



Dear Disciple, Happy Lord's Day!

July 21 begins National NFP (Natural Family Planning) Awareness Week. I've heard amazing testimonies of how NFP has helped couples to grow in their relationship with one another and with God. NFP involves learning "Fertility Awareness", which has helped women (single or married) to discover health issues early on, allowing for early and possibly life-saving treatment. It is recommended that all young women, even in High School, learn "Fertility Awareness." Our Bishops write, "The Catholic Church supports the methods of Natural Family Planning (NFP) because they respect God's design for married love. In fact, NFP represents the only authentic approach to family planning available to husbands and wives because these methods can be used to both attempt or avoid pregnancy. When learning about NFP, it is important to know that Natural Family Planning is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid conception. These methods are based on the observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle... No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy..."

"NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife... The papal encyclical, *Humanae vitae* [read it! It's short!] written by Pope St. Paul VI in 1968, captures the truth and depth of Catholic teaching on married love and the gift of life." See CCNFP.org for free instruction in NFP.

I will miss you and CONTINUE to pray for you. I'll be eternally grateful to our Lord to have had the opportunity to pastor you, serve you, and get to know you over six years. I pray our Lord gathers us together again for a "reunion" in heaven, without a single parishioner missing, by the grace of Christ. Please pray for the

salvation of our fellow community members, whether Catholic or not, every day. *Heavenly Father, give us all the grace of "final perseverance". Help us to stay in communion with Jesus through prayer, scripture, Mass, Confession, and service, until He calls us home.*

Over the years, if you saw anything good in me, any light, it was not my light, only Jesus' light. If you liked anything about me, it was Jesus giving me that trait; I can't take credit for anything good or virtuous in me. Without Him, we would all be scoundrels, choosing hell in this life and the next (see John 15). Please forgive me!

Natural Family Planning Awareness Week

Divine Mercy and Openness to Life:

Testimony of a Catholic Wife and Mother

Before you read: *This testimony is meant to inform and to encourage adult readers to investigate both Divine Mercy and NFP (Natural Family Planning), during the annual NFP Awareness Week. Our Bishops wrote, "The teaching on the use of contraception and sterilization may seem challenging, but it is to preserve the true, complete self-gift between husband and wife, the kind of love that brings real, lasting joy and peace. If we have failed to live this in the past, we need not be discouraged. Our loving Father is always calling us back through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and wanting to strengthen us in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. When we embrace the Church's teaching on human sexuality and marriage and follow Jesus, we invite the Holy Spirit into our lives in a powerful way..." (USCCB.org, bulletin insert "One Flesh")*

Part 1: Lies

About 6 weeks after my daughter, my fourth child, was born, I went to my scheduled OB appointment, dealing with postpartum depression. I had an 18-month-old, a 3-year-old and a 5-year-old as well. My doc told me because of the complications I had in carrying my daughter, it would have been detrimental to my health and possibly life-threatening to get pregnant again. I told her that neither the pill nor any hormonal birth control were options since uterine and breast cancer run in my family and these increase the risk. Her solution was an IUD [intrauterine device]. I knew any form of birth control was against Church teaching and against God. I went to confession and talked to a priest. He said it was against Church teaching but because another pregnancy could lead to death, it was OK. I

went back to my doctor and told her my decision to receive the IUD. I wanted to see my children grow up. Fear was a real driving force. I consulted a few other priests and was never given another option.

Part 2: God's Messenger

God sent a new priest to our parish. After Mass I introduced myself and my children to him. I had told him who baptized each of them. To my surprise he said, "When do I get to baptize one?" My youngest was 12, and I was 41. Another time, we got to talking. I mentioned the IUD. He asked me if I had heard of Natural Family Planning (NFP). I said no. On Divine Mercy Sunday 2014, the priest talked about Divine Mercy. After Mass I ran to confession. That day would forever change my life.

Part 3: God's new path

Some NFP teachers in our diocese visited our parish. They talked about their beautiful children and about NFP, but my heart wasn't ready yet. There was Eucharistic Adoration nearby from Friday morning to Saturday, so I signed up for an hour slot.

In October after a missed period and pain I went to the doctor and discovered that an egg had [likely] been fertilized but didn't attach to the uterine lining, and therefore didn't survive. In December, I was at Adoration; That's when I saw her. I didn't see her face; she kept it down and covered. This beautiful lady dressed in blue and white handed me a child, so beautiful, his dark hair and eyes. I thought I was holding the Christ Child. After I held him, the beautiful lady took him back.

Part 4: The Truth revealed

God is amazing! In February of 2015 I was in RCIA meeting as a sponsor. The priest always kept the church locked. I had to go into the church. I asked God, "Please let the door be unlocked." It was, so I went in and began to

pray before the Tabernacle in that dark church. I prayed for so long and then I listened. I heard Christ communicate to me, "Do you remember that baby you held?" (in the vision) I told him I did and that he (still thinking it was him as a child) was so beautiful. That's when Christ said, "That wasn't me you were holding. That was your son." I had never felt so much pain and guilt in my heart in my life, believing that the IUD had resulted in the loss of this tiny child. I had learned (after receiving the device) that it can prevent embryos from attaching, resulting in early death.

I went over to the large crucifix hanging on the wall and I remember looking up into his eyes. I saw his pain and I felt his mother's pain as she stood there looking up at him. For the first time I felt what Mary felt at the loss of her innocent son. As I knelt there I thought, "What have I done?" I had believed Satan's lies for so many years. I cried like never before at the foot of that crucifix. Then Christ called me back to his side by the Tabernacle. I sat there waiting. I said to him, "Lord if you want this IUD removed, you need to help me." My husband didn't like the idea of NFP. *(Note: NFP is meant to be practiced only with careful cooperation of both spouses, whether practiced to postpone pregnancy for serious and unselfish reasons, or to achieve pregnancy, or to diagnose menstrual issues. See CCNFP.org)* My doctor wouldn't have the device removed without good reason. So I gave it all to Jesus.

Part 5: Jesus allows me to suffer with Him for 40 days

I began feeling sharp pains shortly after Mass on Ash Wednesday. I dealt with the pain until it got so bad I couldn't stand or function at work. My OB/GYN checked me and insisted it had to be caused by some kind of infection. She asked me to go on an antibiotic for 10 days. I reluctantly agreed. God's plan had begun to be set in motion. After more than 10 days I returned to her. She again insisted it was an

infection and refused to remove the IUD. No one else would take it out. Another antibiotic was prescribed for another 10 days ending in Holy Week. I went back to the doc on Good Friday, and she finally agreed to remove the IUD. 40 days I had suffered with Christ. Afterwards she asked, "What are you going to use now?" I told her, with a newfound faith, "Natural Family Planning." She laughed the loudest laugh ever and I felt humiliated, like Christ when he was humiliated, spit at and mocked. I was ever so close to Him. In less than an hour after the IUD was removed, all the pain was gone.

Part 6: Divine Mercy Sunday 2015

Christmas is his birthday. Holy Thursday we were given his most precious gift. Easter is his Resurrection. On Divine Mercy Sunday, we are given another great gift. If our hearts are open, the graces that come down from Heaven on Divine Mercy Sunday are insurmountable. I went to confession and for the first time in many years I was free. I told the priest that I would use NFP. I left that confessional feeling so light, I felt I could fly... such happiness.

Part 7: It's my turn to give something back.

I was still making my visits once a week to Jesus in the Eucharist at Adoration. I don't know how many rosaries I was praying each day. One dark night late September I was in another Catholic church, praying my rosary. Taking a lesson from Pope St. John Paul II, I laid on the floor to pray. I was ready to surrender everything I had. I heard a familiar voice ask me, so sweetly and gently, "Do you Trust Me?" By now I had learned the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and understood the Divine Mercy message fairly well. I said, "Yes Lord, I trust you." Then His voice came again. "Do you Trust Me?" By now I was feeling like Peter did on the seashore. "Yes Lord, I trust you." Suddenly another voice chimed in. I was a little frightened, I can't describe it. That voice said,

"You don't know what you are saying. Truly you don't mean it." As if a battle was taking place in that church, Christ asked a third time, "Do you Trust Me?" I said in a louder voice to drive that evil-sounding voice away from me, "Yes Lord, I Trust You. I surrender myself to you." Then a peace came but I was still a little frightened.

Part 8: My struggle with God's plan

In October, I had a feeling I was pregnant. One night I had an argument with God. I told him I didn't want another child. I told him wouldn't have another child. Then I saw Hell; I don't know if it was Satan or God that caused this vision. I can't describe it. I did three things that night. I asked God to forgive me, I thought about my child I had lost and my new chance. I asked God to have mercy on all the deceased.

The end of October came. I went to my doctor and told her that I had a UTI and that I thought I was pregnant. She ran the test for the UTI but not for pregnancy. I went back in November and I saw the other doctor, who tested me for pregnancy. When he came in, he said "You tested positive", I broke down and cried. Not because I was pregnant, but out of fear. How would my husband react? How would my kids react? How would my friends react and what would people say?

Part 9: Faith is stronger than fear.

I had just left the doctor and was going back to work. I began praying my rosary. The second Joyful Mystery, the Visitation, hit me. I pulled the car over, looked up to Heaven and said, "Elizabeth, you know what it's like. Help me. If you could do it so long ago help me. I can't do it alone." To say my husband was upset would be an understatement. He was in his 50's. This baby would change everything. My kids all had mixed reactions. This baby was a shock for everyone. But God knew my family needed this baby more than we could imagine.

Part 10: A perfect pregnancy

I refused to go back to my OB/GYN, so my primary care doctor sent me to a different one. She sent me to a specialist. My husband insisted I have my child tested for any pre-natal disorders including Down Syndrome. I looked at him and stated, "There is nothing wrong with this baby. My child is perfect." I only allowed the blood and gender tests to be done. Later, the doc informed us that our baby showed no sign of any disorder and that she was a girl.

Part 11: Testimony of Divine Mercy

A few weeks after this I found myself in the emergency room with severe abdominal pain. When the technician came in and listened to me, he was surprised that I wasn't having a miscarriage. I know that my little girl is truly a miracle. On July 3, 2016 my little girl was born. She was very healthy, but later had serious jaundice. She was baptized on July 17, 2016. After Mass the priest gave her the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Two weeks later, she finally started showing signs of improvement. Today my little girl is 8 years old. This past spring she received her 1st Holy Communion. Her words were, "I have waited my whole life for this." God really is amazing isn't He? If ever there was a person God has chosen to represent his work of Divine Mercy, it is my daughter. She wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for God's Divine Mercy. I dedicated her to Our Lady and at the cathedral I dedicated her to God for the sake of our diocese. Today she is deeply loved by my family including my husband.

Part 12: God isn't done

God isn't done with my daughter or with me. God has a special plan for each of us. Because I lost my son I can share in the grief of a parent who has lost a child. I am stronger through Christ. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is where you will find Divine Mercy. He is reaching out to you to take his hand.

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
