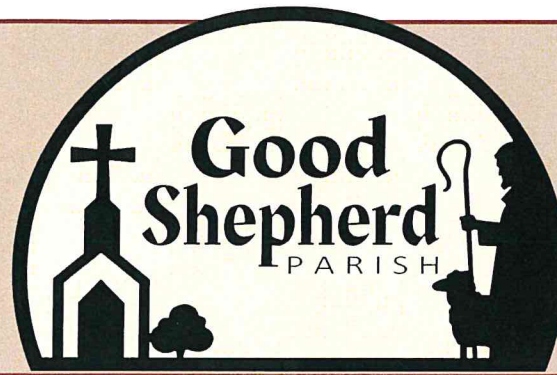

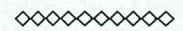

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The great feast of Pentecost is the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and filled them with courage, wisdom, and joy.

The Gospel story of Pentecost begins in fear. The disciples were gathered behind closed doors. Their hearts were troubled. Jesus had ascended into heaven, and they did not know what would happen next. They felt weak, uncertain, and alone.

But suddenly, everything changed.

The Book of Acts tells us that there came a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and tongues of fire rested upon each of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with boldness.

The frightened disciples became fearless witnesses. Peter, who once denied Jesus three times, now stood before thousands and proclaimed the Good News without fear. Ordinary fishermen became instruments of God's power.

This is the work of the Holy Spirit.

My dear parishioners, Pentecost is not only a memory of something that happened long ago. Pentecost is a living reality for the Church today. The same Holy Spirit who came upon the apostles continues to work in our lives, in our families, and in our parish community.

We may ask ourselves:

Where is the Holy Spirit today?

The Spirit is present whenever:

- hearts are healed,
- sinners return to God,
- families forgive one another,
- the poor are helped,
- the lonely are comforted,
- and the Church gathers in prayer and unity.

The Holy Spirit gives life to the Church.

Without the Spirit, our faith becomes cold tradition.

Without the Spirit, prayer becomes empty words.

Without the Spirit, we easily become discouraged.

But with the Holy Spirit, ordinary people can do extraordinary things for God.

Many of us carry burdens today. Some are worried about their children. Some are struggling with sickness, loneliness, financial stress, or disappointment. Some may feel spiritually tired.

Pentecost reminds us that God has not left us alone.

The Holy Spirit is our Comforter, our Guide, and our Strength.

When we are weak, the Spirit strengthens us.

When we are confused, the Spirit guides us.

When we are afraid, the Spirit gives courage.

When we fall, the Spirit helps us rise again.

The fire of Pentecost is a fire of divine love.

And notice something beautiful in today's reading: people from many nations heard the apostles speaking in their own languages. This teaches us that the Holy Spirit brings unity, not division.

In today's world, there is so much anger, conflict, and separation — even within families and communities.

But the Spirit calls us to become people of peace, understanding, and compassion.

As parishioners, we are not called only to come to church on Sundays. We are called to live as witnesses of Christ every day:

- in our homes,
- at work,
- in our conversations,
- and in the way we treat others.

Sometimes the strongest sermon is not spoken from the pulpit — it is lived through kindness, patience, honesty, and love.

Today, let us open our hearts again to the Holy Spirit.

Let the Spirit renew our parish.

Let the Spirit renew our families.

Let the Spirit renew our hearts.

May our church never become only a building, but a living community filled with faith, prayer, and love.

And let us pray together:

Come, Holy Spirit,

fill the hearts of your faithful

and kindle in them the fire of your love.

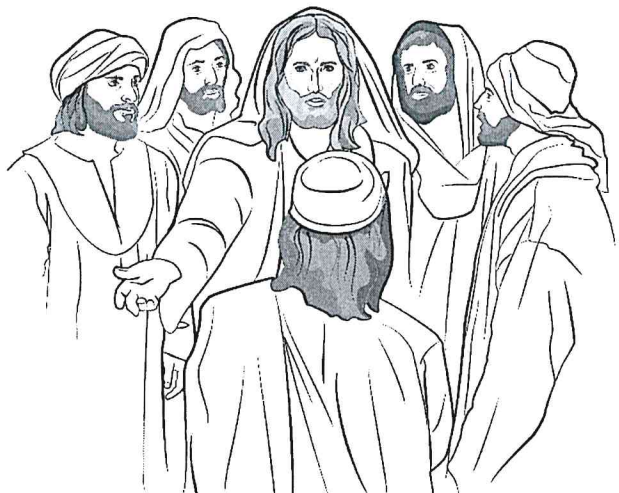
Renew your Church, renew our parish,

To my brothers and sisters in Christ:

In the Easter Triduum, Jesus led us to the culmination of his mission, so that his passion, death and resurrection could become the heart of our mission. Pope Leo, in his Chrism Mass homily, shared these words.

"...the Christian mission, the very same as Jesus', not another. Each of us takes part in it according to our own vocation in a deeply personal obedience to the voice of the Spirit, yet never without others, never neglecting or breaking communion! Bishops and priests, as we renew our promises, we are at the service of a missionary people. Together with all the baptized, we are the Body of Christ, anointed by his Spirit of freedom and consolation, the Spirit of prophecy and unity."

"We, as members of his Body, speak of a Church that is "apostolic," sent out, driven beyond itself, and consecrated to God in the service of his creatures. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21)."

We know that being sent entails, first and foremost, a detachment, that is, the risk of leaving behind what is familiar and certain, in order to venture into something new. It is interesting that "with the power of the Spirit" (Lk 4:14), who descended upon him after his baptism in the Jordan, Jesus returned to Galilee and came "to Nazareth, where he had been brought up" (Lk 4:16). It is the place he must now leave behind. He moves "as was his custom" (v. 16), but to usher in a new era. He must now leave that village for good, so that what has taken root there, Sabbath after Sabbath, through faithful listening to the word of God, may come to fruition. Likewise, he will call others to set out, to take risks, so that no place becomes a prison, no identity a hiding place.

I share these words as a foundation of what I am inviting you to think about as the Diocese of Saginaw becomes more missional focused. We read over and over again in the scriptures, beginning with the life of Jesus, that ministry, first and foremost, begins *"with the power of the Spirit" (Lk 4:14)*. During the season of Easter, as the Acts of the Apostles has been proclaimed daily, we see the growth of the new Church because of the power of the Spirit that began with the Pentecost moment in the Upper Room.

In the words of our Holy Father,


“The surprise of Pentecost is repeated when we do not presume to control God’s timing, but place our trust in the Holy Spirit, who “is present, even today, as in the time of Jesus and the Apostles: is present and at work, arriving before us, working harder than us and better than us; it is not for us to sow or awaken him, but first and foremost to recognize him, welcome him, go along with him, make way for him, and follow him. He is present and has never lost heart regarding our times; on the contrary, he smiles, dances, penetrates, engulfs, envelops, and reaches even where we would never have imagined.”

With this in mind, I am proclaiming a Year of the Holy Spirit in the Diocese of Saginaw beginning on the Solemnity of Pentecost, May 24, 2026 with the 10:30 Mass at the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption, and concluding on Pentecost 2027.

Do you have a relationship with the Holy Spirit? The Year of the Holy Spirit invites each of us into a deeper experience of the Holy Spirit, the 3rd person of the Holy Trinity, who has sent you on mission for Jesus Christ? The Spirit is given for mission. This year of the Holy Spirit is intended to deepen our diocesan mission of becoming “One Heart and Mind” in carrying forward the Church’s solitary goal: “to carry forward the work of Christ under the lead of the befriending Spirit. And Christ entered this world to give witness to the truth, to rescue and not to sit in judgment, to serve and not to be served.” [*Gaudium et Spes*, #3]

My hope is that there would be numerous events in the Diocese and in your particular parishes to celebrate the Year of the Holy Spirit. Resources will be provided and I encourage all pastors and DPLs to let the Holy Spirit be creative in your own parishes. We will have more information in the coming weeks.

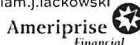

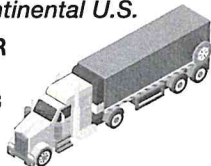
