Dear Disciple, Happy Lord's Day!

We're sad the Lions lost. What if the coach was asked, what's your goal? And he said, "to win a few games." He would be fired, right? He better say, "to win the super bowl!!" What's the goal of the Christian? TO SAVE SOULS, first his own and then

others, by leading them to the Savior, Jesus Christ. In other words, to cooperate with Jesus in His ongoing mission of saving souls. What is the mission of this and every parish? TO SAVE SOULS. What is the reason we repair our churches? TO SAVE SOULS. What is faith formation, bible study, and everything we do in our parish for? TO SAVE SOULS. Every soul within our parish boundaries was created for heaven. Will we help them get there in every way we can? Will we fulfil the mission Jesus gives us?

Are you praying daily for your pastor and bishop? I'm doing my best to save souls, but I often make mistakes. It's humiliating how often I do. If you ask me to do something, and I agree, or at least say, "I'll pray about it," and I don't put it in my phone, then please ask me to, or I will likely forget.

As a pastor, I'm required to get involved in, or at least be aware of, almost everything going on in our parish, and to gain a basic understanding of things I never imagined I would need to know. A priest is an expert in the <u>spiritual life</u> and <u>evangelization</u> and <u>catechesis</u>, and thank God is NOT required to become an expert in plumbing, finances, spreadsheets, window repair, cemeteries, etc. Thank God for all the parishioners and staff who are realizing their call to be co-responsible for this parish, besides me. It is your parish. Do you feel a sense of ownership and responsibility for it? Do you want to help? Do you want to get involved?

There are so many things on my mind all the time, and so I never skip my day off for mental, physical, and spiritual health. The devil tempts me to get frustrated and discouraged and to give up, but I won't give up with the grace of God which comes from my prayer life AND your prayers for me.

I don't say these things because I want pity, but I do want, and *desperately need*, your prayers. The devil has a large target in my back, because I'm a captain

in the spiritual battle for souls, and you are the foot soldiers. The bishop is the general, so pray for both him and me daily, I beg you. Please start praying for us daily if you are not already. Thank you!

I know that no act of love is a waste in His kingdom. My favorite verse is, "God works ALL things to the good for those who love Him" (Romans 8:28). Therefore, NO act of love is without eternal consequences and rewards. When I make a mistake, I pray, "Jesus bring a greater good out of that!"




