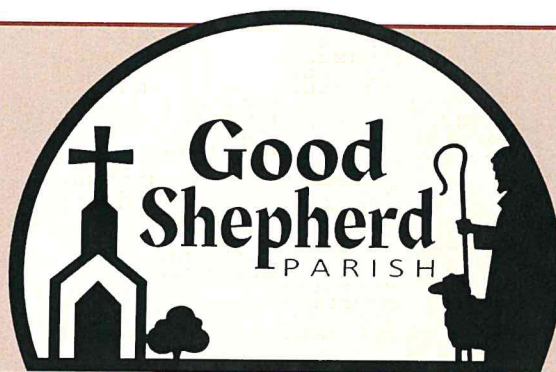

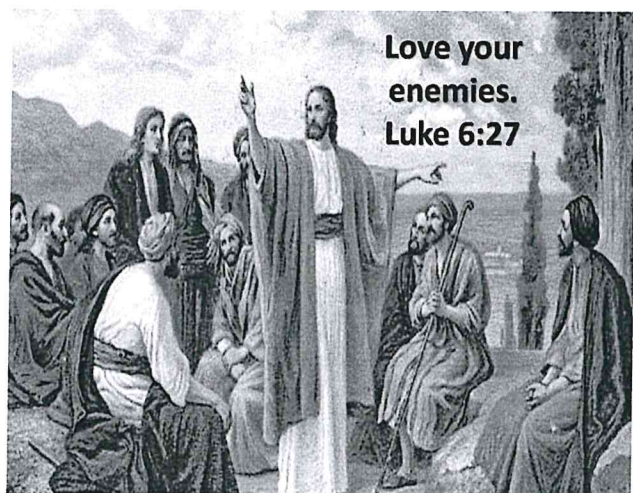

Kick-Off of Parish Goals!

Goal 2: Every parishioner will invite at least one person to Mass annually by December 2025.

Community Priority:

Goal 1: At least 30 people become actively engaged members of a small discipleship group by March 2026.

Goal 2: All newly registered parishioners and new disciples who have been baptized or received into the Catholic Church at Easter will be formally welcomed by March 2026.

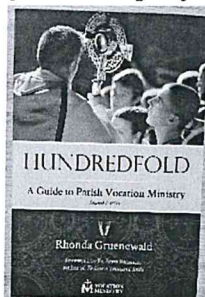
February Invitation

February is the Month of the Holy Family. How do you make your home a “domestic church”? Do you have a prayer corner? Do you have crucifixes, images of Jesus, Mary, and the saints? If you need a crucifix, let me know, I have extras. Having them in your home reminds you of Jesus’ sacrifice and personal love for you.

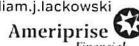
