



I invite you to join fellow parishioners in saving souls. Join us for one of our daily Masses at least once a week. Why go to daily Mass? The Mass brings us to the Lord's Supper and to Calvary. We're not only at the table of the Lord; we're also at the altar of the Cross. Our presence at the foot of the Cross, joining Mary and St. John, helps to win graces of conversion for sinners who are on the road to hell. It also wins graces of conversion for ourselves, since we ALL need "daily conversion" to the Gospel.

This Thanksgiving, consider asking each family member to express out loud one thing they're thankful for. It's a tradition I grew up with. The Gospel inspired me to share with you what I'm thankful to Jesus for right now:

- Seeing God working in the hearts of parishioners in various ways every day. For example, in their willingness to serve our parish and community. Many are involved in local organizations that serve such as the Lions Club, the Knights of Columbus, the Christian Mothers, etc.
- 2. I'm grateful to God for the parishioners and others in the Mats for the Homeless ministry that meets Tuesday mornings in the Parish Center to make mats out of grocery bags. Parishioners prepare a lunch each Tuesday that is always delicious.
- 3. I'm grateful to God for the new Charismatic Prayer Group that meets 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays of the month to praise God in song, read scripture, and share how the Lord is working in their lives and speaking to them through Scripture, etc. Sometimes they go for dinner afterwards!
- I'm grateful to God for the chance to get to know the five new Indian priests in our vicariate. Last night I invited them to dinner at Charmont, and Deacon David joined us.
- 5. I'm grateful to God for our Lori Uhl, our outgoing secretary, retiring for personal reasons. She has served our parish as secretary for a few years and contributed many talents and tireless dedication to parish needs, including organizing files, helping with HR, revising processes to be more efficient, special projects, greeting callers and visitors with Christ-like joy and friendliness, advising the pastor with wise words and helping him to be more fruitful and effective and to avoid mistakes; currently, she training new staff. This is only a fraction of what she has done for our parish and for me. She will be truly missed; however, we are blessed that she'll be on call for special projects.
- 6. I'm grateful to God for our incoming secretary, Judy Booms. She is training under Lori and doing a good job!
- 7. I'm grateful to God for Maria Deer, our former Bookkeeper, for Kate Winkel, our new Bookkeeper, and for Diana Briolat, our former Office Assistant, transitioning to "on call" status. I'll comment more on these Office Team members in the next bulletin.

8. Of course, I'm grateful to God for all of our staff members and all their behind-the-scenes work. Please pray for them!

Prayer that a friend sent me; pray with me: "I pray for hope and a sense of purpose, to surrender fully to the Lord, that He would use me as a vessel of the Holy Spirit (no matter the circumstances) (Be it done unto me according to Thy word), that my heart is opened to love the Lord God with a sincere and genuine love such that He is truly the center of my life (mind, words, heart)... AMEN!"
