

Blessed Advent!

Dear Disciple on Mission (see "Mission" above), One of the best ways to celebrate Advent is to fast. Advent is a penitential season like Lent, but less so. In the Didache, a

document from the first century, we see the first Christians fasting on Wednesdays and Fridays.

This Advent, consider some kind of fast/self-denial (from social media, snacks, sweets, skip a meal or eat less, condiments, salt and pepper, TV, getting the last word, etc.) for at least these two days each week, if not the entire Advent! Fasting makes our heart BIGGER, like the Grinch's, to receive MORE love from God this Christmas! First we fast, then we feast. Offer your fast for a certain intention by praying, "Jesus, this is for souls, for the conversion of X, for an end to war, etc."

Another way to start Advent is to meditate on

this reflection by Sister Marie Veritas, SV (Sisters of Life based in NYC):

"We can often be tempted to measure our worth by how useful we are or how we feel about ourselves. And when we fail or we feel poorly, we become overwhelmed with discouragement. But our achievements, emotions, and thoughts about ourselves, as subjective and transitory realities, do not determine our worth. Your identity is grounded in the firmness of eternal Love, Who never stops speaking over you the truth, "You are very good" (cf. Gen 1:31). He doesn't measure your worth; He Who gives Himself to you on the Cross and in the Eucharist is the measure of your worth.

"You are the goal of God's Heart. "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in Himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in His own blessed life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1). God did not create you in order to use you, for He is totally sufficient in Himself. He created you out of love as a unique and unrepeatable reflection of His glory, simply because He desires you to be filled with His love and to seek, praise, know, and love Him. He takes joy in you - you, specifically. And He came to save you out of love. You are the reason the Second Person of the Holy Trinity became man, walked the hills of Galilee, preached, healed, was crucified, died, rose, and stays with you in His Spirit. Intentionally and carefully fashioned in His image, you are not just Important to His Heart; you are an icon of Him Who is.

"The human person is not made to be used. Use is proper to an object: I play music on a violin, or swim in a pool, or enjoy chocolate cake. It's right to use things. But as a living image of the living God, a person is never to be used as a means to an end. You are an end in yourself, You're not just something; you're someone, with your own free will and destiny. Not even God uses you to gain an end. He so reverences your dignity and freedom that He invites and proposes, but He never forces or imposes. When the saints speak of God using them, what they mean is that they have freely given God permission to involve their hearts,

minds, bodies, circumstances, strengths, weakness, victories, and even their sins and setbacks in His marvelous designs.

"God wants a free response to His love, because love, as the "unification of persons" and willing the good of the other, never comes at the expense of someone else (Karol Wojtyla, Love and Responsibility). The ultimate good of the other means the flourishing of the person - body, mind, and soul. I'm not loving someone if I'm using or leading him or her to sin, even if it is pleasurable or productive. "The value of the person is always greater than the value of pleasure" (ibid.).

"Use hurts everyone involved. Use binds us to someone as property, which is below our dignity. 'If I treat someone else as a means and a tool in relation to myself I cannot help regarding myself in the same light' (ibid.). The only proper response to you is love; anything less is not worthy of you. We can spend our whole lives racing around ourselves trying to find ourselves, when Jesus invites us: 'Let yourself be found. Let Me show you who you are. Let Me show you the love for which you're made and the love you are capable of giving.' We are not His slaves, but His beloved sons and daughters. Let's live free. Let's allow ourselves to be loved and to love with His love."

Do we want Good Shepherd to become known as a WELCOMING PARISH?

Bishop's vision is that every parish develops "radical hospitality." Visitors and young families with kids must feel welcome at Mass and encounter Christ in us by how we speak to them and look at them. A few times, after families with young children have joined us for Mass, they have told me they felt not welcomed by the way some people looked at them or treated them, especially if their kids were loud. Isn't that heartbreaking? I offer everyone, including myself, these thoughts: If you see a parent with a loud child:

- -pray for the parents
- -introduce yourself to them and ask where they're from, etc.
- -thank them for bringing their kids to Mass
- -if you once brought children to Mass,

encourage them by telling them you know what it's like to bring children to Mass!
-avoid giving advice

For <u>any visitor</u>, introduce yourself to them, invite them to an upcoming community or parish event, etc. Eventually, the Holy Spirit may lead you to ask them out to brunch or invite them to your home for a meal!


