

Dear Disciple, Happy Lent!

Traditionally Catholics abstained from meat and meat byproducts, like eggs, during Lent but today in the US, abstinence is defined as not eating meat (so byproducts are allowed). Abstinence is only required on Ash Wed. and Fridays in Lent, for "members of the Latin Catholic Church (most Catholics in the US are Latin Catholics) from age 14 onwards." (USCCB.org)

This sacrifice shouldn't be thought of as just a "rule", but as a loving share in Jesus' sacrifice in His honor. This sacrifice, like any suffering, shouldn't be wasted (St. JPII). It can be offered to Jesus with a short prayer of thanksgiving to Him for His sacrifice. Besides thanking Him, we can offer the sacrifice for a specific intention, such as, for the conversion or healing of a loved one. By our humble obedience to Mother Church, the Church Jesus promised to speak and govern through, we are counteracting the prideful disobedience of the devil. Also, we make "reparation" for our own sin and disobedience.
