Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

What is the greatest treasure in your life?

Jesus tells us about a man who discovers a hidden treasure in a field. Filled with joy, he sells everything he owns to buy that field. Then He speaks of a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds one pearl of great value, he too sells everything to possess it.

These stories are not really about treasure or pearls. They are about **the Kingdom of God**. Jesus is telling us that knowing Him and living in His Kingdom is worth more than anything else we can ever possess. Wealth, success, power, and popularity all pass away, but a life rooted in God lasts forever.

The first reading reminds us of this truth through the example of King Solomon. When God offered him anything he desired, Solomon did not ask for riches or a long life. He asked for **wisdom**—a heart that could discern right from wrong and govern God's people faithfully. Because Solomon valued wisdom above wealth, God blessed him abundantly.

This is a lesson for all of us. Our prayers often focus on material needs, and God certainly cares about those needs. But today's readings encourage us to ask first for wisdom: the wisdom to recognize God's presence, to make good choices, to forgive, to love, and to remain faithful even when life is difficult.

St. Paul, in the second reading, assures us that "all things work together for good for those who love God." This does not mean every event is pleasant or easy. It means that when we trust God, He can bring good even out of suffering, disappointment, and failure. The treasure of God's Kingdom gives us hope that no hardship is wasted in His hands.

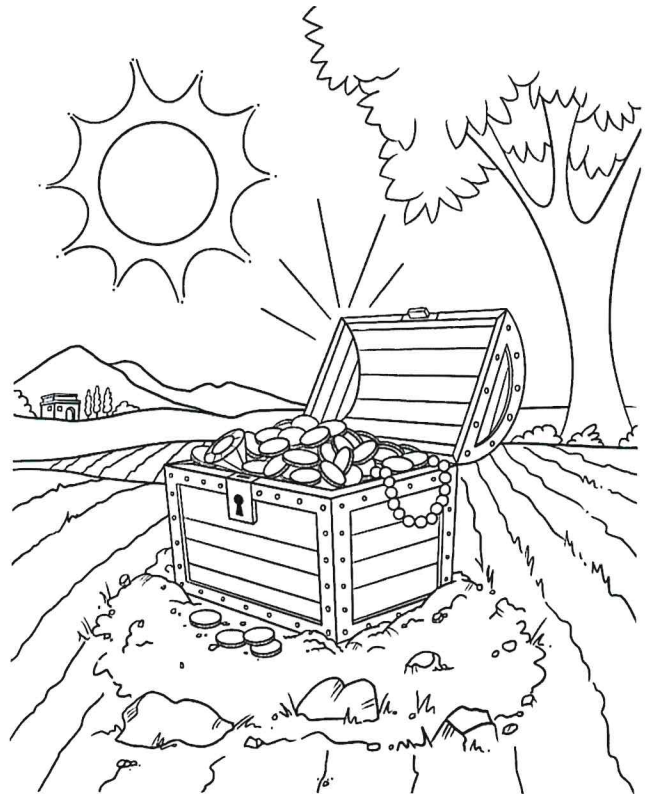
Finally, Jesus speaks about the net gathering fish of every kind. At the end of time there will be a judgment. This reminds us that discovering the Kingdom is not enough; we must live according to its values every day. Our faith should be seen in our honesty, compassion, generosity, forgiveness, and concern for those in need.

Dear friends, the greatest danger is not that we have no treasure, but that we treasure the wrong things. Many people spend their lives chasing possessions, status, or comfort, only to discover

that these cannot satisfy the deepest hunger of the human heart. Christ alone is the treasure that never fades.

May we leave this church today asking God for the wisdom of Solomon, the joyful commitment of the man who found the treasure, and the generous faith of the merchant who found the pearl. Then our lives will truly reflect the beauty of God's Kingdom.

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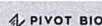
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
