OFFICE OF THE BISHOF

Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace and blessings to all of you. As many of you know, for the past three years, I have been traveling across the diocese to pray a Holy Hour for Vocations in your parishes. I have been inspired by the number of people who have joined me for Eucharistic Adoration twice a month. I am confident that it will bear fruit.

But there is more that we can do and must do. Each of you play an important part in the ministry of vocations. Vocation work is the ministry of all the baptized. I am asking that you take your role in the work of vocations seriously. Families and local parish communities are the seedbeds for priestly and religious vocations. They are in your families and parish communities. The Lord has created each of us for some definite purpose. Therefore, God has not abandoned his Church and will certainly not leave us in this time of need. But we must all play our role in this work of the Church. "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38). The priesthood is essential for the Sacramental life of the Church. Without the priesthood, there would be no Eucharist, the Mass, and there would be no one to hear our Confessions, reconciling us sinners with our Father.

As Director of Vocations, Fr. Andy LaFramboise is leading us into the next phase of the implementation of our diocesan vocation plan. Our theme is "Beg! Form! Call!" The goal for this plan is 20 seminarians by 2030. With only four men currently in formation, this is a challenging goal but "nothing is impossible for God" (Luke 1:37). As part of this plan, we want to engage the assistance of our Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, asking her to intercede on our behalf for this important intention. Her role is to bring our intentions before the "Throne of Grace."

Beginning the first weekend of August, I am encouraging all parishes in the diocese to begin praying the *Memorare* for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and the religious life. This is a short and powerful prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary, asking for her intercession and protection. This prayer can be prayed before Mass begins or after the final blessing. I also encourage you to pray the *Memorare* during parish meetings or other gathering. Families are encouraged to pray it daily in their homes. Prayer cards have been created for all of you. Please make the *Memorare* for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and the religious life a part of your daily prayer life. Let us storm heaven with our prayers, entrusting this intention to our Blessed Mother. She will not let us down.

Take positive action in your parishes by asking your pastor how you can get involved in vocation ministry and the Diocesan 3-Point Plan for Vocations. Fr. Andy and I need your help in creating a positive climate for vocations in your parishes. "It takes a village to raise a child" is a well-known proverb. It takes a parish to raise up men and women who will answer the call from the Lord to the priesthood and consecrated life. All of us actively engaged in vocation ministry, each doing our own part, will bear great fruit for the Diocese of Saginaw.



Answering the Call to Vocations in the Diocese of Saginaw



Seminarian Charles Warner

Charles Warner, a Mid-Michigan native, had a successful career working for the Federal Drug Administration in Washington, DC for several years. But he had a lingering feeling that something was missing in his life and that he was being called to something more. "That 'more' led me on a path towards God," Charles recounts.


As a life-long Catholic, Charles has deep-rooted memories of growing up in a faith-based family, including a father who is a permanent Deacon and numerous aunts and uncles with religious vocations. Despite a strong upbringing in the Catholic Church and an ongoing commitment to prayer and daily Mass, Charles didn't seriously consider the priesthood until he let go of his pre-conceived notions of what his life *should* look like. He opened his heart to what God might have in store for him.

Charles began his journey of discernment in 2020 at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. He said that it was during this process that he came to understand that what he was longing for was God himself, and true fulfillment has come from answering God's call.

Currently, Charles is studying theology in Rome, Italy, and has just finished his second year at the Pontifical North American College. The strong Catholic identity in Italy has inspired him to "see [his] life in the grander scale of salvation history." Charles notes that continuing his discernment journey in Italy has led to profound spiritual growth.

Fr. Andy LaFramboise just recently celebrated his ten-year anniversary of the priesthood, and currently serves as the pastor at St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Reese and St. Frances Cabrini in Vassar.

Fr. Andy initially began discerning his vocation during his teenage years, and credits World Youth Day 2002 in Toronto as a major point of inspiration. Seeing young believers from around the world come together, as well as being in the presence of St. John Paul II "moved me to put the Lord first in my life," recounts Fr. Andy.

When John Paul II died in 2005, Fr. Andy felt further moved to investigate his own vocation. "One person's 'yes' can cause ripples throughout the world," he said.

After studying at Sacred Heart Seminary, Fr. Andy was ordained in 2014. However, he notes that there is still a great need for vocations in the Diocese of Saginaw. "It can be hard to respond to God's call in our busy world," Fr. Andy states, "but God has placed a unique call in everyone's life."

As Vocation Director for the Diocese of Saginaw, Fr. Andy is helping to implement a three-step call to action to increase vocations: beg, form, call. This initiative brings parishes together in prayer while investing in faith formation and youth vocation teams, creating a community of support and discernment for those questioning their own callings.

"We all have a role in this as Catholics," Fr. Andy states. "It's not something you have to do on your own."

"Be not afraid to seriously discern. Don't be afraid to surrender your life to Jesus."


