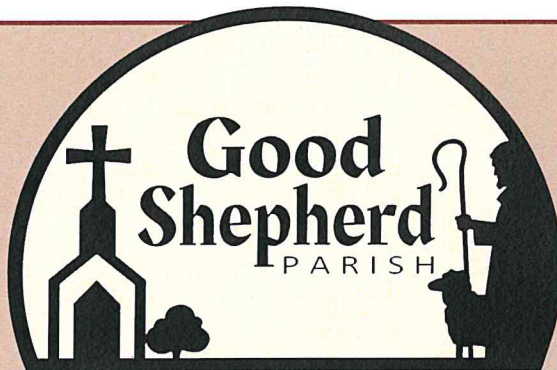

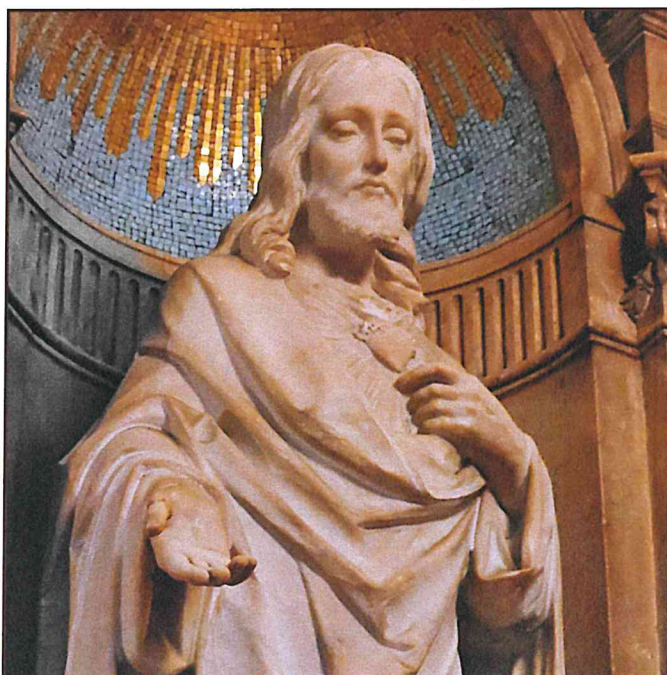

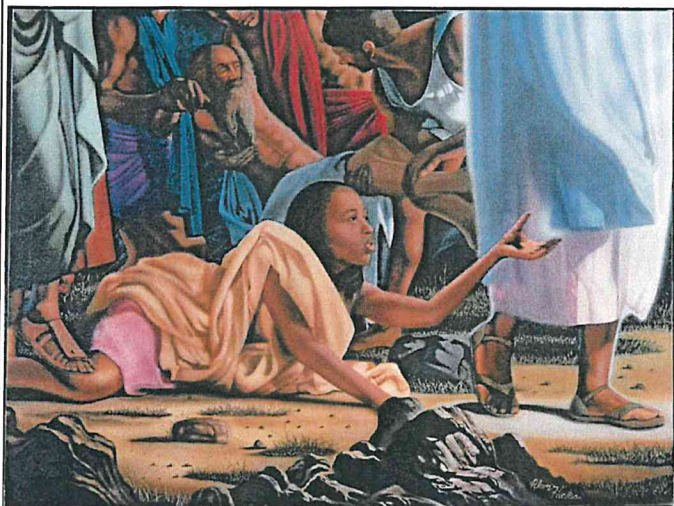

KC 5K For Local Food Pantries

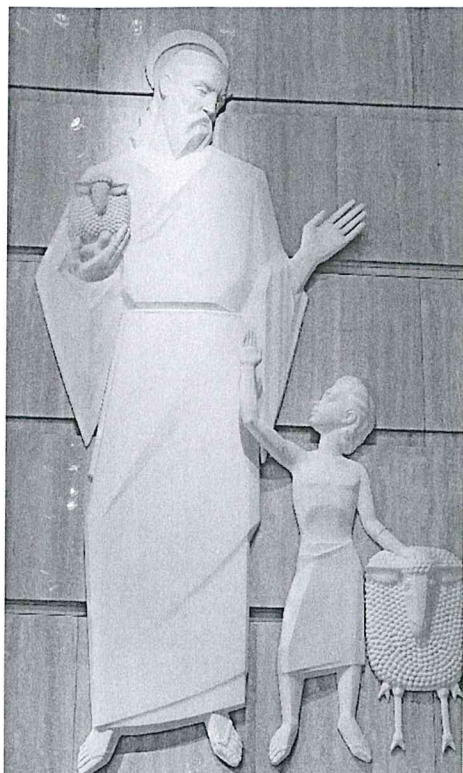

Letting Jesus Plant Mustard Seeds in Us

For planting mustard seeds of the Kingdom, two of the Best Practices are teaching and preaching. We each are called to teach ourselves, or actually, to let Jesus teach and preach to us. Our new parish Vision states, "We will be strengthened through... lifelong faith formation" and "study of the Word..." On Weekends, we let Jesus teach us and preach to us at Mass. The rest of the week, how are we letting Jesus teach us and preach to us? He wants to plant seeds in our heart every day. Here are some ways parishioners are letting Jesus teach them and preach to them: listening to the Bible in a Year or Catechism in a Year podcast; regularly

texting scriptures to family and friends; praying with the Hallow or Amen apps; Ave Maria Radio on 1440 AM or the app, watching EWTN; watching homilies on youtube. Jesus invites us to find new ways to let Him teach us and preach to us daily!

"To Jesus Through Mary" -Love, Fr. Nate

"Her [Mother Teresa's] mission began every day, before dawn, in the presence of the Eucharist. In the silence of contemplation, Mother Teresa heard the echo of Jesus' cry on the Cross: 'I thirst.' This cry, received in the depths of her heart, spurred her to seek out Jesus in the poor, abandoned, and the dying on the streets of Calcutta and to all the ends of the earth" (Pope John Paul II, Sunday Angelus, September 7, 1997).

Quotes of Mother Teresa

"The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in Heaven, and will help bring about everlasting peace on earth."

"Who is Jesus to me? Jesus is the Word made Flesh. Jesus is the Bread of Life. Jesus is the Victim offered for our sins on the cross. Jesus is the sacrifice offered at holy Mass for the sins of the world and for mine. Jesus is the Word—to be spoken. Jesus is the Truth—to be told. Jesus is the Way—to be walked. Jesus is the Light—to be lit. Jesus is the Life—to be lived. Jesus is the Love—to be loved."

"Like Mary, let us be full of zeal to go in haste to give Jesus to others. She was full of grace when, at the annunciation, she received Jesus. Like her, we too become full of grace every time we receive Holy Communion. It is the same Jesus whom she received and whom we receive at Mass. . . let us go in haste to give Him to our sisters, to our poor, to the sick, to the dying, to the lepers, to the unwanted, and the unloved." "When communicating with Christ in your heart—the partaking of Living Bread—remember what Our Lady must have felt when the Spirit overpowered her and she, who was full of grace, became full with the body of Jesus."

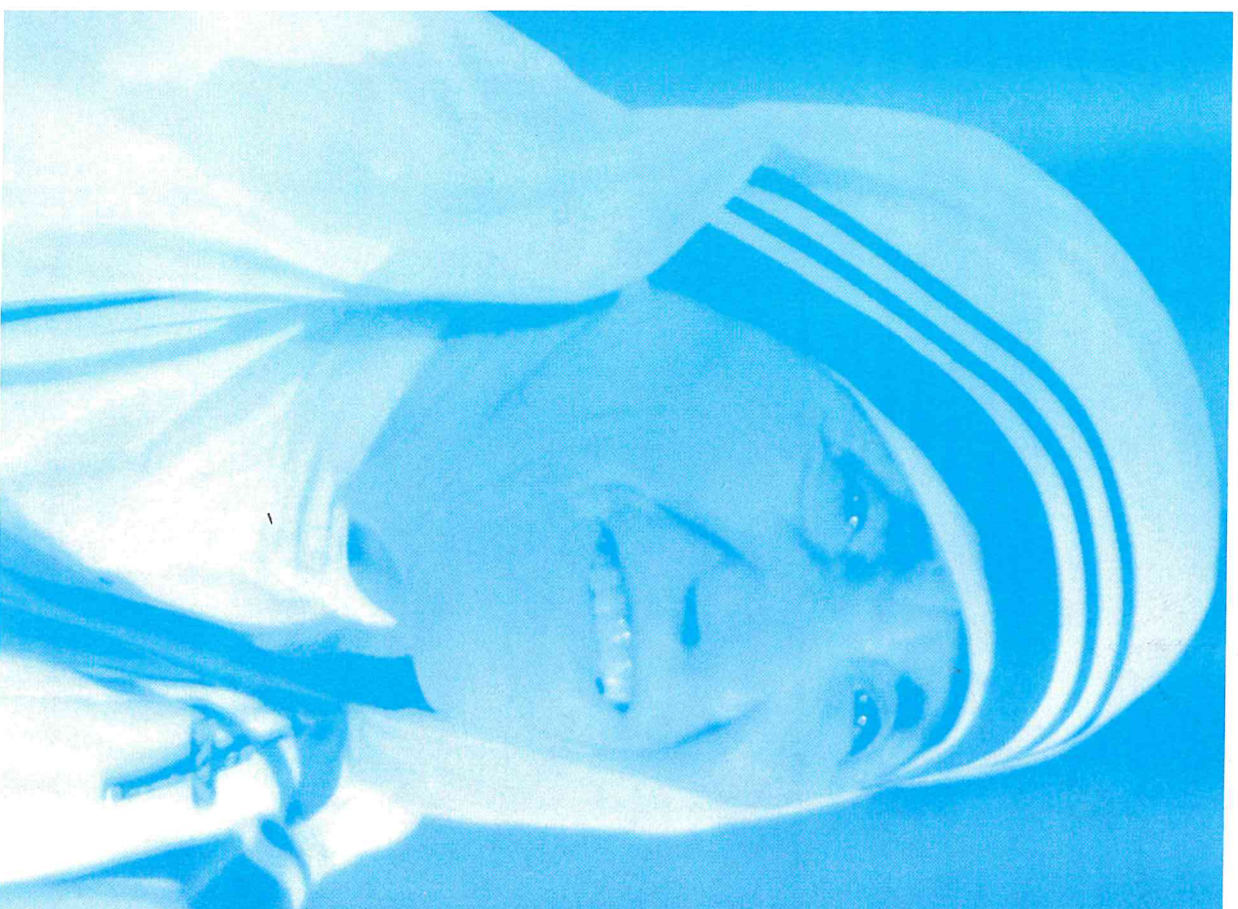

Pastoral Council Nomination Form (2024-2027)

Fr. Nate Harburg and our Pastoral Council are seeking nominations for new adult members and new youth member(s). Before you nominate anyone, please review the following Norms from the Saginaw Diocese:

Purpose of the Parish Pastoral Council¹

- A. The Council is [an] advisory [body] to the Pastor.
- B. The Council shall serve the parish to fulfill the pastoral mission of Jesus Christ and His Church, specifically on behalf of the parish. It does this by promoting Catholic worship and identity, supporting religious education and (re)evangelization, and fostering stewardship and service.
- C. The Council shall provide advice and guidance to the Pastor in building a community of disciples who recognize their baptismal calls to lives of holiness, witness and service.
- D. The Council shall engage in pastoral planning, which takes into account the needs and priorities of its parishioners, the diocese, the broader community, and the world...
- E. The Council members shall listen attentively to the vision of the Bishop of the Diocese of Saginaw and the Pastor, promoting within the parish unity of prayer and vision, as well as collaboration in pastoral outreach.

Requirements for Parish Pastoral Council members

- A. The Council shall be comprised of 8-12 members, all of whom must be practicing Catholics and registered members of the parish, participants in the parish worship life and at least 18 years of age...
- C. Parishes may select youth representation in addition to the 8-12 adult members. Two youth representatives must be at least 14 years of age but not yet 18 at the time of selection. The youth representatives' parents must be registered members...
- D. Each year, the Pastor is to educate the parishioners regarding the duties of the Council and is to provide a means by which any parishioner may nominate Council members. The nominee must be given the opportunity to accept or decline the nomination by informing the Parish Pastoral Council chair. The names of eligible

nominees are then placed into a drawing and the pastor informs the parish community of the new membership.

E. Each Council member (except the youth representatives) may serve a 3-year term, renewable one time. Acceptance of an incomplete term does not count toward the 6-year maximum in continuous Council service. Following completion of 2 terms, a member may not be appointed to another term for at least 1 year, but may be of service in other parish councils and commissions. The terms are to be staggered to avoid unnecessary turnover in Council membership, with new terms beginning July 1 each year.

F. At least annually, the parish community is to be informed of the membership of the Council.

H. Any member may resign by providing a written resignation to the Pastor. At his discretion, a Pastor may remove a member.

I. Outside of ex officio membership, parish employees and their immediate families and the Pastor's family may not serve on the Council. Spouses, siblings, and parent/(adult) child may not serve on the Council simultaneously.

You may nominate yourself if you desire.
