Dear Disciple, Blessed Advent!

I'm thrilled to have had so many baptisms lately at our parish! Did you know, "Be fruitful and multiply" is the first commandment in the bible? God desires to populate heaven through married couples. God calls couples to be "open to life", including praying about the possibility of adoption or foster care. One of the greatest gifts parents can give their child is another sibling, Lord willing.

To help us all gain a "biblical worldview" and to be transformed by the Gospel, I'm printing last weekend's homily from our diocesan ADVENT RETREAT. Even if you heard me preach one version of it, I'm asking you to read this version. Every time I preach, the homily changes, hopefully guided by the Holy Spirit. So, there may be points in this version you haven't heard before, or would benefit from hearing again:

ADVENT RETREAT HOMILY #3: CAPTURED

Today we continue our Advent Retreat with the whole diocese. The four topics we'll cover are CREATED, CAPTURED, RESCUED, RESPONSE. My dream is that EVERYONE in this church will memorize these four ANSWERS, and the four QUESTIONS that these words answer. My dream is that all of us will practice sharing these four questions and answers with our believing family members and friends, to practice for the times the Lord will give us opportunities to share them with our unbelieving family and friends! These four words sum up the Gospel, the life changing, mind changing, heart changing... news of the Gospel

The topic today is CAPTURED. It answers the question, *Why is the world so messed up?* The answer is that we are CAPTURED.

Last week the word was CREATED. It answers the question, Why is there something rather than nothing? Because we are CREATED by a loving Creator. Because the Creator is God, and God is love. Love always gives itself away. God created you and me to share His love with us. The entire universe is a huge gift to us, to show us His love, and to teach us about His beauty and majesty and glory. Did you know that He would've created the entire universe even if you were the only person He created?

My brother-in-law is into astrophotography and posting incredible pictures of galaxies, nebulae, etc. But the masterpiece of God's creation isn't any galaxy; it's you; it's me! Every person is God's masterpiece, even if they were born with developmental disabilities (which God only permits, as a consequence of sin just like all disease, but will fix in the next life!

So, back to our question for today. Why is the world so messed up? What the hell happened? Hell happened. Hell, the devil and his servants, were cast upon the earth by St Michael and his army. The Bible says a third of the angels, including Lucifer, rebelled against God, and there was a war in heaven, and the other two thirds of the angels cast the devil out of heaven to earth. There, the devil captured, CAPTURED humanity, Adam, Eve, and all their descendants. Captured, enslaved, and oppressed. The devil cannot attack God directly, so God CAPTURED God's masterpiece, His most beloved creature.

This is the bad news. To understand how GOOD the good news really is, that it's more than good, but transforming, life changing and soul-saving, first we have to understand how bad the bad news is. It is worse than any nightmare, or any horror movie. The St Michael prayer reminds us of the bad news, but also the good news at the same time. Look at their mission in the last line: to "prowl the world seeking the ruin of souls."

We see the influence of the devil everywhere. First, we see his influence in the fact of death. Death wasn't part of God's plan. Death entered the world because of the "envy of the devil" (Wisdom 2:24). He was envious of Adam and Eve. Envy is more than jealousy; envy wants to harm the one who has something we don't have. Out of envy, He led Adam and Eve into the original sin, and the consequences of sin is DEATH; physical and spiritual death. "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23)

How do we "sniff the sulfur", as C.S. Lewis says? How can we become aware of the influence and strategies of the devil? How do

we protect ourselves from his wickedness and snares? We have to watch the GAME FILM. I asked the athletic director at Ubly Schools, Brandon Sorenson, if they ever watch game film of the other team to learn the other team's strategies. He said yes for both basketball and football.

The bible is our GAME FILM; it teaches us the strategies of the devil. My grandpa sometimes reminded us, with a smile, that you can find every kind of sin in the bible!

The enemy's strategies are accusation, division, lies, violence, theft, and more. The names of the devil in the bible teach us about his strategies:

- The name <u>Tempter</u> teaches us that he's always trying to tempt us to sin, just as He tempted Adam and Eve, and tempted Jesus in the desert. Whenever we give in to temptation, or become addicted, we are CAPTURED by the spirit of sin.
- The name <u>Satan</u> means accuser. He's always trying to get us to accuse others, blame others, or to accuse ourselves in a harmful way, to CAPTURE us.
- The name <u>Devil</u> means divider. Wherever there is harmful division, harmful anger, the devil is lurking. Whenever we divide others, we are CAPTURED by the spirit of division.
- Jesus calls him <u>Father of Lies</u> to teach us that his weapon is lies: about God, about others, about ourselves. His primary, most damaging lie is that God is not our loving Father. Another one is that God could never forgive us. Whenever we lie, we are CAPTURED by the spirit of lying.
- Jesus also calls him <u>Thief</u>; He steals our HOPE and leads us to despair.

And Jesus calls him <u>Murderer</u>: many people in the US are CAPTURED by the spirit of violence. I was in the Ubly Sleeper Library the other day, but didn't see the cute cat anywhere that day, sadly. I was browsing some of the

new release novels. Here are some of the books: Legacy of Blood; Haunted; Murder Island, etc. Why do we have books, TV shows, movies, especially horror movies, that glorify violence? That "glorify" it in the sense of gratuitous, unnecessary violence, showing violence for the sake of violence? Some of us are CAPTURED by a dark desire towards dark forms of entertainment. And MUCH more seriously, why are newspaper headlines full of real violence, murder and war?

Our country is CAPTURED by the spirit of despair. Look at statistics about the US. Since 1999, suicide rates have increased 30% to 40% in rural areas. From 1999 to 2016, deaths from cirrhosis of the liver and alcoholism jumped up by 65%. The US consumes 80% of the entire world's opioids!

Why is this? Many in our country have abandoned the biblical worldview our country was founded upon. Many don't believe in the devil. When tragedies happen such as school shootings, or terrorism, or when they see how addiction rates are rising, etc., people might say, how could this happen? It doesn't make sense! It must be mental illness, etc. But do they even consider the possibility of unseen, dark spirits?

Without a biblical worldview, without knowing we are all CAPTURED, we cannot make sense of the evil in the world. The bible shows us that there is an enemy, and it's not any human person. The enemy is the enemy. Not your sibling, your boss, your spouse, your whoever. The enemy is trying to make us fight each other instead of him.

Did you know that the enemy is involved with every sin, because every sin involves a lie or half-truth? The bible shows us that evil is a result of a combination of broken human nature (broken by original sin which gives us "concupiscence", the tendency to sin), possibly mental or brain disorders, AND the influence of the devil, the spirit of accusation, division, lying, violence, despair, etc.

Next week, we'll see how God sent His Son Jesus Christ to invade this world, this enemy-occupied territory. Christmas is D-DAY for the universe, for the human race. The Savior has invaded and begun to reign and to get God's world back. The Kingdom of GOD and of LIGHT has invaded the kingdom of the "ruler of this world", as Jesus calls the devil. Jesus, like King David, is a warrior king!

How is Jesus fighting and conquering right now in our midst? Remember what Jesus said to Peter about the gates of hell? "The gates of hell will not prevail against the church", meaning the Church will defeat the gates or powers of hell. Hell is UNDER SIEGE by Jesus and His Body, the Church. Jesus began His RESCUE Mission. And that's the topic for next weekend.

On the back of the hymnal is the St. Michael prayer. This should be memorized by every Christian and prayed often. I pray it when I'm tempted; I pray it multiple times a day. Or sometimes I pray this prayer when I see the devil attacking others. Next time you see war or violence or abortion on the news, pray this prayer for an end to that violence. God sends St. Michael to defend us! Please join me in praying it right now, for someone in your family or our parish who is clearly under attack: St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray. To thou O Prince of the heavenly host by the power of God thrust into hell Satan and all evil spirits who prowl throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen."




