





## Scripture Overview

- First Reading (Amos 8:4-7): Amos condemns those who exploit the poor—cheating with scales, neglecting justice, putting profit over people.
- Psalm (Psalm 113): God lifts up the needy and lowly, showing concern for those overlooked.
- Second Reading (1 Timothy 2:1-8): Paul urges prayer for all people, including leaders; Christ is mediator and offers salvation.
- Gospel (Luke 16:1-13): The Parable of the Dishonest Steward—an unjust manager uses shrewdness to secure his future when he's about to lose his position. Jesus emphasizes that we cannot serve both God and money.

## Key Message

God calls us to be faithful stewards of what we have—our resources, relationships, and responsibilities. Our loyalty must be to God above anything else—even above money or material security.

## Problems Highlighted

1. Greed and Exploitation – In Amos, people are taking advantage of the poor, using dishonest weights, exploiting those who are vulnerable.
2. Fickle Loyalties – The steward in the Gospel shows that people will often serve what they think will benefit them most. Jesus warns that trying to serve both God and money leads to conflict.

## Applications for Christian Life

Here are several ways this message might hit home, and what responses might look like:

1. Examine our relationships with wealth
  - Are we putting our trust in possessions, security, or status more than in God?
  - Do we see money as a tool or as a master?
2. Integrity in small matters
  - Jesus says faithfulness in small things reflects faithfulness in greater things. Even how we conduct daily, often “hidden” decisions matters.
  - Honesty, fairness, giving what is right even when no one is watching.
3. Solidarity with the poor and marginalized
  - Amos’ critique is not just abstract—it shows up in ways we can and should respond: fair treatment, honest work, resisting systems that exploit.
  - The Psalm reminds us God is attentive to the lowly. Our worship should lead us to compassion and action.
4. Prayer as a foundation for just action
  - From Timothy: praying for all, especially those in authority. When authorities act justly, the poor are better served. It isn’t enough to wish for justice; we must pray that those with power act rightly.
  - Also, our prayers shape our hearts—towards mercy, honesty, and courage.

5. Choosing God above other loyalties
  - Jesus' stark statement—"you cannot serve both God and mammon" (money) — challenges us to decide where our ultimate allegiance lies.
  - It often means choosing generosity over security, justice over convenience.

## Conclusion / Call to Action

Brothers and sisters, the 25th Sunday reminds us: faithfulness matters, especially in the stuff of daily life, our money, our dealings, our relationships. Justice, honesty, integrity are not optional extras for the Christian; they are central. Let us respond by:

- Confessing and turning away from any practices of exploitation,
- Being generous with what God has given us,
- Praying for leaders and systems to serve the common good,
- And committing ourselves to serve God wholeheartedly—not divided between God and material things.

May God grant us the wisdom to use our "little" well, to be trustworthy in what truly lasts. Amen.


