



"A Humble Heart Before God"

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend scriptures invite us into a reflection on the posture of our hearts before God. We often come to Mass, pray our prayers, go through the motions of faith. But the scriptures challenge us: what matters most is how we come before God — with humility or with pride. Our texts today speak of justice, the cry of the poor, the faithful perseverance of Paul, and a parable about two very different prayers.

God Sees the Humble

In Sirach we read:

"The Lord is a God of justice, who knows no favorites. Though not unduly partial toward the weak, yet he hears the cry of the oppressed."

And the psalm echoes:

"The Lord hears the cry of the poor."

This is a strong reminder that God's eye is on those who are humble, those who are oppressed, those whose prayers may seem small. The prayer of the lowly "pierces the clouds" and does not rest until it reaches the Most High.

In other words: God does not ignore us when we carry our brokenness, our weakness, our need to Him. He is just, He is attentive.

Two Prayers – Two Hearts

Then Jesus gives a parable: a Pharisee and a tax-collector come to pray. The Pharisee stands and proudly thanks God that he is not like "others" (greedy, dishonest, adulterous) and lists his deeds. The tax-collector, standing far off, will not even lift his eyes, but beats his breast and prays:

"God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

And Jesus concludes: the tax-collector went home justified, not the Pharisee.

What is Jesus teaching? That pride in our piety, comparing ourselves to others, listing our good works, closing our hearts to the needy — this does not open us to God. But the humble heart, aware of its faults, aware of its need for God's mercy — that is the prayer God hears.



Application to Our Parish Life

How do we live this out here, in this parish community?

- Examine our prayer life. Do we pray to impress, to be seen, to show ourselves better than others? Or do we pray simply, humbly, acknowledging our need for God's mercy?
- Examine our attitude toward others. The Pharisee looked down on "others." Do we silently compare ourselves, judge others' faults, or do we stand with the poor, the oppressed, the broken in spirit? The readings say: God hears the cry of the poor. Do we?
- Examine our service. Paul endured, kept faithful in hardship. We might not face persecution like Paul, but there are quiet trials in family life, work, health, in evangelization. Let us persevere in faith, trusting that God stands by us.
- Invite humility in our hearts. In a world of self-promotion, let us choose the way of the tax-collector: "Have mercy on me, a sinner." Let us lean into God, not rely on ourselves.
