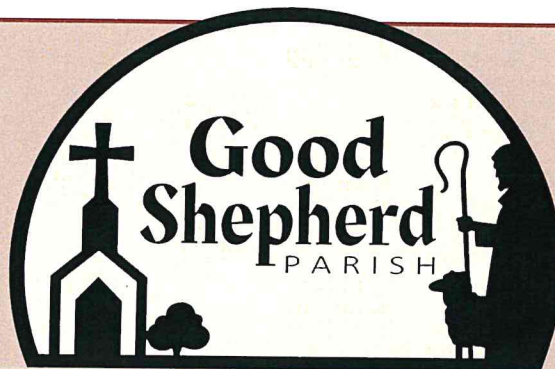

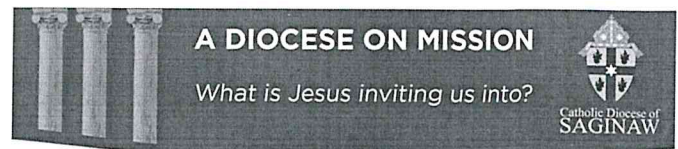
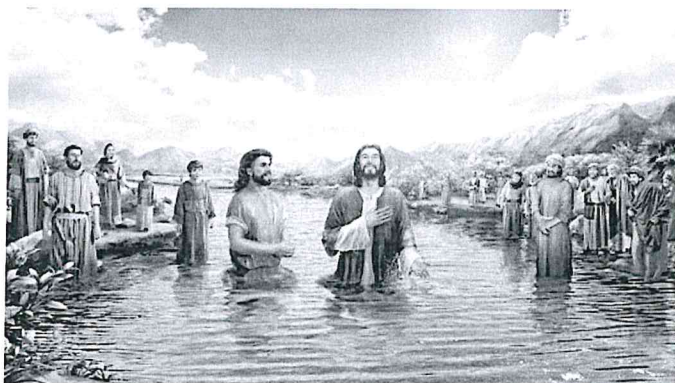

Dear Disciple, Blessed Feast Day!

THANK you for the many Christmas cards, gifts, cookies, breads, and fruitcake. I enjoy fruitcake! Does that mean I am one? :)

A classic book, that has formed countless saints, is called the Imitation of Christ. I found some quotes related to the good news- CCRR- CREATED, CAPTURED, RESCUED, RESPONSE:

Related to CREATED (Why is there something rather than nothing?):

"The wise lover does not consider so much the lover's gift as the giver's love. He pays more attention to the giver's affection than to the gift's value, and he places less value on all gifts than he does on the beloved. The noble lover is not satisfied with the gift, but he desires me [God] above all gifts."

Related to CAPTURED (Why is the world so messed up?):

"Know that the old enemy strives in every way he can to block your doing good and to keep you from your religious devotions: from honoring the saints, from devoutly remembering my Passion, from usefully recalling your sins, from keeping watch over your heart, and from firmly resolving to advance in virtue. He whispers evil thoughts into your ears, so that he may wear you out and frighten you, and so that he may pull you from prayer and reading. Humble confession offends him, and if he could, he would prevent you from receiving Holy Communion."

"Do not believe him or pay attention to him, even though he has often set his traps to ensnare you. Throw it right back at him when he suggests foul and wicked things to you! Say to him, "Get out of here, foul spirit; shame on

you, miserable wretch! You are filthy to utter such things in my ears! Get away from me, you disgusting creature!..." ...to be continued next week...

St. John Stained Glass Repair

Dear Disciple of Jesus Christ,

Merry Christmas! (Season ends Jan. 12) The stained glass in all four of our churches windows were evaluated by Willet Hauser, the company the diocesan Building Commission chose for us. The work required is of a special nature requiring expert professional service. Our St. John Church stained glass windows needed maintenance more urgently than the other churches to prevent further deterioration.

We received multiple quotes from the company. The first quote was \$133,736 for complete overhaul. Some members of Finance Council and I met with the company rep to examine the windows and ask about a lower quote; he offered an alternate quote for minimum maintenance required: \$36,060. The diocese approved this project and we are moving forward.

How are we paying? We paid the down payment of \$9,015.00 from our Building Fund Savings account; we have \$21,589.66 remaining. Thanks be to God we did receive a donation of \$4000 to be used for stained glass window repair, in memory of Dale Gornowicz, from his family.

To prevent our Building Fund from being depleted, in case of unforeseen building costs that may arise, you are invited to pray about donating the amount needed to repair one window, approximately \$1526.67 [\$36,060 - \$4000 donation = \$32,060 divided by 21 windows (total # of windows that need repair) = \$1526.67 per window]. Or donate any amount by using the "Building Fund" envelope in your packets; all donations made with these envelopes will go towards St. John Windows until the project is fully funded, or until otherwise decided by parish leadership.

Perhaps you might wish to donate in memory of one of the families that originally purchased these windows. [not every window needs repair]. Thank you for your past and future financial stewardship of our parish!
