saint-in-the-Making,</u> <u>MERRY CHRISTMAS and BLESSED NEW YEAR!</u>

I pray you enjoyed time with your loved ones this Christmas and new year's. I pray you grow closer to them in 2024, and take every opportunity to practice Christ-like, prayer-fueled, Eucharist-empowered "kindness and forgiveness", to use a phrase of one of our parishioners.

How can you help someone carry their cross this Christmas Season? How can you be the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus in your family, parish, and community in 2024?

# ASK PADRE: Why does Father sometimes need to check the number of hosts in the "ciborium" (bowl-like sacred vessel) that the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) is holding, during Communion?

Every weekend, the sacristans (ministers who set up and clean up for Mass) count the number of people at Mass right before Mass begins, but often people (sometimes more than a few) come in at the last minute or late. Sacristans

account for this by putting in extra hosts. These accumulate from week to week in the ciborium in the tabernacle.

On the last weekend of the month, out of reverence for Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist, the conserated Hosts in the tabernacle should all be consumed before they become too old. So sacristans attempt to plan for this by putting out a smaller number of hosts to be consecrated at Mass. Before the Communion Procession, Father does his best to place the proper number of consecrated Hosts in each ciborium.

However, sometimes Father needs to check the number of Hosts in the ciborium of the Extraordinary Minister, to make sure that everyone will be fed. If running low, Father may instruct the Extraordinary Minister to break Hosts in half. But ideally this will not need to be done.

## ASK PADRE: Why is there a veil on the chalice and on the ciborium in the tabernacle?

In Christianity, veils are placed on persons and things because they are holy and "set aside for God" or set aside for worship. The optional veil on the ciborium in the tabernacle reminds us that the this sacred vessel contains the precious Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ in the Eucharist.

The chalice represents Christ. The unveiling of the chalice veil before the Liturgy of the Eucharist symbolizes the fact that the mysteries we've just heard in the Liturgy of the Word are unveiled and fulfilled in the mystery of the Holy Eucharist. In the liturgy we re-live, in a sacramental way, the self-offering of Christ in the Paschal Mystery.

Some priests use chalice veil (optional, but encouraged by the church's rubrics) to remind us that the Sacrifice of the Mass IS the Sacrifice of the Cross, made present in the here-and-now. We re-live the stations of the Cross at every Mass. In the 10th Station, "Jesus is stripped of his garments." We're reminded of this when the chalice is stripped of its veil. 


