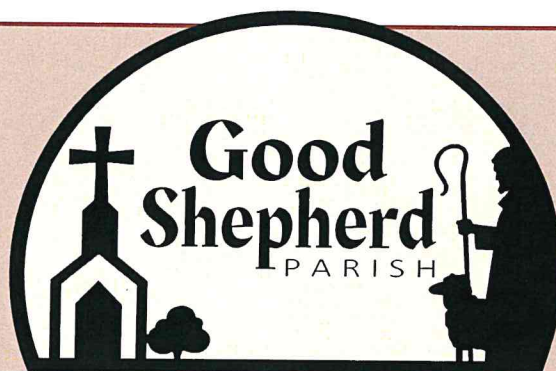



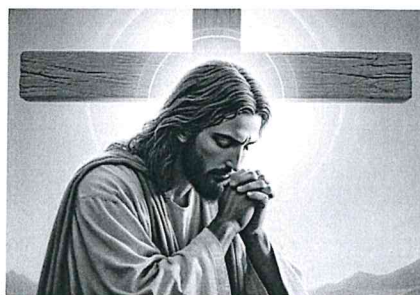

Here are excerpts from The Imitation of Christ, by Thomas A Kempis, related to the Good News:

Related to RESCUED (What has God done about it?):

“...[continued] You shall have no part of me, but Jesus will be with me as a courageous warrior, and you will stand confounded!...”

Related to RESPONSE (“How will I respond to God's invitation to rescue me?”)

“...[continued] I would rather die and endure any pain than give in to you! Be quiet and keep still! I shall hear no more of you, though you continue to molest me! The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? Though an entire army may encamp against me, my heart shall not be afraid! The Lord is my helper and my redeemer!” Fight bravely, and if you sometimes fall through weakness, rise up again with greater strength than before, sure of my greater grace.
