





"Rejoice in the Lord Always"


We arrive at the Third Sunday of Advent—Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of joy. For two weeks, the tone of Advent has been marked by longing, waiting, and repentance. But today, the liturgical color lightens, the readings brighten, and the Church invites us to rejoice. Not because everything in our lives is perfect, but because God is near.

Advent joy is not the shallow cheerfulness of holiday commercials or the forced happiness we sometimes feel pressured to display in December. Advent joy is something deeper—a joy born from hope, a joy that comes not from our circumstances but from God's presence.

1. Joy in the Midst of Waiting

Our world is full of waiting: waiting for test results, waiting for reconciliation in families, waiting for peace, waiting for prayers to be answered. But Advent teaches us that God is present in the waiting, not just at the end of it. Like Israel waiting for the Messiah, like John the Baptist waiting in prison to hear news of Jesus' work, we wait. And yet God says: "Do not fear... I am with you."

Joy grows when we trust that even in silence, God is working.



2. Joy in God's Faithfulness

Our readings today remind us that God keeps promises.

- The desert will bloom.
- The brokenhearted will be healed.
- The captive will be set free.
- Good news will be proclaimed to the poor.
- Jesus fulfills these promises not only in Scripture but in our own lives. Think of the quiet ways grace appears: a relationship restored, a burden lifted, unexpected peace in a difficult time. These are signs that the Kingdom is already breaking into the world.

3. Joy as a Christian Witness

In a world filled with anxiety, division, and fatigue, Christian joy is not simply a feeling—it is a witness. When we choose joy, we are proclaiming:

"I believe God is at work, even when I cannot see it."

"I trust the light, even when the night feels long."

"I rejoice, because Christ is coming — and Christ is already here."

This kind of joy draws others to God. It is not loud or showy; it is steady, patient, hope-filled. It is the joy of people who know that love has the final word.

4. Preparing Our Hearts with Joy

Advent invites us to prepare the way of the Lord. We often hear that as a call to repentance—and it is—but it is also a call to joy.

What if preparing for Christ means:

- Making room for gratitude,
- Choosing hope amid discouragement,
- Letting go of bitterness,
- Opening our hearts to mercy,
- And being a sign of light for others?

Joy is not something we manufacture—it is a gift of the Holy Spirit. We receive it when we open ourselves to God's presence.

On this Gaudete Sunday, hear the voice of Scripture speaking not as a suggestion, but as a promise:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. The Lord is near."

Christ is coming.

Christ is already in our midst.

And that is why, even in a complicated world, we can rejoice.

Amen.
