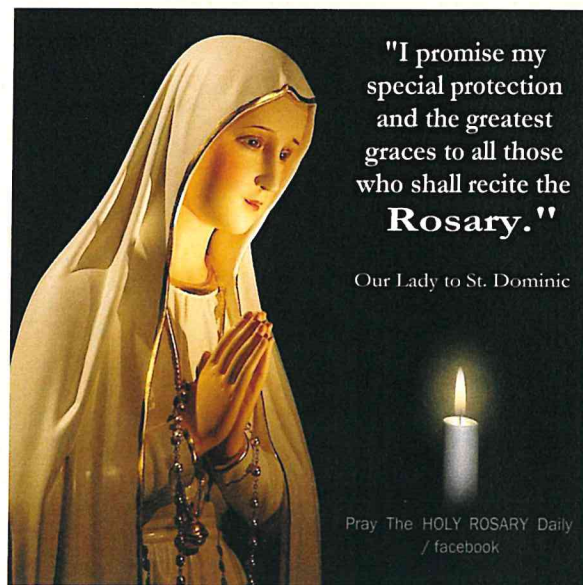

New Tabernacle Veils: did you know many tabernacles have a curtain rod for a veil on the inside? I asked a parishioner to create new veils for some of our tabernacles. Lord Jesus, please reward her in this life and the next! Veils are used to cover things/people that are holy. That's why the veil was used in the Jewish Temple's Holy of Holies; that's why some priests choose to veil the chalice which represents Christ; that's why the Bride traditionally uses a veil; that's why people are called to practice modesty and veil themselves with clothing since the body is holy and should not be objectified, etc. The tabernacle veil fosters greater reverence for the Blessed Sacrament by reminding us that the Eucharist is the Real, Personal Presence of Jesus!


