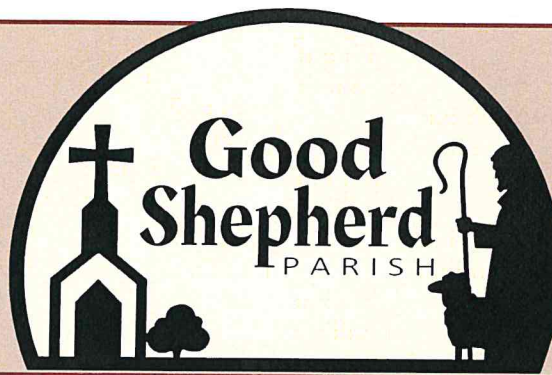

Dear Saint-in-the-Making, Blessed Lent!

Please take a purple sheet with the 10 commandments and memorize them before Easter. Quiz your wife or your husband! Quiz your children or grandchildren! And Quiz me! The commandments show us how to PROVE our friendship with Jesus. He tells us, "*You are my friends if you keep my commandments*" and He also says, "*Whoever loves me will keep my commandments...*" If we keep His commandments, He promises, "*I will SHOW myself to them.*" The following quotes are from the "Compendium of the Catechism", a summary of the Catechism.

Commandment/Gift #5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.

466. Why must human life be respected?

"...because it is sacred... it remains forever in a special relationship with [God]..."

467. Why is the legitimate defense of persons and of society not opposed to this [commandment]?

"Because in choosing to legitimately defend oneself [or another] one is respecting the right to life... and not choosing to kill."

470. What is forbidden by the 5th commandment?

"direct and intentional murder and cooperation in it;

"direct abortion, willed as an end or as means, as well as cooperation in it...;

"direct euthanasia...

"suicide and voluntary cooperation in it.... [O]ne who is psychologically disturbed or is experiencing grave fear may have diminished responsibility" [*i.e. diminished guilt.*]

472. Why must society protect every embryo?"The inalienable right to life of every human individual from the first moment of conception is a constitutive element [*i.e. component*] of civil society and its legislation.... When the State does not... [protect the] vulnerable, including unborn children, the very foundations of a State... are

undermined." *Pray/sacrifice for an end to abortion, especially with the Rosary!*

474. What duty do we have toward our body?"We must take reasonable care of our own physical health and that of others... "to be avoided are the use of drugs which cause very serious damage to human health and life, as well as the abuse of food, alcohol, tobacco and medicine.... *NOTE: It is against the 5th commandment to get drunk. If intentionally done it is a mortal sin. The following are also serious sins against this commandment:* "[K]idnapping and hostage taking, terrorism, torture, violence, and direct sterilization..." This is not a complete list, of course.

480. What does the Lord ask of every person in regard to peace?"...He called for peace of heart and denounced the immorality of anger [not the emotion of anger, but]... a desire for revenge... He also denounced hatred which leads one to wish evil on one's neighbor. These attitudes, if voluntary and consented to in matters of great importance, are mortal sins against charity."

Commandment #8: YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.

"Every person is called to... truthfulness in acting and speaking... to seek the truth... [and to obey it and 'bear witness to it']" *Why? Because Jesus Christ is 'the truth'! He enables us to be truthful.*

523. What is forbidden by the eighth commandment?

·Have I lied or sworn falsely?
·Have I gossiped or ruined anyone's good name [reputation]?
·Have I revealed information about anyone that should have been kept confidential [even if true]?

Can you see how this commandment is related to "YOU SHALL NOT KILL?" It is possible to "kill" someone's reputation; to "kill" love in your heart by unloving thoughts or words. YOU SHALL NOT MURDER, means, YOU SHALL NOT MURMUR: murmur lies, murmur evil words about others.

The 4th degree again is making cheese balls as a fundraiser.

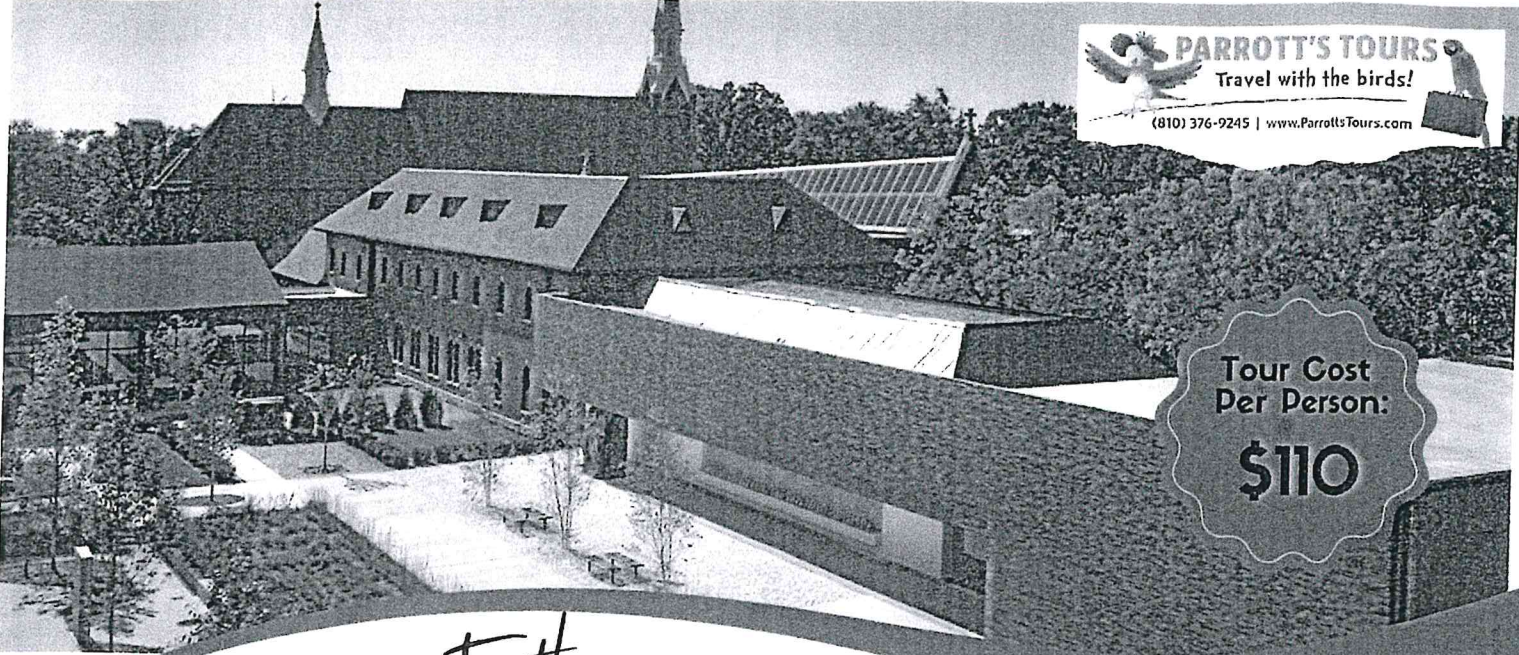
The District Deputy reported that the convention will be May 22nd – May 24th

Gary Krause was named as Knight of the Month.

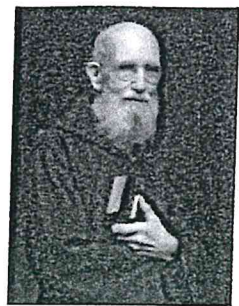
