

“Opening Our Eyes to the Light”

As we reach the Fourth Sunday of *Lent*, the Church invites us to pause and rejoice. This Sunday, traditionally known as *Laetare Sunday*, reminds us that the joy of Easter is drawing closer even as we continue our Lenten journey.

In the Gospel passage *John 9:1–41*, *Jesus Christ* heals a man who had been blind from birth. Through this miracle, Jesus reveals that He is the light of the world. The man who receives his sight gradually comes to believe in Jesus, while others who witness the miracle remain spiritually blind because they refuse to accept the truth.



The first reading from *1 Samuel 16:1–13* reminds us that God sees differently than we do. While people focus on outward appearance, God looks into the heart. That is why God chose *David*, the youngest son of Jesse, to become king.

During this season of Lent, we are invited to reflect on our own spiritual vision. Are there areas in our lives where we are blind to God’s presence? Do we sometimes fail to recognize Christ in the people around us, especially those in need?

St. Paul reminds us in *Ephesians 5:8–14* that once we were in darkness, but now we are called to live as children of light. Lent is a time for Christ to open our eyes, heal our hearts, and guide us toward the light of faith.

As a parish community, let us continue this Lenten journey with renewed faith and hope. May we allow the Lord to open our eyes so that we may see His truth more clearly and reflect His light in our daily lives.



Catholic Sisters Support Special Education

As the Foundation celebrates its 20th Anniversary, it honors its connection to the work of local religious sisters for National Catholic Sisters Week, March 8-14.

The Society of the Mission Sisters of the Holy Spirit was established in 1954 as a Saginaw diocesan community that focused on social work, religious education, and later parish ministry. Now, in 2026, their legacy continues as they celebrate the 54th year of their Sponsored Ministry called SPRED, or Special Religious Development for individuals with special needs.



SPRED was brought to the Diocese of Saginaw by Sr. Elaine Raymond in 1972. Since its beginning, Sr. Elaine “has called SPRED a process of faith formation designed to help those participating discover belonging and the celebration of the Sacraments, as well as being together and becoming part of a community.” In her experience, SPRED is truly a process, not a program. Today, SPRED continues with the ongoing support of Sisters Elaine Raymond, Mary Lou Owczarzak, and Margo Tafoya. SPRED has also continued under the direction of Marsha Caylor since 1981 with the many volunteers who journey with students.

“Our goal is to be a faith community for students,” said Marsha. When groups of eight students with special needs meet every other week at St. Dominic Parish in Saginaw, they join volunteer catechists to quiet their minds, pray and sing together, and find a community of friendship rooted in faith. That sense of community is what truly makes SPRED such a special process. In the words of Sr. Margo, “It’s a heart ministry.”

SPRED receives annual disbursements from two endowments managed by the Catholic Community Foundation: the Ann & Richard Blazejewski Endowment and the Fr. C. Albrecht Catholic Education Fund. While supporting other organizations in addition to SPRED, the two funds combined have disbursed over \$19,000 to provide religious education to individuals with special needs. “It just helps keep us going,” said Marsha. “We really want those who are contributing to know.”

Both funds also carry on a legacy of giving that honors loved ones. In fact, Sr. Elaine was Fr. Craig Albrecht’s religious education coordinator when he was growing up. “He had a love for Elaine, and especially for SPRED,” said Sr. Margo. Now, with an endowment, his legacy of giving continues to support his love of SPRED through the Foundation.




