Fellow parishioner,

Today, we want to talk to you about one simple but life-changing word: YES.

Through Catholic Leadership Institute and with our Parish envisioning team, we have set six bold goals—goals with **strong timelines** to be completed by early 2026. (Goals & Plans listed on the back of the page)

These goals call us to rise beyond simply sitting in these pews—they invite us to step forward in faith, to say Yes. God is calling YOU—will you answer?

So today, we invite you: As we gather in worship this mass, take a moment to pray and ask God what He is stirring in your heart—calling you to play a special role in helping our parish fulfill its mission.

<u>Goal #1:</u> At least 30 people become actively engaged members of a small discipleship group by March 2026.

<u>Plan #1:</u> We are showing "The Chosen" series (Season 1) each week during Lent starting the week of March 9 in various small in-home groups. There are sign-up sheets for people to choose the time/area that works best for them/
