She can draw us all closer, including the hardest of heart sinners, to God's mercy and forgiveness by following and living the timeless message of the church approved Fatima apparitions. Mary patiently awaits for us to ask her assistance in turning away from sin and guiding us closer to God by graces and mercy. She invites everyone to open their hearts to learn why the apparitions in Fatima are "the solution for our times" quoted from the late Saint John Paul II. Practicing the Fatima message is more important than ever! May 13th Apparition, during the visit of Our Lady at Cova da Iria she said, "Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war."

June 13th Apparition, Our Lady appeared and addressed Lucia, "Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wants to establish devotion in the world to my Immaculate Heart. To those who accept this, I promise the salvation of their souls and they will be loved by God like flowers placed by me to adorn his throne." Lucia inquired sadly: "Am I to stay here alone?" "No, my daughter are you suffering? I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."

In the Lady's right hand was a heart encircled by thorns that pierced it. They understood it was the Immaculate Heart of Mary, outraged by the sins of humanity and seeking reparation.

July 13th Apparition, Sacrifice yourselves for sinners and say many times, "O Jesus, it's for love of You, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved and there will be peace. I shall come to ask for the Communion of Reparation on the First Saturdays. If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world causing war and persecution of the church."

August 13th Apparition, The Lady spoke to Lucia: "I want you to continue praying the Rosary every day, and pray, pray, pray very much and make sacrifices for sinners, for many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and pray for them."

Art and Environment Improvements at the Churches of Good Shepherd Parish (2024)

Dear parishioner,

After two different Pastoral Visitations to our churches by the Office of Liturgy represented by Fr. Pat O'Connor (retired Associate for Liturgical Art & Environment) and Fr. Jim Bessert (first visitation), recommendations were given (and copied to Jane Sills, diocesan facilities) for the creation of a Master Plan for various changes to the liturgical art and environment.

It's always good to begin with the "WHY". Why all these changes, which some may consider minor or insignificant? It is for the same "why" that our churches were built; the same "why" that our parish gathers in our churches: to dispose us and prepare us for an "encounter" with Jesus in the Eucharist. *The same Jesus who walked the dusty streets of Galilee; Jesus, who "[comes] to us in word and sacrament to bring us holiness" (Roman Missal); Jesus, who thirsts for our love; Jesus, who calls us into life-transforming union and intimacy with God; Jesus, the Bridegroom of our souls.*

The National Eucharistic Revival is underway. The Eucharist is, "the source and summit of the Christian life" (Vatican II). In the celebration of the Eucharist, we encounter Jesus in **four ways**:

1. *in the congregation (including our own hearts),*
2. *in the priest,*
3. *in God's Word / Scripture,*
4. *and especially in the "Blessed Sacrament" of the Eucharist, the "Real Presence" of Christ.*

We also encounter Him in the art and environment of our churches. These changes were made with the hope that our churches will better dispose and prepare everyone who walks through our doors to *encounter our Risen Lord, Who longs to set us "on fire with the Truth" (see new Parish Vision at goodshepherdubly.com)*. The following Master Plan for Art and Environment, currently being implemented, found approval by our Worship Commission and Pastoral Council Chairperson.

In our Eucharistic King,

Fr. Nate Harburg

I: Saint Columbkille Church:

- New Divine Mercy image (framed picture)
 - A parishioner offered to donate funds towards a Divine Mercy image to be purchased by Fr. Nate for St. John; he found generous donors for the same image at our other churches.
 - It was placed by the Confession/Reconciliation area due to its theme of mercy.
 - Meaning of Image: Jesus to St. Faustina: **"Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on**

earth, especially at the hour of death.” (Diary, 47, 48). “The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous [baptism and confession]. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls [the Eucharist]. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross.... It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works (742).”

- The Tabernacle has been replaced in its original location on the old high altar. Both Fr. O’Connor and Bishop Gruss said it should be replaced there. Why? It is better honored on the high altar than on the pedestal; the reredos (decorative wooden structure above high altar) makes no sense without the tabernacle.
 - The sanctuary lamp indicating Jesus’ Eucharistic Presence in the tabernacle will be moved for people sitting in the North transept chairs to be able see, since they won’t be able to see the tabernacle. If someone wishes to see and be closer to Jesus in the tabernacle, if there is room in the main church on the pews, they can consider moving there.
 - The pedestal will be placed in the choir loft centered in front of the stained glass window for a statue to be donated.
- A new lockable Ambry (cabinet for the three different Holy Oils) was built through the generous stewardship of parishioner Karen Romzek.
- In the north Entrance, the crucifix will be moved, the cross with the heart (donated by parishioner Dennis Goniwicha) will be moved to where the Last Supper image was, which has been moved to the hospitality/faith formation room; Fr. Nate donated the St. Anthony Statue and acquired the Sacred Heart statue from the diocese warehouse at no cost; pedestals generously built and donated by Karen Romzek.

II: Saint John the Evangelist Church:

- *See above about Divine Mercy Image. Worship Commission decided on location.
- The memorial picture for Claribel, a former organist, placed over the organ 20 years ago, was removed and will be given to the family or relocated to another space on the campus.
- There has been a re-configuration of the music area; the piano was invading the sanctuary so it was moved in front of the organ.
- The side entrance of the church was cleaned up and prepared for devotional prayer. The Sacred Heart statue was donated by Fr. Nate; the wooden statue pedestal was built and donated by Rick Vogel’s company, *Quality Wood Products*.
- The 15th Station of the Cross is not to be in the sanctuary; it will be moved to the back of the church by the memorial donation plaques for the stations.
- Rick Vogel’s worker built a lockable Ambry for St. John, at no cost; Rick and Sandy generously transported a better baptism font from diocese warehouse (on loan) and renovated it. Eventually a permanent font will need to be placed in this Church (either a used one or a new one).

III: Saint Joseph Church:

- *See above about Divine Mercy Image. Worship Commission decided on location.
- Now the crucifix is up permanently behind the altar since not liturgically appropriate to swap with Risen Christ image.
- Bill Izydorek generously refurbished an unused lockable Ambry, fixed the lock and hand-made a new key, and placed the Ambry on the wall by the sanctuary.
