

Eucharistic Revival: Parishioner Testimonies

In these three years of <u>National Eucharistic Revival</u>, here are some personal testimonies from Good Shepherd Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC's), who wrote these testimonies based on two reflections they read on the Eucharist, one by Saint Mother Teresa, and the other by Pope Francis:

"Sharing the gift of His sacrifice in [the] Eucharist allows for more of Jesus and less of ourselves"

"The Eucharist [gives] the spiritual energy needed to do the Lord's work in today's world"

"Celebrating the Eucharist brings Christ ever closer to us in our daily lives"

"[The Eucharist allows] Jesus Christ to be in us so we can go forward with His thoughts and actions"

"Our world is broken because so many people have left the church and the Eucharist. It is the most important prayer of our lives. It would be tragic if for some reason we never had Mass again. I hope the Eucharist continues to be the most important part of my life."

"I feel fortunate that I am able to distribute Communion and hope that I can become more Christ-like and become holy in His eyes"

"Allowing Christ to act within our deeds... what an amazing blessing it would be to serve our Lord in this manner [as an EMHC]... doing as Christ did is Christian holiness. Christ 'embodies" us... He has no eyes but our eyes"

"When we receive the Eucharist we are entering a covenant with God. We agree to His plans for us to advance His kingdom on earth."

"When you accept the Eucharist completely you are whole. When you are whole, you are happy within yourself so you don't need to seek out happiness on the outside from material things... God wants to have joy too. And He gets it when we give our whole selves to Him."

"We receive Christ in our body to become like Christ. Everything we do, say and act upon should be a reflection or representation of Christ, or be as Christ would do. This will make us ever more holy with God."

BEING AN EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER

For those who do not know me, my name is Delphine Czewski. I won't take up too much of your time but just wanted to tell you a little about being an extraordinary minister of the Eucharist. I have been an extraordinary minister and lector for over 40 years. Both ministries are very important and rewarding to me. To be able to be so close to our Lord in the sanctuary when reading the Word and ministering the Eucharist to the congregation is simply an honor. It is hard to imagine that a lay person would someday be able to touch the Body and Blood of our Lord when that privilege was only allotted to the ordained clergy.

For many years, I also ministered to the homebound which was a rewarding experience. They so looked forward to receiving our Lord as well as our little visits which were so much appreciated. I think the visits decreased some of their anxiety.

I would encourage anyone listening to seriously consider becoming an active minister in our parish and also maybe extending that ministry to the homebound. We are in much need of extraordinary ministers in our parish as well as lectors. I know many people who I approach regarding this subject often admit that they would be too anxious reading or ministering in front of everyone, a sort of stage fright you might call it. At first, it may seem a little intimidating but with God's help, it gets better. All it requires is preparation. And you will find that the other ministers are only too happy to accommodate when a fill in is required. Trust me when I say that you will be happy with your choice. I am and have been.

National Eucharistic Revival

Everyone is welcome to stay after Mass and pray for as long as you like before Jesus in the Eucharist, present in the tabernacle. When you leave church, please make sure the door locks behind you. As Jesus revealed to St. Margaret Mary, by spending time with Him in the Eucharist, we make reparation for

the many people who do not believe He is there or who are lukewarm or indifferent to His Eucharistic Presence. We console His Heart with our love.

Some Holy Humor, shared by a parishioner: A preacher visits an elderly woman from his congregation. As he sits on the couch, he notices a large bowl of almonds on the coffee table. "Mind if I have a few?" he asks. "No, not at all!" the woman replied. They chat for an hour and, as the preacher stands to leave, he realizes that instead of eating just a few almonds, he emptied the bowl. "I'm terribly sorry for eating all youralmonds. I really just meant to eat a few." "Oh, that's all right," the woman says. "Ever since I lost my teeth, all I can do is suck the chocolate off them."

The bulletin cover features a picture of the Sacred Heart because June is the month of the Sacred Heart. The Sacred Heart
Devotion to the physical Heart of Jesus is devotion to God, because God became a human being, with a human heart. We know God's love for us through Jesus' love for us. We know God's invisible love for us through Jesus' visible love for us, expressed in the visible symbol of His Sacred Heart.

There are many beautiful devotions in our Catholic tradition that help us to deepen our love for God and Mary. Many devotions are in honor of events in the life of Christ, such as His birth, death, and resurrection. However, devotion to the Sacred Heart is devotion to the love that is the reason for those events and made them possible.

In the image of the Sacred Heart we see a cross planted in the Heart reminding us of

His sacrifice for us. Love proves itself by sacrifice. Love is willing to suffer and die for the good of another. In this image, we see the wound caused by the soldier's lance that pierced His Heart. Jesus' love made Him willing to be wounded in His Heart. The image of the Sacred Heart carries a visible wound so that we might honor His invisible wounds, the wounds caused by our sin, indifference, lukewarmness, and lack of trust in Him.

The crown of thorns teaches us that Jesus continues to suffer today from these kinds of wounds. He is continually wounded by the irreverance and lukewarmness of Catholics towards Him in the Eucharist, the "Sacrament of love". Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, the seventeenth French nun who helped spread devotion to the Sacred Heart, "Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love. In return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrileges, and by the coldness and contempt they have for me in this Sacrament of love..."

St. Margaret Mary writes about the pain Jesus continues to suffer, "I saw this divine Heart as on a throne of flames, more brilliant than the sun and transparent as crystal. It had Its adorable wound and was encircled with a crown of thorns, which signified the pricks our sins caused Him."

Jesus also asked St. Margaret Mary, and indirectly, asks each of us, to make reparation for sin and lack of love through our own acts of love. By doing so, we

console His Heart and satisfy His thirst for love.

Speaking of fire, I'd like to tell you a true story. Once a man at a dinner with some guests told a story from his childhood. He said as a boy he was raised in Thailand. The Buddhist belief was that if you had scars, you may have been guilty of evil in a previous life. His mother had many scars on her face, and to him she was ugly. It was embarrasing to him and shameful.

One day his Aunt visited, and she noticed how he wasn't respecting his mother, how he was embarrassed by her. He told her, with all her scars, she must have done wicked things in a previous life. His Aunt said, "Did you ever think to ask how she got those scars?"

She explained, "When you were a baby, the hut caught on fire. Your mother came and knew that you might be inside. She started to go in but the people around said, don't go in, don't risk it, you'll die! She went in anyway, and covered your body with her own body, getting badly burned. That is why she has those scars."

The man then finished telling the dinner guests this story of his childhood. He stood up and said, "Now I'd like to introduce my mother to you." He pointed her out, saying, "Isn't she the most beautiful woman you've ever seen?"

Jesus' Sacred Heart is beautiful, because it still carries His wounds, His wounds of love for you and for me.


