

## My dear brothers and sisters,

How we treat people around the table says a lot about who we are.

Think of weddings, family dinners, or church potlucks — where you sit, who you talk to, and how you make others feel — it all reveals something deeper.

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses the image of a banquet to teach us about the heart of humility and the way of hospitality in the kingdom of God.

# 1. Don't Look for the Best Seat — Let God Lift You Up

Jesus tells us not to rush to sit in the place of honor. Why? Because humility isn't about pretending to be less — it's about knowing who we are before God. "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 14:11)

#### Application for us:

- In our families do we insist on being right?
- In our parish do we serve for attention or out of love?
- In our work or school are we building others up or just trying to get ahead?

God lifts up the humble. He doesn't forget the quiet sacrifices, the behind-the-scenes kindness, or the person who chooses peace over pride.

## 2. Invite the People Who Can't Pay You Back

Jesus goes further: when you host a meal, invite "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind."

This flips the world's logic. Normally we invite those who will invite us back, or those who give us status. But Jesus is showing us God's way.

True hospitality is not about status — it's about service.

#### This means:

- Welcoming newcomers, the lonely, and those who feel left out.
- Reaching out to the elderly, the sick, or anyone struggling.
- Not just being friendly to friends but looking for the ones who need love most.

When we love without expecting anything back, we reflect the heart of Christ.

# 3. The Eucharist: God's Humble Banquet

Every Sunday, we come to a banquet prepared by Jesus Himself. The altar is not for the worthy, but for the willing — for the humble who say, "Lord, I am not worthy... but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

#### So, dear parish family, this week:

- Let us walk in humility not thinking less of ourselves but thinking of others more.
- Let us welcome those who cannot repay us — because that's what Jesus does for us.
- Let us live like people who know they are guests at God's banquet — and are eager to make room for others.
