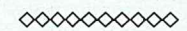

“The Heart That Loves Without Measure”

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the beautiful feasts in the catholic Church. We gather not merely to honor a symbol of Sacred Heart but to contemplate the living Heart of our Savior—a Heart that beats with infinite love for every person.

The Sacred Heart reminds us of a profound truth: God is not distant. God is not indifferent to our struggles. God loves us personally, deeply, and completely. When we look at the image of the Sacred Heart, we see a heart crowned with thorns, wounded, and burning with love. It tells us that Christ’s love is not sentimental; it is sacrificial. He loved us so much that He accepted suffering, rejection, and death on the cross for our salvation.

In today’s world, many people experience loneliness, disappointment, anxiety, and broken relationships. Some feel forgotten by society; others carry wounds that no one sees. The Feast of the Sacred Heart assures us that there is always a place where we are welcomed—the Heart of Jesus.

The Gospel often shows Jesus moved with compassion. He welcomed sinners, healed the sick, comforted the sorrowful, and sought out those who were lost. Like the Good Shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine sheep to search for the one that is lost, Jesus never stops seeking us. His Heart is always open.

The Sacred Heart also challenges us. It is not enough to admire Christ’s love; we are called to imitate it. If we truly honor the Sacred Heart, our own hearts must become more like His.

A heart like Jesus:

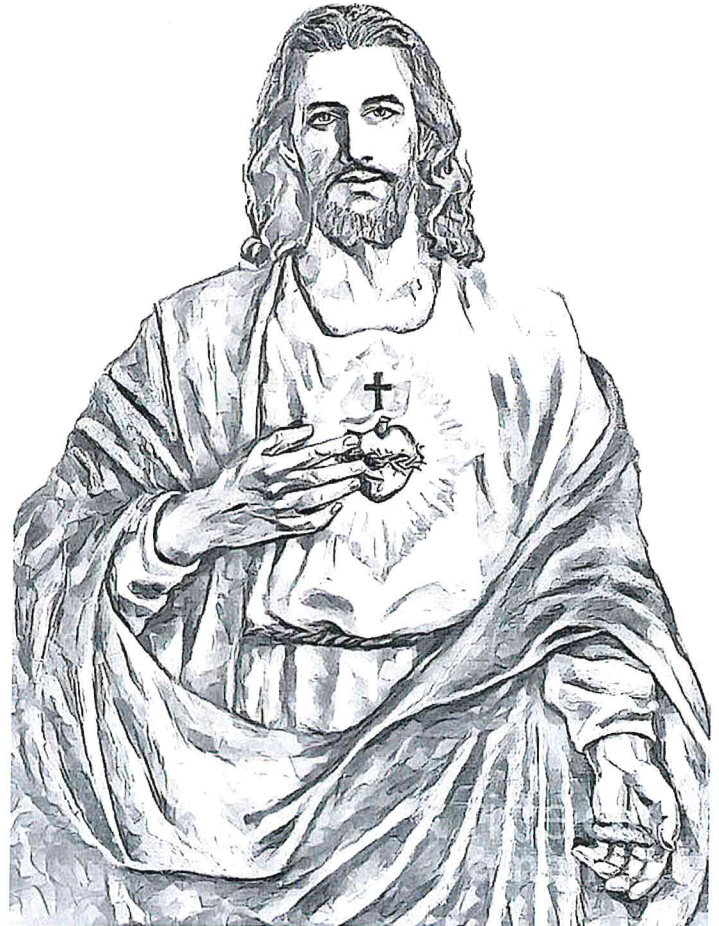
- Forgives, instead of holding grudges.
- Serves instead of seeking recognition.
- Welcomes instead of excluding.
- Shows mercy instead of judgment.
- Loves even when it is difficult.

Our families, parish communities, workplaces, and neighborhoods all need hearts transformed by the love of Christ. Imagine how different our world would be if every Christian reflected even a small portion of the compassion and patience of the Sacred Heart. The Feast of the Sacred Heart is also an invitation to trust. Sometimes we worry about the future, our health, our children, or our finances. Jesus says to us, “Come to me.” His Heart remains a refuge in every storm. When we place our lives in His hands, we discover peace that the world cannot give.

Today, let us bring before the Sacred Heart all our joys and sorrows, our successes and failures, our hopes and fears. Let us entrust our families, our parish, the sick, the elderly, the young, and all who are suffering to His loving care.

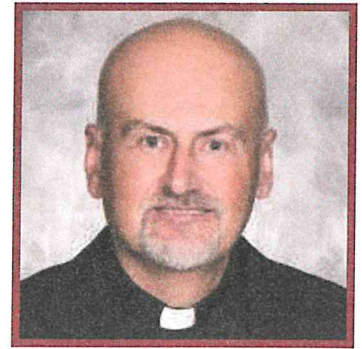

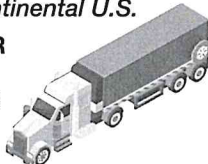
