Right to Life-Upcoming House Bills

Please contact your legislators, Senator Dan Lauwers and Rep. Greg Alexander, to vote No on these 2 bills. House Bill (HB) 6068 will allow sex education classes to teach children where and how to obtain an abortion. and will require teaching about sexual orientation, gender expression, and various gender relationships. HB 6077 and Senate Bill 1082 would seek to limit choices presented to a woman experiencing an unplanned pregnancy, so abortion seems the only option. Dear Disciple, Blessed Advent!

To help us all gain a “biblical worldview” and to be transformed by the Gospel, I’m printing last weekend’s homily from our diocesan ADVENT RETREAT. Even if you heard me preach one version of it, I’m asking you to read this version. Every time I preach, the homily changes, hopefully guided by the Holy Spirit. You might find something you haven’t heard before:

ADVENT RETREAT HOMILY #4: RESCUED

Today we continue our Diocesan Advent retreat: What’s the GOOD NEWS? It’s the bishop’s hope, and my hope, that everyone here will remember how to share the good news in four words: **CREATED, CAPTURED, RESCUED, and RESPONSE**. These four words answer four BIG Questions.

Let’s review **CREATED**. It answers the BIG question, **Why is there something rather than nothing?** Because it was **CREATED**, by a Creator of love. *Pray with me: Heavenly Father, Almighty Creator, give me the gift of wonder at Your creation, especially the masterpiece*

of your creation, the human person! Help me to believe that my neighbor is God’s masterpiece, and I am God’s masterpiece.

Advent and Christmas are seasons of wonder at God’s CREATION, including the many gifts God will give US, starting with His Son Jesus, and also, to celebrate Jesus, we’ll have great food, Christmas cookies, card games, watching the Lions play, classic movies like *It’s A Wonderful Life* or *The Sound of Music*. These are all gifts from a God Who IS LOVE wants to share His love with us. All of creation is His love letter to us. Well, maybe not mosquitoes. Just kidding. Even mosquitoes exist because of love!

The next word is CAPTURED, which answers the question, **Why is the world so messed up?** Hell happened. Hell **CAPTURED** us. We are captured by our TRUE enemies, not our neighbor, not our boss, not any politician, but sin, death, and the devil. Pray with me: *Heavenly Father, please allow me to see how sin captures me. Give me the gift of holy despair, to give up ALL HOPE of rescuing myself by my deeds and efforts. May this Holy Despair help me feel... the need... for a Savior. Amen!*

The world is messed up because of the envy of the devil. He led our first parents into sin and death. If someone doesn’t believe in the devil, they should be reminded that Jesus spoke about the devil many times, and taught us the Our Father, which ends, “deliver us from the evil one” the word for Evil can also be translated “Evil one.” “Deliver us from the Evil One!” Jesus wants us to remember every day that there’s an Evil One trying to capture our souls for eternal separation from God!

We are born CAPTURED. Baptism is Jesus first rescuing us. But we NEED CONTINUED RESCUING. Every time we fall into sin, Gossip, lust, revenge, unforgiveness, we are CAPTURED by sin. The Bible is our “GAME FILM”. It teaches us the strategies of our enemy. His MAIN strategy is to sell us the “BIG LIE”: that God is NOT our loving Father.

This brings us to our question for today, **What has God done about it?** The word **RESCUED** answers this question.

Do you like superheroes? I've always enjoyed superhero movies myself. Did you ever notice the similarities between Superman and Jesus? Just as Moses and David are non-fictional types or figures of Christ, Superman and some other superheroes are fictional types of Christ: Superman came from a different world, the planet Krypton. Jesus came from... heaven. Superman, Kal-El, was sent by his father, Jor-El. Jesus is El, which means God, was sent from His Father. Superman first appeared on Earth as a baby and was adopted by Pa & Ma Kent. Jesus also came to earth as a baby via Mary, adopted by Joseph.

Superman is a RESCUER, but only physical rescuing, like the boy who fell into Niagara Falls, or humanity threatened to be destroyed by evil characters like Lex Luthor. The name Jesus literally means in Hebrew, "God Saves", He rescues us both physically AND spiritually. He rescues us from the worst fate possible: to be eternally separated from God because of sin.

For centuries, God had been promising to send a Rescuer. The prophets had told the Israelites that God saw how they were CAPTURED by sin, death, and the devil and could not rescue themselves. God said, "I MYSELF will rescue you."

Only about a hundred years before the first Christmas, God made this promise in the book of Wisdom, *"For when peaceful stillness (think "Silent Night")... For when peaceful stillness encompassed everything and the night in its swift course was half spent, your all-powerful word... your all... powerful... word leapt from heaven's royal throne into the doomed land, a fierce warrior!"* Next time you look at a nativity scene, and see that cute baby, remember that THAT baby is a fierce warrior!

Imagine being the victim of a kidnapping. You are kidnapped and a bag is put over your head, and you are flown to another country. When the kidnapper takes the bag off your head, you find yourself inside a dark and dirty prison cell. He chains you to the wall, and stands guard outside the door constantly. You think, maybe the FBI will get me out of here! Maybe our government will negotiate a hostage exchange! But, many, many years pass, you pray countless prayers, cry a river of tears, and lose all hope of being

rescued.

One night, in the dark, you see a strange man in your cell. He gently breaks the shackles off your wrists. He lifts you to your feet, and leads you towards the door. You remember that the kidnapper is right outside your door! As you step into the hallway, your rescuer points to the kidnapper. He is lying on the floor, tied up and gagged, unable to move or speak. Your rescuer says to you, "I took care of him. Let's go!" Then, He takes you by the hand out of the prison, into the sunshine, and flies you home to your family. You... have... been... **RESCUED!**

How did Jesus rescue us? By disguise, like an "ambush predator", like a trapdoor spider. Jesus in the manger is in disguise. The devil would never have guessed that God would humble Himself to become a baby. He'd never have guessed God would allow Himself to be nailed to a cross. Jesus seems helpless, but He's in control. He seems the victim, but Satan is the real victim, and Jesus the aggressor. He seems like He's doing nothing, but He's tying up our enemies!

But JESUS IS NOT DONE RESCUING US, not done tying up the enemy in our lives! We're not rescued completely until we're safely home in heaven! In baptism, he transfers us from the kingdom of darkness to His kingdom. At the beginning of Mass, in the penitential rite, He forgives our venial sins. In the Liturgy of the Word, He rescues us from the lies of the enemy through the truths of Scriptures. Every time we receive Holy Communion, assuming we are in a state of grace and not conscious of any mortal sins, Jesus strengthens us. When we regularly go to confession, every few weeks, He rescues us from both venial and mortal sins, and gradually rescues us with each repeated confession, from our addictions and attachments to sin.

Father, thank you for sending Jesus to rescue me from captivity. Thank you for continually rescuing from sin, death, and the devil through the Mass, the Word, and Confession. Help me to know that in YOUR eyes, I'm worth dying for. Amen!


